REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division for Children, Youth and Families to exercise a renewal option (Purchase Order # 1008936) with MAO Pharmacy, Inc. (DBA Westwood Pharmacy), 5823 Patterson Avenue, Richmond, VA 23226 (Vendor #208530 B001) for the provision of pharmaceutical services to the John H. Sununu Youth Services Center by increasing the price limitation by \$103,241.00 from \$612,464.00 to \$715,705.00 and extending the completion date from June 30, 2013 to December 31, 2013, effective July 1, 2013 or Governor and Executive Council approval, whichever is later. Governor and Executive Council approved the original agreement on June 23, 2010 (Item #91) and subsequent renewal request on June 6, 2012, (Item #47).

Funds to support this request are anticipated to be available in the following account in SFY 2014 upon the availability and continued appropriation of funds in the future operating budgets, with authority to adjust amounts within the price limitation and amend the related terms of the contract without further approval from Governor and Executive Council.

EXPLANATION

The original request approved by Governor and Executive Council June 23, 2010 (Item #91), as well as the agreement itself, included a provision for the renewal of this contract for up to two additional years. Governor and Executive Council approved a subsequent one-year renewal request on June 6, 2012, (Item #47).

At this time the Division is requesting that the Governor and Executive Council approve a six-month renewal of this contract to ensure services are not interrupted while it completes a thorough needs study and develops an new Request for Proposals. The Department intends to release a Request for Proposals for these services before the end of the calendar year. The services will be competitively bid.

The purpose of this agreement is to provide necessary prescribed medications to youth residing in the John H. Sununu Youth Services Center. Additional services to be provided by the vendor include in-service training to Center staff on new medication and new drug regimens. On average 190 prescriptions are dispensed each month, including those to residents, individuals on furloughs and individuals being discharged. Because the Division does not anticipate an increase in population at the Center in the first half of State Fiscal Year 2014, the requested amount is half of the amount that had been approved in State Fiscal Year 2013.

Westwood Pharmacy has provided excellent service to the Division over the past three years. The Division determined to request renewal of this contract only after determining that immediate consolidation of these services under New Hampshire Hospital's Pharmaceutical contract was not cost effective. As a result continuation of the agreement with Westwood Pharmacy results in lower medications cost to the Division.

Under this agreement for prescription medications Westwood Pharmacy will continue to charge the Average Wholesale Price minus 16.4% for Brand Name prescriptions and the Average Wholesale Price minus 71% for Generics. In addition, unused and returned medications will be credited to the Division representing additional savings.

A contract management team comprised of financial, programmatic, and medical staff will monitor the agreement to assure that the vendor:

- Charges the Division the accurate prices negotiated in the contract;
- Offers Center staff multiple pharmaceutical options for the needs of each youth;
- Delivers medications in a timely fashion;
- Refunds the Division for unused medications; and
- Provides in-service training to Center staff.

Performance that does not meet expectations may result in financial penalty or termination of the contract as provided for in the agreement.

Should Governor and Executive Council not authorize this request, the Center would be unable to provide appropriate medication to manage the needs of the Center's population. This could result in significant safety risks for both the youth and staff located at the Center, who would no longer have the ability to use medications as an element to treat mental illness. It would also no longer allow the youth at the center to receive treatment for acute and chronic medical conditions.

This contract was awarded to Westwood Pharmacy through a competitive bidding process. Proposals were submitted from Westwood Pharmacy, Diamond Drugs, Inc., and PharMerica Corp. The proposals were reviewed by an evaluation team to ensure that they met the requirements of the Center. Westwood Pharmacy was

EXPLANATION

The primary purpose of this agreement is to provide necessary prescribed medications to youth residing in the John H. Sununu Youth Services Center. Additional services to be provided by the vendor include inservice training to Center staff on new medication and new drug regimens. On average 280 prescriptions are dispensed each month, including those to residents, individuals on furloughs and individuals being discharged. Because the Division does not anticipate an increase in population at the Center in State Fiscal Year 2013, the requested amount is the same as had been approved in State Fiscal Year 2012. This is an estimated amount based on annual projections for expenses in State Fiscal Year 2012.

Westwood Pharmacy has provided excellent service to the Division during State Fiscal Years 2011 and 2012. They offer competitive prices, convenient ordering and delivery, and customer service for Center staff. The Division determined to request renewal of this contract only after determining that immediate consolidation of these services under New Hampshire Hospital's Pharmaceutical contract was not cost effective. As a result continuation of the agreement with Westwood Pharmacy results in lower medications cost to the Division.

The Division does anticipate that costs savings would be possible by collaborating with New Hampshire Hospital and potentially the Department of Corrections on a joint Request for Proposals for consolidated contracts. Determining the scope of this cross Departmental initiative and how it can save costs and best serve different populations will require thorough exploration and coordination. In turn, the Division is requesting this one-year renewal with Westwood to continue this analysis and either produce a Request For Proposals for consolidated services or services solely for the Sununu Center during State Fiscal Year 2014.

