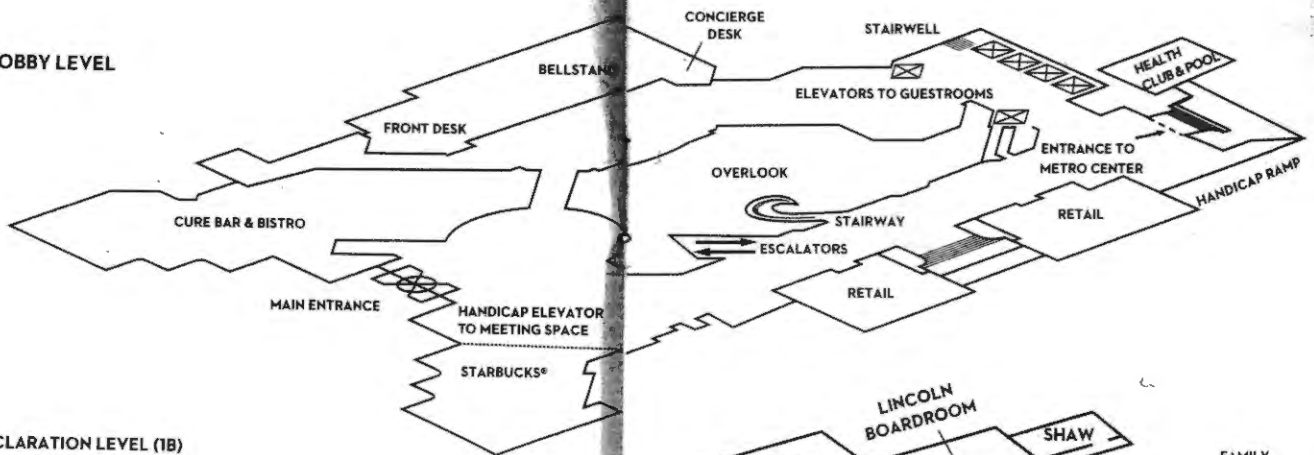

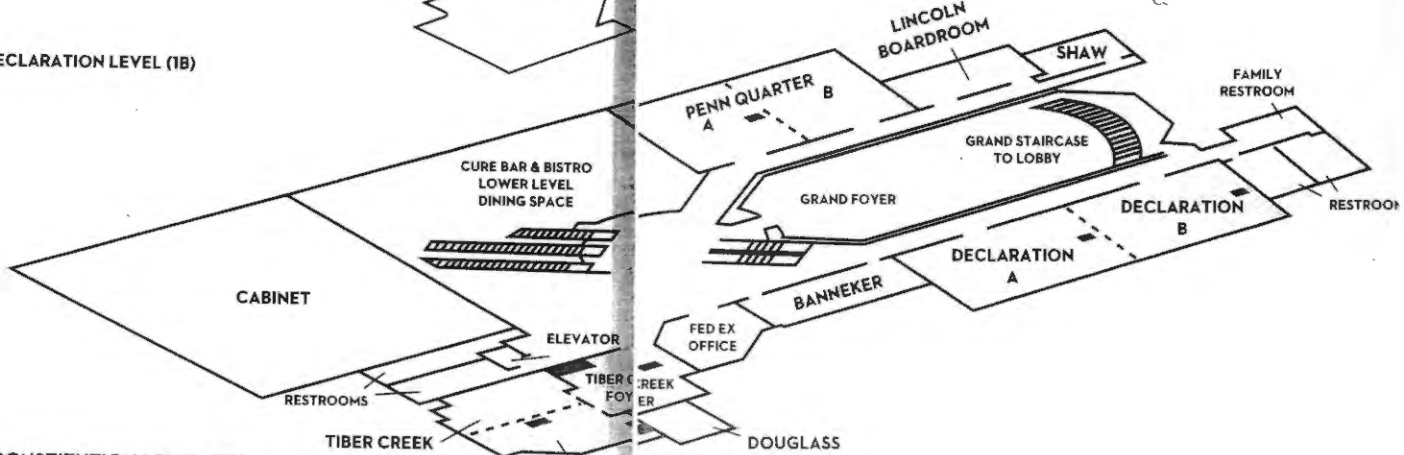

MEETING MAP

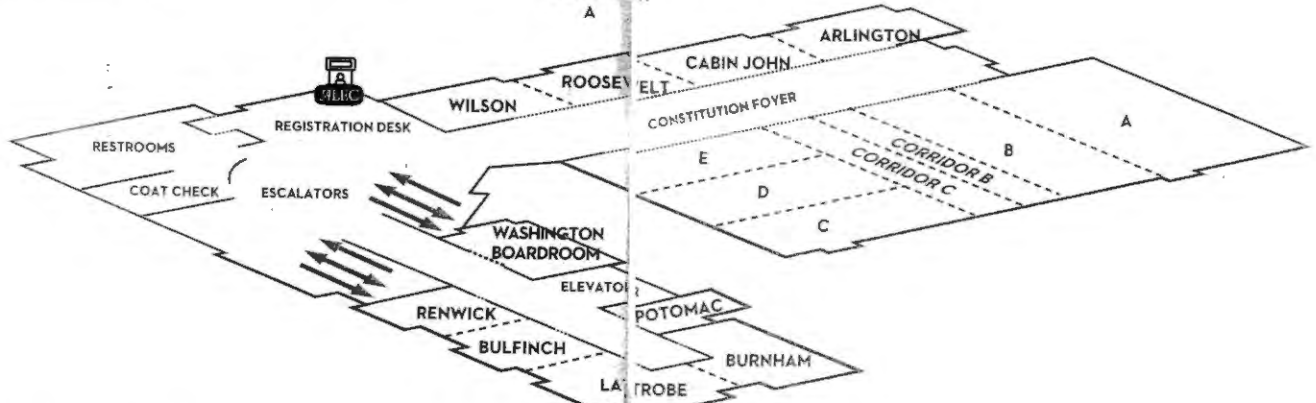
