REQUESTED ACTION

Approve Michael Kennedy's request to perform the following work on Lake Winnepesaukee, in Tuftonboro. File # 2013-02008. This project will not have significant impact on or adversely affect the values of Lake Winnepesaukee.

Repair an existing 42 ft. "L" shaped breakwater, remove a 4 ft. x 24 ft. cantilevered wharf along the shore and restore the shoreline, replace a 5 ft. x 25 ft. seasonal dock with a 6 ft. x 40 ft. seasonal dock anchored by a 3 ft. x 7 ft. concrete pad on an average of 165 ft. of frontage on Lake Winnepesaukee, in Tuftonboro.

The Department imposed the following conditions as part of this approval:

1. All work shall be in accordance with plans by Winnepesaukee Marine Construction dated July 15, 2013, as received by the NH Department of Environmental Services (DES) on July 25, 2013.
2. This permit shall not be effective until it has been recorded with the Carroll County Registry of Deeds office by the Permittee. A copy of the recorded permit shall be submitted to the DES Wetlands Bureau, by certified mail, return receipt requested, prior to construction.
3. This permit to replace or repair existing structures shall not preclude the DES from taking any enforcement action or revocation action if the DES later determines that these "existing structures" were not previously permitted or grandfathered.
4. The existing wharf and seasonal dock shall be completely removed prior to any work to the breakwater or installation of the new docking structures.
5. Repairs shall maintain existing size, location and configuration.
6. Appropriate siltation, erosion, and turbidity controls shall be in place prior to construction, maintained during construction, and shall remain in place until the area is stabilized.
7. Work authorized shall be carried out such that discharges in spawning or nursery areas during spawning seasons shall be avoided, and impacts to such areas shall be avoided or minimized to the maximum extent practicable during all times of the year.
8. Work shall be carried out in a time and manner such that disturbance to migratory waterfowl breeding areas and spawning areas shall be avoided.
9. Area shall be re-graded to original contours following completion of work.

10. These shall be the only structures on this water frontage and all portions of the docking structures shall be at least 20 ft. from abutting property lines or the imaginary extension of those lines into the water.
11. The seasonal pier shall be removed from the lake for the non-boating season.
12. No portion of the seasonal pier shall extend more than 40 ft. from the shoreline at full lake elevation.
13. The concrete pad shall be located entirely behind the natural undisturbed shoreline and above elevation 504.32 ft.
14. All activities shall be in accordance with the Shoreland Water Quality Protection Act, RSA 483-B. The owner is responsible for obtaining any Shoreland Permit that may be required per RSA 483-B, for construction, excavation or fill that will occur within the Protected Shoreland.


EXPLANATION

The DES Wetlands Bureau approved this project on September 18, 2013. DES supported its decision with the following findings:

1. This is a major impact project per Administrative Rule Env-Wt 303.02(d) construction or modification of major docking system defined by Env-Wt 101.56, and any dock
 1. adjacent or attached to a breakwater.
 2. The need for the proposed impacts has been demonstrated by the applicant per Env-Wt 302.01.
 3. The applicant has an average of 165 ft. of shoreline frontage along Lake Winnepesaukee.
 4. A maximum of 3 slips may be permitted on this frontage per Rule Env-Wt 402.12, Frontage Over 75'.
 5. The proposed docking facility will provide 3 slips as defined per RSA 482-A:2, VIII and therefore meets Rule Env-Wt 402.12.
 6. The proposed project was previously approved under DES permit 2008-00472. However, the work was never conducted.
 7. Public hearing is waived with the finding that the project impacts will not significantly impair the resources of Lake Winnepesaukee.

Application file documents are being forwarded to the Governor and Executive Council in connection with their consideration of this matter pursuant to RSA 482-A:3,II.(a) as it is a major project in public waters of the state.

We respectfully submit this request for your consideration.