EXPLANATION

This contract is for the purpose of providing necessary prescribed medications to the DIIS for individuals served by the John H. Sununu Youth Services Center and other services, including in-service training to the DIIS staff on new medication and new drug regimens. On average 210 monthly prescriptions are dispensed including those to resident individuals, individuals on furloughs and individuals being discharged.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) seeking qualified professionals was posted on the websites of the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Administrative Services, Bureau of Purchase and Property from February 22, 2010 through March 8, 2010. In response, three proposals were reviewed by Division personnel to ensure that they met the requirements of the RFP. All three met the RFP requirements with Westwood Pharmacy also being the lowest bidder. A bid summary worksheet is attached for review. The reviewers were Scott MacLean, Manager of Health Services and Richelle Swanson, Business Administrator. Scott MacLean has been with the Division for 21 years. Richelle Swanson has been with the Division for 13 years overseeing contracts and other fiscally related items.

Under this agreement for prescription medications Westwood Pharmacy will charge the Average Wholesale Price (AWP) minus 16.4% for Brand Name prescriptions and the AWP minus 71% for Generics. These charges are 1.4% less than the DJJS is currently paying for Brand Name prescriptions and 16% less than it is paying for Generics with its current contracted vendor. In addition, unused and returned non-narcotic medications will be credited to the DJJS account, thereby enabling DJJS to realize additional savings. In whole, the Division looks to reduce its prescription medications costs by 10% of current year expenditures.

This is the first time that the DJJS has entered into an agreement with Westwood Pharmacy. The contract includes a provision to renew for up to an additional two years subject to the continued availability of funds, satisfactory performance of services, and approval by the Governor and Executive Council.

- 7.2 Unless otherwise authorized in writing, during the term of this Agreement, and for a period of six (6) months after the Completion Date in block 1.7, the Contractor shall not hire, and shall not permit any subcontractor or other person, firm or corporation with whom it is engaged in a combined effort to perform the Services to hire, any person who is a State employee or official, who is materially involved in the procurement, administration or performance of this Agreement. This provision shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- 7.3 The Contracting Officer specified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, shall be the State's representative. In the event of any dispute concerning the interpretation of this Agreement, the Contracting Officer's decision shall be final for the State.

8. EVENT OF DEFAULT/REMEDIES.

- 8.1 Any one or more of the following acts or omissions of the Contractor shall constitute an event of default hereunder ("Event of Default"):
- 8.1.1 failure to perform the Services satisfactorily or on schedule;
- 8.1.2 failure to submit any report required hereunder; and/or 8.1.3 failure to perform any other covenant, term or condition of this Agreement.
- 8.2 Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default, the State may take any one, or more, or all, of the following actions: 8.2.1 give the Contractor a written notice specifying the Event of Default and requiring it to be remedied within, in the absence of a greater or lesser specification of time, thirty (30) days from the date of the notice; and if the Event of Default is not timely remedied, terminate this Agreement, effective two (2) days after giving the Contractor notice of termination; 8.2.2 give the Contractor a written notice specifying the Event of Default and suspending all payments to be made under this Agreement and ordering that the portion of the contract price which would otherwise accrue to the Contractor during the period from the date of such notice until such time as the State determines that the Contractor has cured the Event of Default shall never be paid to the Contractor;
- 8.2.3 set off against any other obligations the State may owe to the Contractor any damages the State suffers by reason of any Event of Default; and/or
- 8.2.4 treat the Agreement as breached and pursue any of its remedies at law or in equity, or both.

9. DATA/ACCESS/CONFIDENTIALITY/ PRESERVATION.

- 9.1 As used in this Agreement, the word "data" shall mean all information and things developed or obtained during the performance of, or acquired or developed by reason of, this Agreement, including, but not limited to, all studies, reports, files, formulae, surveys, maps, charts, sound recordings, video recordings, pictorial reproductions, drawings, analyses, graphic representations, computer programs, computer printouts, notes, letters, memoranda, papers, and documents, all whether finished or unfinished.
- 9.2 All data and any property which has been received from the State or purchased with funds provided for that purpose under this Agreement, shall be the property of the State, and shall be returned to the State upon demand or upon termination of this Agreement for any reason.
 9.3 Confidentiality of data shall be governed by N.H. RSA
- 9.3 Confidentiality of data shall be governed by N.H. RSA chapter 91-A or other existing law. Disclosure of data requires prior written approval of the State.
- 10. TERMINATION. In the event of an early termination of this Agreement for any reason other than the completion of the Services, the Contractor shall deliver to the Contracting Officer, not later than fifteen (15) days after the date of termination, a report ("Termination Report") describing in detail all Services performed, and the contract price earned, to and including the date of termination. The form, subject matter, content, and number of copies of the Termination

Report shall be identical to those of any Final Report described in the attached EXHIBIT A.

