Is it possible to identify a set of core competencies (not course requirements) that postsecondary would agree qualifies a student for admission to credit-bearing work? What evidence of readiness would be most meaningful to admissions, placement and student support processes in higher education? David Conley will lead this discussion to assess interest in digital student profiles and graduation portfolios that could collect multiple forms of evidence against a broader range of deeper learning outcomes and expectations for readiness.
