REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 261:97-c, <u>Userof Funds</u>, authorize the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, State Council on the Arts to award a Conservation Number Plate (Moose Plate) Grant to the Saint-Gaudens Memorial (VC #154155), Ossining, NY in the amount of \$20,000 for the conservation of the Amor Caritas sculpture at the Saint-Gaudens National Historical Park in Cornish, NH, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2020. 100% Other Funds (Agency Income)

Funding is available in account, Conservation Plate Fund, as follows:

EXPLANATION

The Conservation Number Plate Fund is used to promote the use and conservation of cultural resources in New Hampshire and to preserve the cultural heritage that belongs to all New Hampshire citizens by providing for the preservation of publicly owned historic properties.

One of the most photographed objects at the Saint-Gaudens National Historical Park (Park), the Amor Caritas, is a winged female figure holding a tablet. The Amor Caritas was designed in 1885-99 as the central portion for a proposed tomb for Governor Edwin Morgan of New York. When that tomb mysteriously burned during construction the project was abandoned.

At the park the sculpture has been enjoyed by countless visitors in its place at the end of the reflecting pool in the Atrium. However, the sculpture is now showing the effects of time. Last re-gilded in 1995, the gold leaf has worn away in many places, exposing the underlying treated bronze and is wearing thin on the rest of the statue. Because of the size and delicacy of the work, the Park proposes to conserve the piece on site. A temporary structure with a transparent wall or window will be constructed as part of the project so that the gilding can be seen by visitors. The gold sheets that constitute the gilding are both paper-thin and very delicate so the work must be done in an enclosed space free from drafts. Using a process centuries old, the surface will be cleaned and a new underlying surface or "size" will be laid down. By allowing the process to be seen, it will be possible for the public to view the important preservation work being done.

The Attorney General's office has approved the agreement as to form, substance and execution.

NEW HAMPSHIRE STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS GRANT AGREEMENT

This agreement between the State of New Hampshire, New Hampshire State Council on the Arts (hereinafter "Council") and Saint Gaudens Memorial (hereinafter "Grantee") is to witness receipt of funds subject to the following conditions:

1. GRANT PERIOD: FY2020

2. OBLIGATIONS OF THE GRANTEE:

- The Grantee agrees to accept \$20,000.00 and apply it to the program(s) described in the grant application and approved budget for To support the conservation of the Amor Caritas sculpture by Augustus Saint Gaudens. In the performance of this grant agreement, the Grantee is in all respects an independent contractor and is neither an agent nor employee of the State.
- Funding credit including Council logo must appear to all programs, publicity, and promotional materials. The following wording and Council logo should be used:



Saint Gaudens Memorial is supported in part by a grant from the New Hampshire State Council on the Mooseplate License Plate Program.

- The Grantee acknowledges that the NHSCA Program Coordinator may schedule a site visit to the organization and may request a site visit from the NHSCA.
- The Grantee agrees to abide by the limitations, conditions and procedure outlined herein and in the atrached appendices. If appropriated funds for this grants program are reduced or terminated, all payments under this grant may cease. That determination tests within the sole discretion of the Council.
- 3. PAYMENT will be made following the receipt and execution of all required documents and approval of the Governor and Executive Council
- 4. FINAL REPORT: The Grantee agrees to submit a final fuancial and narrative report on a form provided by the Council no final days after the end of the grant period. Failure to submit the final report will render the Grantee ineligible for Council funding for two years.
- 5. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY: No provision of this contract is to be deemed a waiver of sovereign immunity by the State of New Hampshire.