11. CONTRACTOR'S RELATION TO THE STATE. In

the performance of this Agreement the Contractor is in all respects an independent contractor, and is neither an agent nor an employee of the State. Neither the Contractor nor any of its officers, employees, agents or members shall have authority to bind the State or receive any benefits, workers' compensation or other emoluments provided by the State to its employees.

12. ASSIGNMENT/DELEGATION/SUBCONTRACTS.

The Contractor shall not assign, or otherwise transfer any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the N.H. Department of Administrative Services. None of the Services shall be subcontracted by the Contractor without the prior written consent of the State.

13. INDEMNIFICATION. The Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the State, its officers and employees, from and against any and all losses suffered by the State, its officers and employees, and any and all claims, liabilities or penalties asserted against the State, its officers and employees, by or on behalf of any person, on account of, based or resulting from, arising out of (or which may be claimed to arise out of) the acts or omissions of the Contractor. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein contained shall be deemed to constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the State, which immunity is hereby reserved to the State. This covenant in paragraph 13 shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

14. INSURANCE.

- 14.1 The Contractor shall, at its sole expense, obtain and maintain in force, and shall require any subcontractor or assignee to obtain and maintain in force, the following insurance:
- 14.1.1 comprehensive general liability insurance against all claims of bodily injury, death or property damage, in amounts of not less than \$250,000 per claim and \$2,000,000 per occurrence; and
- 14.1.2 fire and extended coverage insurance covering all property subject to subparagraph 9.2 herein, in an amount not less than 80% of the whole replacement value of the property. 14.2 The policies described in subparagraph 14.1 herein shall be on policy forms and endorsements approved for use in the State of New Hampshire by the N.H. Department of Insurance, and issued by insurers licensed in the State of New Hampshire.
- 14.3 The Contractor shall furnish to the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, a certificate(s) of insurance for all insurance required under this Agreement. Contractor shall also furnish to the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, certificate(s) of insurance for all renewal(s) of insurance required under this Agreement no later than fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration date of each of the insurance policies. The certificate(s) of insurance and any renewals thereof shall be attached and are incorporated herein by reference. Each

certificate(s) of insurance shall contain a clause requiring the insurer to endeavor to provide the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, no less than ten (10) days prior written notice of cancellation or modification of the policy.

15. WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

- 15.1 By signing this agreement, the Contractor agrees, certifies and warrants that the Contractor is in compliance with or exempt from, the requirements of N.H. RSA chapter 281-A ("Workers' Compensation").
- 15.2 To the extent the Contractor is subject to the requirements of N.H. RSA chapter 281-A, Contractor shall maintain, and require any subcontractor or assignee to secure and maintain, payment of Workers' Compensation in connection with activities which the person proposes to undertake pursuant to this Agreement. Contractor shall furnish the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, proof of Workers' Compensation in the manner described in N.H. RSA chapter 281-A and any applicable renewal(s) thereof, which shall be attached and are incorporated herein by reference. The State shall not be responsible for payment of any Workers' Compensation premiums or for any other claim or benefit for Contractor, or any subcontractor or employee of Contractor, which might arise under applicable State of New Hampshire Workers' Compensation laws in connection with the performance of the Services under this Agreement.
- 16. WAIVER OF BREACH. No failure by the State to enforce any provisions hereof after any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of its rights with regard to that Event of Default, or any subsequent Event of Default. No express failure to enforce any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of the right of the State to enforce each and all of the provisions hereof upon any further or other Event of Default on the part of the Contractor.
- 17. NOTICE. Any notice by a party hereto to the other party shall be deemed to have been duly delivered or given at the time of mailing by certified mail, postage prepaid, in a United States Post Office addressed to the parties at the addresses given in blocks 1.2 and 1.4, herein.
- 18. AMENDMENT. This Agreement may be amended, waived or discharged only by an instrument in writing signed by the parties hereto and only after approval of such amendment, waiver or discharge by the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire.
- 19. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT AND TERMS.

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire, and is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns. The wording used in this Agreement is the wording chosen by the parties to express their mutual intent, and no rule of construction shall be applied against or in favor of any party.

- 20. THIRD PARTIES. The parties hereto do not intend to benefit any third parties and this Agreement shall not be construed to confer any such benefit.
- 21. HEADINGS. The headings throughout the Agreement are for reference purposes only, and the words contained therein shall in no way be held to explain, modify, amplify or aid in the interpretation, construction or meaning of the provisions of this Agreement.
- 22. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. Additional provisions set forth in the attached EXHIBIT C are incorporated herein by reference.
- 23. SEVERABILITY. In the event any of the provisions of this Agreement are held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be contrary to any state or federal law, the remaining provisions of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect.
- 24. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement, which may be executed in a number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, constitutes the entire Agreement and understanding between the parties, and supersedes all prior Agreements and understandings relating hereto.

