## **Sonja Batten, Ph.D.**

Dr. Batten is deputy chief consultant for Specialty Mental Health in the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). She is also adjunct associate professor of psychiatry in the Georgetown University School of Medicine and the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences School of Medicine. She is an active researcher in the field of traumatic stress, and is the author of the text *Essentials of Acceptance and Commitment Therapy*. Dr. Batten previously served as deputy director of the Defense Centers of Excellence for Psychological Health and Traumatic Brain Injury, as coordinator for trauma recovery programs for VA Maryland Health Care System, and as associate director for women's health research at Yale.

## **Robert Bentley, M.D.**

Dr. Bentley was elected as governor of Alabama on November 2, 2010, after serving in the Alabama House of Representatives since 2002. Dr. Bentley has also founded a number of small businesses, including Alabama Dermatology Associates, where he managed the practice's growth into one of the largest dermatology practices in the Southeastern United States. Dr. Bentley began a three-year residency in dermatology at the University of Alabama hospital in Birmingham following his service in the United States Air Force as a captain, general medical officer, and hospital commander. He earned a medical degree at the University of Alabama School of Medicine in 1968.

## **Charles Clapton**

Mr. Clapton is the Republican health policy director for the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions. Prior to joining the HELP Committee, he served as the chief health counsel for the Republican staff of the House Ways and Means Committee. Mr. Clapton also served as the policy advisor on health issues for Speaker Dennis Hastert. Prior to that, he was the chief health policy counsel for the Republican staff of the House Energy and Commerce Committee for Chairman Joe Barton, where he worked on all health-related issues within the committee's jurisdiction, including the Medicaid and Medicare changes that were included in the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005. His prior experience includes serving as an Energy and Commerce Committee health counsel for then-Chairman Billy Tauzin during the drafting and subsequent conference that led to the Medicare Modernization Act of 2003. In this capacity, he had a role in developing the Part D prescription drug benefit for Medicare beneficiaries, revisions to the existing payment methodologies for drugs covered under Medicare Part B, and changes in the Medicaid program. Prior to 2001, he served as an oversight counsel under Committee Chairman Tom Bliley, working primarily on health care fraud and abuse.

## **John Crosby**

Mr. Crosby is chief risk officer for GE Capital, Healthcare Financial Services, a premier provider of financing to the health care industry. He is responsible for overseeing global risk management activities for the \$13 billion commercial finance health care portfolio within GE Capital, including debt and equity products in corporate finance, real estate, and life science finance. He has been with GE for more than 17 years and has held various leadership roles in risk management, sales, and operations. Prior to joining GE, Mr. Crosby was an audit manager with KPMG, serving customers in the health care, financial services, education, and manufacturing industry. He is a graduate of Quinnipiac University in New Haven, Conn., and is a certified public accountant.

## **Susan Dentzer**

Ms. Dentzer is the editor-in-chief of *Health Affairs* and an on-air analyst with PBS NewsHour. An award-winning television and print journalist, from 1998 to 2008 she led the NewsHour's unit covering health care and policy. She chairs the board of directors of the Global Health Council and serves on the Board of Overseers of Dartmouth Medical School and the board of the International Rescue Committee. Ms. Dentzer is a Dartmouth graduate and former Nieman Fellow at Harvard University, as well as an elected member of the Institute of Medicine and the Council of Foreign Relations.

## **Mary Durham, Ph.D.**

Dr. Durham has served as The Center for Health Research (CHR) director and vice president of research for Kaiser Permanente since 1995. In addition to her leadership roles, Dr. Durham conducts her own research on workplace health and translational research, and has more than 20 years of hands-on content knowledge and experience in workplace policies and practices. Dr. Durham is also the associate director of the Oregon Clinical and Translational Research Institute, (OCTRI), where she contributes to the science of translating research to practice and developing strong interactions between discovery and dissemination. She also serves as a professor in the Department of Public Health and Preventive Medicine at the Oregon Health & Science University, and as an adjunct professor in the Department of Sociology at Portland State University. She previously served as commissioner for Oregon's Senate Commission for Health Care Access and Affordability. She is also a former commissioner of the American Bar Association, where she served on the ABA's Commission on Mental and Physical Disability Law. Dr. Durham received a Ph.D. in sociology from the University of Oklahoma.

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## **Harry L. Eichelberger**

Mr. Eichelberger is a principal of Oak Hill Capital Partners and is responsible for investments in the health care group. Prior to joining Oak Hill in 2003, he worked at JPMorgan in its financial sponsors group. Mr. Eichelberger earned a B.S. degree and a B.A. degree with high honors from the University of California, Berkeley.

