#### Requested Action

#### Explanation

The Department of Safety, Division of Administration, intends to utilize the funds from the Joint Federal/State Motor Fuel Tax Compliance Project Agreement to have Road Toll Audit and Administrative personnel attend Federation of Tax Administrators Motor Fuel Tax Section and International Fuel Tax Association (IFTA) sponsored activities. These activities include regional and annual motor fuel tax conferences, uniformity meetings, motor fuel tax and investigation classes, and any other motor fuel tax related training, conference, or meeting.

In order to gain expertise, it is critical that states utilize uniform reporting and the latest electronic data interface (EDI) technology, attend training, and be actively involved in regional and national meetings regarding Motor Fuel tax evasion. It is anticipated that by establishing the ability to continue formal coordination between the states, the successes that the individual member states have had conducting motor fuel investigations can be built upon and enhanced.

The funds will be budgeted as follows.

The funds in Class 066, Registration, will be used to pay registration fees for training classes and conferences.
