One more day in Taiwan. We HAD to visit the Chiang Kai Shek Memorial in Taipei for the Changing of the Guard. (FYI: Madame Chiang was one of the most influential women of the 20th Century. She died in 2003 at age 105. She once owned a Winnepesaukee estate in Wolfeboro.)

Wonderful trip. I know some had questions. I'll paste below my message from a Legi FB page. 🇺🇸🇹🇼

Colleagues:

We're finishing up our mission in Taiwan which has been very rewarding and productive. I guess there were some questions so here are a few notes.

* Taiwan, Asia's most vibrant democracy, is a top trading power. It mass-produces the most advanced semiconductors in the world. It has a world market share of around 70% for top microchips. Any disruption in chip sales is sure to cause international chaos and a financial and manufacturing breakdown.

* Currently NH businesses like Timberland have strong ties with Taiwan. Taipei would like to see more.

* Rep. Wallace and I not only toured historical and cultural centers, but were part of meetings and briefings with the Foreign Affairs Ministry, the Education Ministry, the Taipei 101 Financial Center, the Mainland Affairs Council, the National Assembly (Yuan), the American State Offices Association (ASOA), the Prospect Foundation, the Taiwan Institute for Sustainable Energy, the Institute for National Defense and Security Research, the American Chamber of Commerce in Taiwan, the Taiwan External Trade Development Council, the Hsinchu Biomedical Park, the Aerospace Industrial Development Corporation, and much, much more.

* We exchanged business cards with dozens of Taiwanese officials and will be following up with folks in the areas of medicine, manufacturing, education and more re: MOUs, etc.

* We also networked with other legislators on our delegation team re: several areas of legislative policy interest

* The trip was supported by Boston's Taipei Economic and Cultural Office and the Taiwan Foreign Ministry. No state funds supported this trip, other than our personal funds. Those of you who've attended conferences know we always end up spending some of our own money. But that's our choice.

* Given the economic importance of Taiwan as well as the fact that it is a flashpoint re: conflict with our biggest adversary (China) then it's crucial that we be engaged and informed concerning that part of the world. I'll be writing more on all this after returning home.

* We're sorry to miss Veto Day. I wanted to maintain my 6 year 99+% floor vote record, but this was such an important opportunity on several levels.
