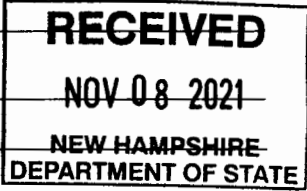

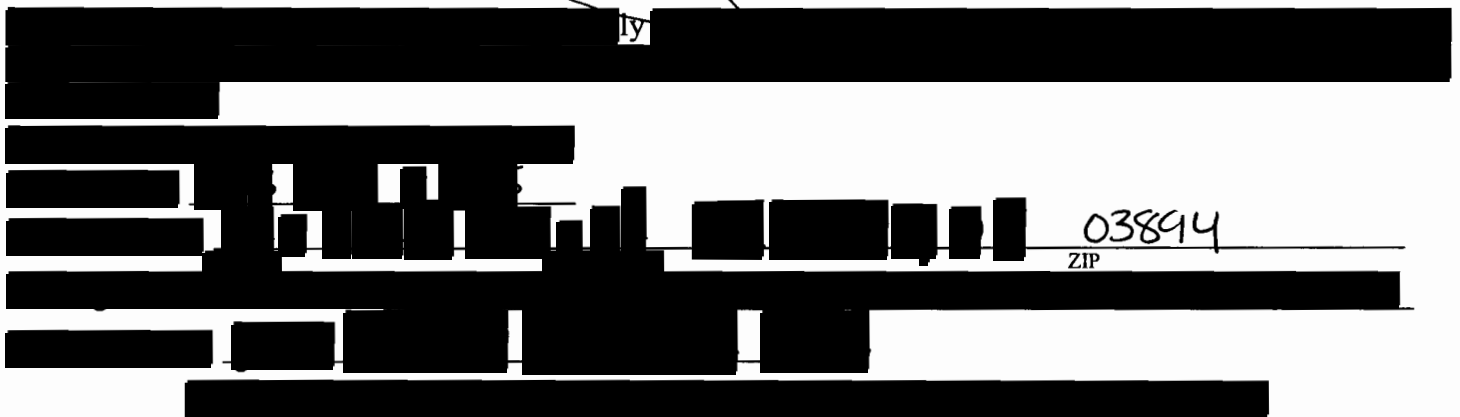

2. **Lodging:** NCSL will cover four nights at the conference hotel. Additional nights are on your own.

2. Use of rental car, unless approved in advance.
3. Any activities unrelated to program participation.
4. Travel insurance and travel upgrade fees.