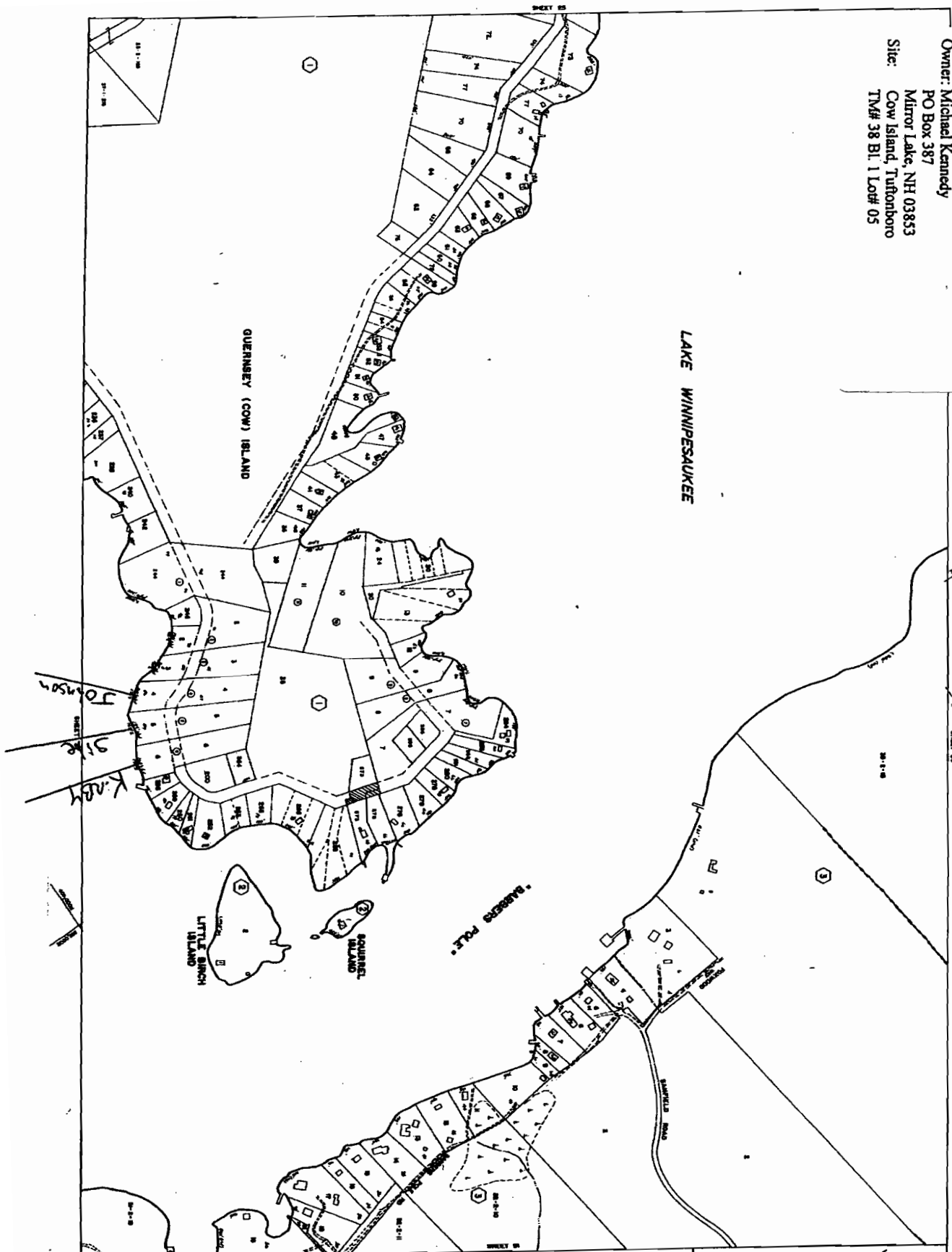

