



New Hampshire's well-documented lack of ovailable, affordable housing is contributing to our next generation workforce leaving the state. Every potential Granite State worker who leaves because housing is neither available, nor affordable, makes hiring that much more difficult for employers around the state. Estimates show that up to 90,000 new housing units will be needed over the next 40 years to meet expected demand.
