

Agenda: Northeast Regional Carbon Pricing Strategy Meetings

March 13, 2017

The overall objective of this day is to support regional coordination and strategy around legislative carbon pricing efforts in the Northeast. The meetings that will take place during the day will provide legislators with a chance to increase coordination, discuss and refine strategies for achieving success, and expand outreach and messaging. The afternoon meeting will also engage diverse stakeholders in order to build support and alignment among a broader group.

Overview of the Schedule and Focus:

Time	Format
10:30 AM - 11:30 AM	Legislator Only Meeting: This meeting will provide time for legislators to confer with each other on strategies for overcoming any challenges they have faced in moving their bills forward. This session will also include time for sharing thoughts about a regional strategy, namely concrete actions that can be taken to improve alignment and support among legislative efforts in six states (CT, MA, NH, NY, RI, and VT).
11:30 AM - 12:00 PM	Press Conference: This press conference will be designed to highlight the growing support for carbon pricing policy in the NE and call for national level attention around the need for carbon pricing policies. The narrative will be that states are stepping up and taking action on this issue at a time when the national government is failing to do so.
12:00 PM - 1:00 PM	Lunch (Legislators and Stakeholders)
1:00 PM - 3:00 PM	Legislator + Stakeholder Meeting: This portion of the day will engage representatives of stakeholder groups that are critical to successful enactment of carbon pricing policies in the NE. The objective will be to discuss and strengthen the regional strategy to move try to forward in parallel efforts to establish carbon pricing policies in as many of the six states as possible. To ensure legislators and key stakeholders are up-to-date on efforts in the other states, a packet summarizing recent actions and status will be circulated in advance of the meeting. There is also the option of including a section on substantive questions – however this will depend on the stakeholders invited to the meeting and what kinds of questions and information needs they have.
