About the State Innovation Exchange (SIX)

Progressives suffer from a power deficit in state government. This deficit is primarily the result of a well-organized and highly-capitalized network of conservative organizations that develops, disseminates, and promotes state legislation in service to a large group of corporate funders and special interests. This network has rapidly and effectively spread legislation like SB 1070 (the Arizona immigration law), “Stand Your Ground” laws, voter ID requirements, rollbacks in environmental and labor protections, restrictions on corporate liability, limitations on democratic funding of elections, and the privatization of an ever-widening range of public services.

The State Innovation Exchange (SiX) is a new organization designed to not only push back on this dominance but also to advance a progressive policy and messaging agenda in the states by: providing training and other policy, communications and technical support to state legislators, serving as the campaign war room and organizational hub for multi-state legislative campaigns, developing a robust communications program and serving as a repository of experts, model legislation (and accompanying supporting material) and connections back to progressive groups through its digital community and library. The organization, which combines a number of existing progressive state legislative resources, including the Progressive States Network (PSN), the American Legislative and Issue Campaign Exchange (ALICE), and the Center for State Innovation (CSI), launched this year, just after the fall midterms.

We have had conversations with hundreds of state legislators across the country to hear from them about the kinds of technical assistance they need and which issue areas are most in demand, and to get feedback on the state and national political context for both. Incorporating that feedback, our organization will be structured to function as additional staff capacity for progressive lawmakers. We will offer model legislation, support materials, and access to leading national experts and state-based organizations to help promote legislation. Our group will keep a low profile so that we do not get in the way of the lawmakers we are trying to help. Ultimately, we plan to position ourselves to be a legislative wing for the progressive movement that has credibility with national groups as well as local lawmakers, and the capacity to run multi-state issue campaigns.

Over the past few months we have been working with partners to develop resources on key legislative issues, complete our governing and advisory boards, develop a new website, and to prepare for this, our first national conference and the official launch of our organization.

Working together, we can close the progressive power deficit, but only if we take aggressive action now.

SiX Leadership

Nick Rathod is the Executive Director of the State Innovation Exchange following the merger of PSN, CSI and ALICE. Prior to leading SiX, Nick served as the Director of State Campaigns for Everytown for Gun Safety, where he oversaw legislative campaigns around issues of gun safety and violence prevention. He also served as the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau's (CFPB) Assistant Director for Intergovernmental and International Affairs where he helped build the structure of the CFPB and set up intergovernmental affairs and international operations for the agency. Before that, Nick served as a Special Assistant to the President of the United States and Deputy Director for Intergovernmental Affairs at the White House. He also served as the Director of Intergovernmental Affairs for the Obama-Biden Transition Team. In these roles he set up the Intergovernmental Affairs office for the Obama White House and was primarily responsible for President Obama's policy and political work in the states and US territories. Nick has also served as a senior advisor to former New York Governor Eliot Spitzer and Senior Manager of State and Regional Affairs at the Center for American Progress. Prior to entering politics, he worked as a civil rights attorney and community organizer focused on language access, housing discrimination and immigrant rights issues in minority and immigrant communities. He is also a founding member and former Chairman of the board of directors of South Asian Americans Leading Together (SAALT), a national non-profit dedicated to empowering the South Asian community. Nick is the recipient of numerous awards including the American University Washington College of Law Alumni of the Year Award, National South Asian Bar Association's Public Interest Attorney of the Year Award and the Frederick B. Abramson Foundation Award recognizing him as one of Washington DC's top public interest attorneys.
