Requested Action

1. Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Insurance Department to accept and expend federal grant funds in the amount of \$280,076.12 for FY 2019 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services ("USDHHS") to support the Insurance Department's oversight of the safety and competitiveness of the Individual and Small Group health insurance markets in New Hampshire. This action is to be effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2019.


Source of Funds is 100% Federal Funds.

2. Pursuant to RSA 124:15 authorize the Insurance Department to establish a Class 046 (Consultants) to enter into contracts for consulting services with various vendors in Account Number 02-24-24-240010-2350 for the period of Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2019.

Funds will be budgeted as set forth in the table below. Source of funds: 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

The New Hampshire Insurance Department has received a federal grant for the purpose of enhancing the States' ability to effectively stabilize the Individual and Small Group health insurance market under Part A of title XXVII of the Public Health Service Act. The purpose of the grant program is to help States expand their review of health insurance issuers' compliance with Guaranteed Availability and Renewability of Coverage regulations. The Department plans to hire contractors to perform analyses that will enhance its understanding of the ways in which the risk pools of these markets are changing. This work will improve the Department's effectiveness in its continued efforts to assist legislators and other policymakers in determining how best to stabilize these markets which have, in recent years, shown considerable volatility. The goal of this analytical work is to produce recommendations to legislators and other policymakers for legislation or other regulatory initiatives that will ensure, to the greatest extent practicable, that individuals and small employers in this state have access to a reliable source of coverage that meets their health care needs. In addition, the Department plans to use grant funds to contract with a pharmacological clinician to support its ability to perform effective review of health plans' formularies. This work will improve the Department's ability to review health insurance plan designs to ensure that issuers are not designing plans in a way that discourages people with high-cost medical conditions from enrolling in those plans. Specifically, the Department will use the funds to perform a market scan and actuarial or economic analysis to assess: 1) that coverage is comprehensive and affordable, 2) what measures are needed to strengthen the type of coverage provided by health insurance issuers in the small group, and large group market, and 3) if products are being appropriately renewed or continued in force.

We are requesting the acceptance of this grant in the amount of \$280,076.12 to allow for the continuation of the State's efforts to effectively regulate and stabilize the Individual and Small Group health insurance market during FY2019.

The following appropriation authority is being requested for Fiscal Year 2019:

- 1. Class 020 Current Expenses FY19 \$1,150.12. These funds are required in order to provide general supplies support projects funded by this grant.
- 2. Class 041 Audit set aside FY19 \$280.00. These funds are required in order to meet audit costs associated with the grant program.
- 3. Class 046 Consultants FY19 \$278,646.00. These funds are required to review health insurance issuers' compliance with Guaranteed Availability and Renewability of Coverage regulations, and to ensure health insurance issuers do not include discriminatory benefit designs that discourage people with potentially high-cost medical conditions from enrolling in those plans.

The following information is provided in accordance with the Comptroller's instructional memorandum dated September 21, 1981:

- 1. Relationship to existing agency program: The funds from this federal grant will be used for the purpose of enhancing the States' ability to effectively stabilize the Individual and Small Group health insurance market and to ensure that health insurance issuers do not include discriminatory benefit designs.
- 2. Has a similar program been requested of the legislature and denied? The nature of the work to be completed under the grant has never been requested and denied by the General Court.
- 3. Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request? The FY18-FY19 Biennium budget process was completed before the grant was awarded.
- 4. Can portions of the grant funds be utilized? One hundred percent federal grant funds can be used to fund all program costs associated with this request.

In the event that federal funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program. Thank you for your consideration.