## **Dan Elling, M.A.**

Mr. Elling currently serves as the staff director for the House Ways and Means Health Subcommittee for Committee Chairman Dave Camp (R-Mich.). He previously served in this role for then-Ranking Member Dave Camp and former Ranking Member Jim McCrery (R-La.) and has been responsible for Medicare Advantage, Medicare Part D, and Medicare post-acute care policy for the Committee Republicans. Mr. Elling formerly covered this issue portfolio for former Ways and Means Committee Chairman Bill Thomas. Prior to joining the Committee, Mr. Elling served as health policy aide to former Ways and Means Health Subcommittee Chairman Nancy Johnson (R-Conn.) and legislative assistant to former Health Subcommittee member Congressman Jim Ramstad (R-Minn.). Before moving to Washington, Mr. Elling developed and analyzed health care research for a market research firm in Minneapolis. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and history from Gustavus Adolphus College and a Master of Arts degree in political management from The George Washington University.

## **Foster Gesten, M.D.**

Dr. Gesten is the medical director for the Office of Health Insurance Programs in the New York State Department of Health, where he provides clinical direction and leadership for a team of professionals engaged in quality oversight, performance measurement and clinical improvement within health plans and public insurance programs in New York. His organization's major initiatives include the development of statewide public reporting systems for commercial, Medicaid, and Child Health managed care programs on quality, access, and satisfaction, medical home demonstrations, and provider-based quality measurement and improvement. His interests include population health, health service research, and quality improvement projects directed at prevention services and chronic care. Dr. Gesten is a member of the National CAHPS Benchmarking Database Advisory Group, the Committee on Performance Measurement at the National Committee for Quality Assurance, and

a member of the Measure Application Partnership Coordinating Committee of the National Quality Forum. He was trained in general internal medicine at Brown University.

## **Adrienne Hallett**

Ms. Hallett has served on the majority staff of the Senate Appropriations Committee, Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and Related Agencies since 2001. Her oversight responsibilities include the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, and AmeriCorps. Previously, Ms. Hallett worked full-time as support staff for the vice-chancellor for health affairs at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. Ms. Hallett graduated from the University of Northern Iowa with a Bachelor of Arts in philosophy. She earned a Master's of Theological Studies (M.T.S.) with an emphasis in ethics from Vanderbilt Divinity School in 1999.

## **Ryan Long, J.D.**

Mr. Long has served as the chief health counsel for the Health Subcommittee of the Energy and Commerce Committee since July 2006. He joined the committee as a professional staff member in April of 2004 focusing on issues related to the Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act and Medicare. Prior to that, he worked in the office of Congressman Joe Barton as the congressman's legislative assistant for health care and then his legislative director. Before joining the office of Congressman Barton, Mr. Long worked for Congressman Charlie Norwood of Georgia from 1998-1999. He received an undergraduate degree from the University of North Carolina and a Juris Doctorate from the Columbus School of Law at Catholic University.

## **Wendell Primus, Ph.D.**

Dr. Primus is the senior policy advisor on budget and health issues to Democratic Leader Nancy Pelosi. Prior to this appointment in March 2005, Dr. Primus was the minority staff director at the Joint Economic Committee. Prior to that position, he served as the director of income security for the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities in Washington, D.C. He previously served in the Clinton administration as the deputy assistant secretary for human services policy at the Department of Health and Human Services. In that position, he was primarily responsible for policy development and for the conduct of research and evaluation on issues relating to income assistance, employment,

and related human services programs. Dr. Primus has also served as chief economist for the House Ways and Means Committee and staff director for the Committee's Subcommittee on Human Resources. During his 15-year tenure at Ways and Means, he was responsible for editing 13 editions of the Committee's "Green Book." Dr. Primus received a Ph.D. in economics from Iowa State University.

### **Elizabeth Roberts, M.B.A.**

Lieutenant Governor Roberts was inaugurated as the lieutenant governor of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations on January 2, 2007. In January 2011, Governor Chafee signed into executive order the Rhode Island Healthcare Reform Commission and named Lt. Governor Roberts as its chair. She has been active in many state health reform programs, including the "Healthy RI Implementation Task Force" launched

in May 2010. The task force's first report serves as a guidebook to enable state government leadership to be proactive in implementing health reform, ready to take advantage of the opportunities in the law, as well as anticipate and address any challenges that will arise as the law takes effect. In October 2007, Lt. Gov. Roberts launched *Mission: Healthy RI*, an advisory work group of representatives from the medical community, the insurance industry, hospitals, business owners, labor leaders, consumers, advocates and other stakeholders. She has worked with this group to move the state toward a plan to insure all Rhode Islanders. The culmination of *Mission: Healthy RI* came in February 2008 with the introduction of the Rhode Island Healthy Reform Act of 2008, an eight-part, comprehensive health care reform package. Prior to her role as lieutenant governor, she served five terms in the Rhode Island State Senate.