LOBBY LEVEL



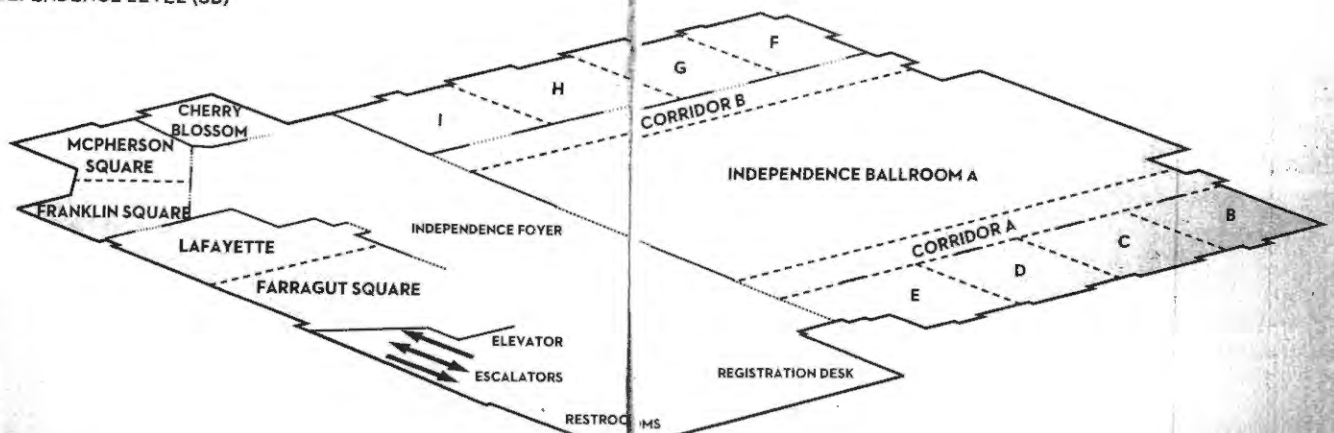
DECLARATION LEVEL (1B)

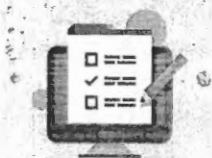