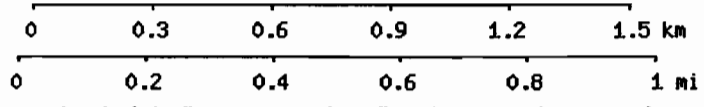
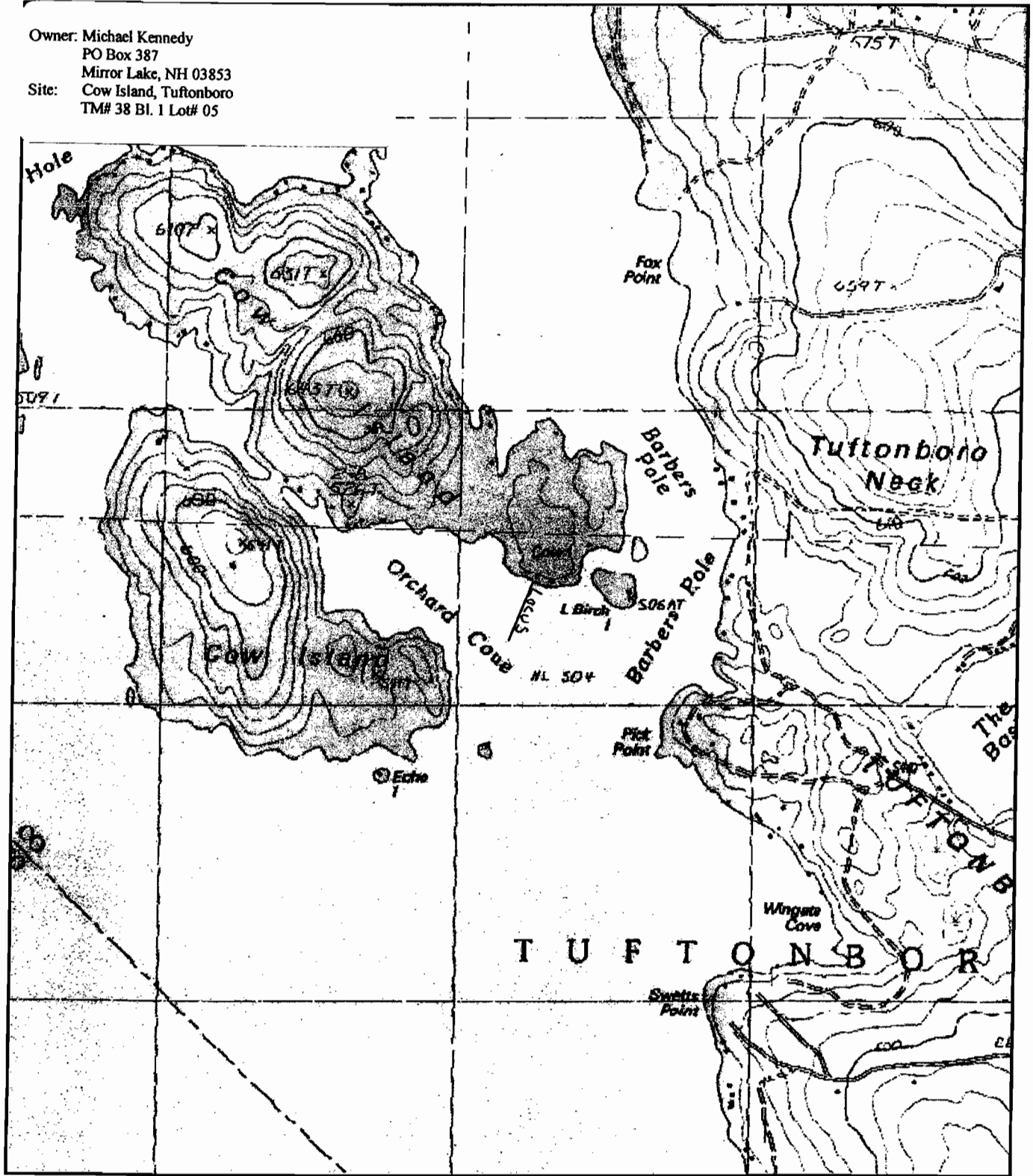

