

After years of federal guidance requiring states to conduct market rate surveys to set childcare subsidy rates, the shortcomings of this model have become increasingly evident and may be exacerbating the nation's childcare crisis. Cost modeling is an alternate approach that may better reflect the actual costs of quality care, to include a living wage for childcare staff.