1. Provisions Applicable To All Services

1.1 The Contractor agrees that, to the extent future legislative action by the New Hampshire General Court or Federal or State court orders may have an impact on the Service(s) described herein, the State Agency has the right to modify Service priorities and expenditure requirements under this Contract so as to achieve compliance therewith, in which event the price limitations for such Service(s) will be renegotiated.

2. Services To Be Provided

- 2.1 Vendor will provide the necessary prescribed medications for all units at the Sununu Youth Services Center, 1056 North River Road, Manchester, NH 03104 as ordered by physicians/dentists/ARNP/PA under the following terms:
 - A) Maximum number of beds: 144; Average daily census: 75; Average monthly furloughs with medication: 10; Average monthly discharges with medication: 15; Total average monthly prescriptions: 185.

- B) Individual prescriptions dispensed for a period of thirty (30) days for both Detention juveniles and committed juveniles, unless mutually agreed upon and delivered at a different amount, except where prohibited by law, or the physicians/dentists/ARNP/PA's order.
- C) All solid dosage medications shall be in blister packs. Schedule III and IV drugs will be dispensed in the same manner as all other prescription medications but stored as required by applicable laws and regulations. Any changes in packaging must be mutually agreed upon and delivered at the same or lesser cost.
- D) All liquid medications shall be filled in the least expensive method of individual packaging or bulk packaging unless specified otherwise by the DJJS. Except that the cost of any unusual packaging required by the DJJS not included in the Average Wholesale Price (AWP) of a product be invoiced at cost to the DJJS.
- E) Vendor shall provide, when available, generic drugs approved by the federal government that fall into the "A" generic drug category. Generic drug substitution shall not occur when the physicians/dentists/ARNP/PA's order specifically states not to utilize a generic substance.
- F) Over the counter drugs will be provided in bulk as stock at actual cost rather than dispensed as individual prescriptions if mutually agreed upon by both parties.
- G) Vendor shall provide, for the length of the contract, two medication carts set up for blister packs distribution.
 - 2.2 The Vendor shall also provide the following services:
- H) All services provided shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations of the NH State Board of Pharmacy especially those pertaining to Ph 706 Pharmaceutical Care Standards. Prospective drug reviews will therefore be done in accordance with Ph 706.02.
- I) Prescriptions, over the counter (OTC) products, an Emergency Drug Kit and an after-hours drug box shall be delivered to DJJS in a mutually agreed upon manner (eg. courier, express mail, etc.) in accordance to NH State Board of Pharmacy regulations.
- J) Medication orders will be written on physician's order sheets to be faxed to the Vendor for each DJJS resident as agreed upon by the both parties. Prescription shall include all special instructions for the proper administration of the mediation or substance such as "after meals," "with food," etc. Proof of use sheet for controlled substances shall also be provided.
- K) Vendor pharmacy coverage shall be provided Monday through Friday from 7:00 AM until 4:00 PM, including weekday holidays. After hours coverage shall be provided by an after hours drug box, the contents mutually agreed upon by both parties in accordance with the rules and regulations of the NH State Board of Pharmacy. A pharmacist shall be available by electronic pager (with a maximum one hour telephone response) for phone consultation only, twenty-four hours per day 365 days per year.
- L) The DJJS will be billed for the number of prescriptions dispensed at the end of the billing period, not for the expected usage.
- M) The vendor will provide biannual in-service education to the DJJS staff on new medication and new drug regimens, and answer questions on how to properly administer and dispose of

medications. The date and time of these in-service training sessions will be determined as agreed upon by the DJJS Manager of Health Services and the vendor.

- N) The "Relabeling" process has been defined according to NH State Board of Pharmacy regulations and a mutually acceptable system has been implemented. Both parties agree that the current prescription label must reflect the intent of the order. Turn around time must not exceed twenty-four (24) hours. It is expected that all reordering and relabeling will be done during "regular" business hours of 7:00 AM 4:00 PM Monday through Friday.
- O) The vendor will provide electronically generated medication administration logs once a month or as mutually agreed upon by both parties.
- P) Furlough and discharge medications will be dispensed in child resistant containers when sufficient advance notice is given to vendor.
- Q) Disposal of unused medications (those that can't be returned for credit to vendor) will be the responsibility of the vendor. The vendor will provide containers for the purpose of medication disposal.
- R) Medications returned to the vendor in unopened unit dose packaging will be credited to the DJJS in accordance with NH State Board of Pharmacy regulations.

3. Special Provisions

- 1. The contractor will begin providing services effective the date of contract approval by Governor and Council or July 1, 2010 whichever is later) and will continue to provide services until June 30, 2012.
