Conference Information

The conference will provide opportunities for attendees to gain enhanced knowledge, useful strategies, and practical skills that will have a positive impact within the schools and local communities.

Internationally recognized speakers will deliver thought-provoking, dynamic presentations in addition to the relevant general sessions and workshops on a wide variety of topics. In addition to the extraordinary learning activities, networking events including Opening Ceremonies, a Welcome Reception, and a luncheon are provided as part of the conference registration.

Sessions will be presented by nationally recognized leaders and innovators in the noted fields including:

Dr. Scott Poland, Licensed Psychologist

Dr. Scott Poland is a Professor at CPS and the Co-Director of the Suicide and Violence Prevention Office at Nova Southeastern University.

The presenter, a licensed psychologist is an internationally recognized expert on youth suicide, self-injury and school crisis and has authored five books on the subject. His fifth book entitled, *Suicide in schools* was published in 2015 Routledge. He previously directed psychological services for a large Texas school system for 24 years and is a past President of the National Association of School Psychologists and a past Prevention Division Director of American Association of Suicidology. He has been an expert witness in numerous legal cases where schools were sued following a crisis. He is very dedicated to suicide prevention and has testified about the mental health needs of children before the U.S. Congress on four occasions. He is a founding member of the National Emergency Assistance Team and has personally assisted school communities after 15 school shootings, acts of terrorism, natural disasters and numerous suicide clusters.

Session topics will include:

- D.A.R.E. curricula and classroom delivery.
- Skill development in the effective use of the latest internet and classroom technology.
- Current information on the relationship between drugs and crime.
- Identification of high risk students and their “hidden” youth language.
- Raise participant’s awareness of their contribution to school, neighborhood and community safety.
- Strategies to develop citizen participation and citizen-oriented public safety programs.
- Programs that demonstrate best practices and efforts that enhance safety in schools, neighborhoods, and communities.
- Community prevention programs.
- Achieving successful community engagement.
- Working with young people to reduce crime and anti-social behavior.