The NH Natural Heritage database has been checked by staff of the NH Natural Heritage Bureau and/or the NH Nongame and Endangered Species Program for records of rare species and exemplary natural communities near the area mapped below. 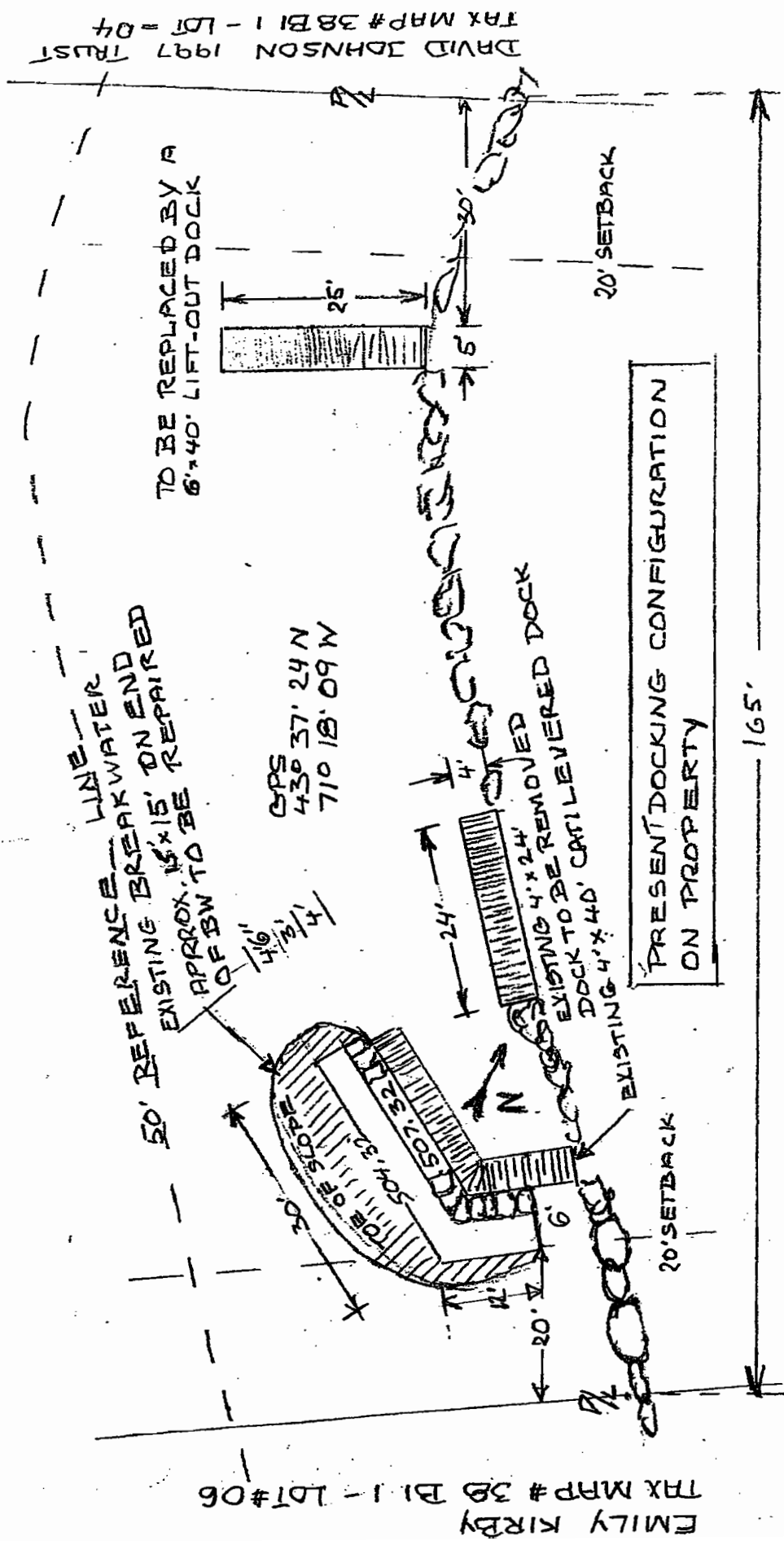

