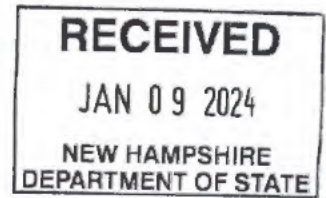

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The DLCC Code of Conduct

The DLCC does not require attendees to show proof of a negative COVID-19 test to gain entry to events. However, we still ask that you not attend if you have received notification of COVID-19 exposure, had close contact with a COVID-19-positive person five or fewer days before the event, or are experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms. At all DLCC events, guests should feel free to maintain any personal precautions they feel are necessary.

Some of the information provided in our policy sessions is confidential. We ask that you please refrain from posting about these sessions on social media. Please refrain from video recording during the meeting.

Please note some states restrict or limit the circumstances under which legislators may accept food, beverages, lodging, travel, or other things of value from certain sources. Many states also create exemptions for events like this. Before accepting anything of value at a DLCC event, we advise that you verify with an ethics official in your state that you may do so.

Attendees are expected to exercise common sense in their personal interactions: they should extend common courtesy and mutual respect to fellow attendees and staff members, as well as respect for private property. Harassing or offensive behavior will not be tolerated. The DLCC reserves the right to revoke the attendance and badge of any attendee not in compliance with this policy. Persons finding themselves in a situation where they feel their safety is at risk or who become aware of an attendee not in compliance with this policy should immediately find a member of DLCC staff so that the matter can be addressed.
