  - Potential actions related to the international climate negotiations in Paris


**Directions to Georgetown Climate Center Offices (near Union Station):**


Once inside the library building, you will be greeted by a Georgetown Climate Center staff member and directed to the Institutes Conference Room (EBW 358)