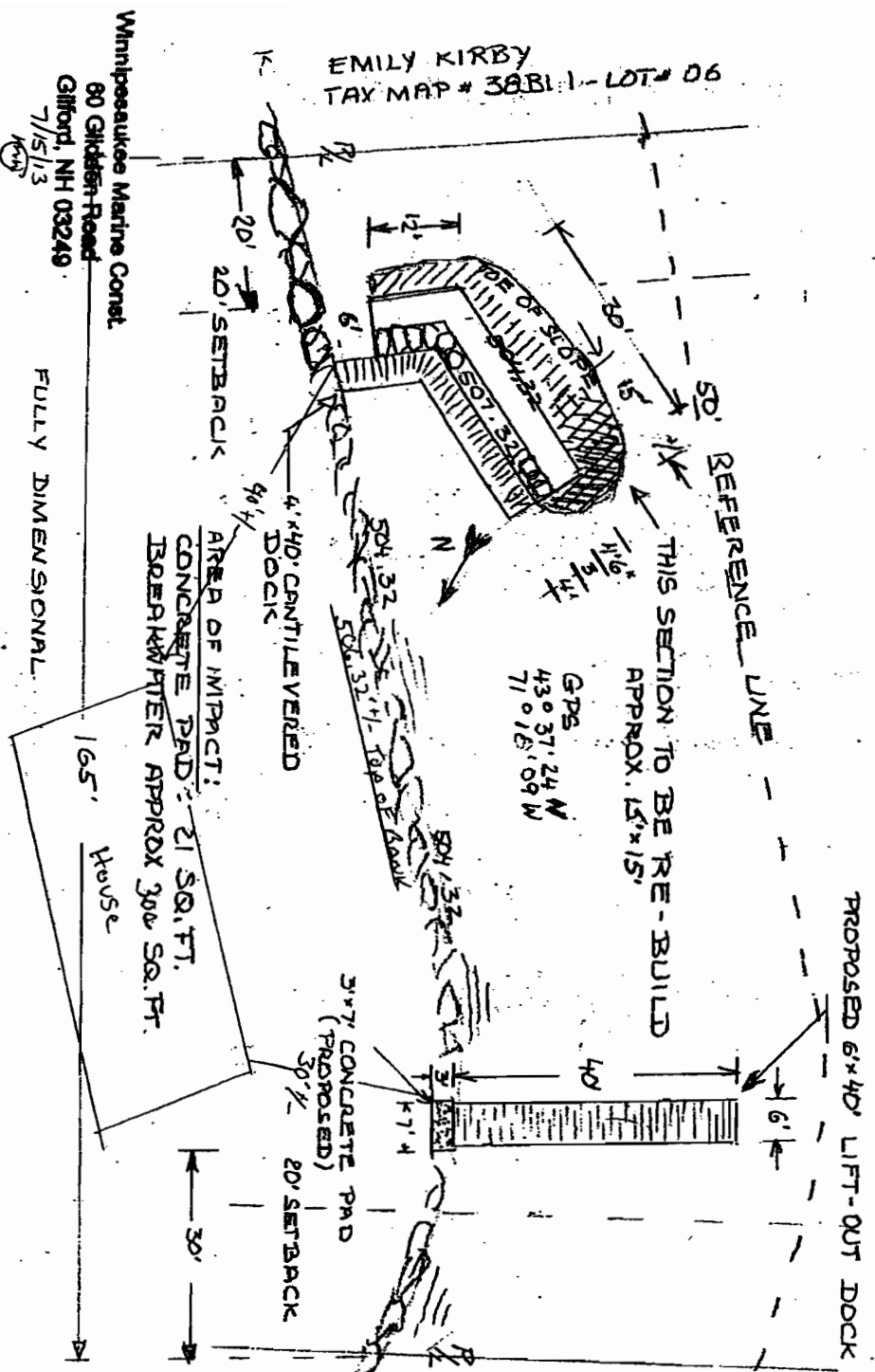

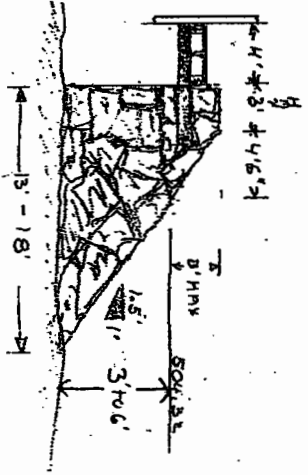
