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#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Authorize the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) to amend a SOLE SOURCE agreement (PO #1049114) with the New Hampshire Rivers Council, Concord, NH, (VC # 166749-B001) for the *Development of a Watershed Management Plan for the Winnicut River* project by extending the expiration date to December 31, 2019 from December 31, 2018 effective upon Governor and Council (G&C) approval. The original agreement was approved by the G&C on March 9, 2016, Item #82; Amendment 1 was approved on September 7, 2016, Item #37; Amendment 2 was approved on December 7, 2016, Item #64 and Amendment 3 was approved on December 20, 2017, item #5C. This is a no cost time extension. 100% Federal Funds.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This Amendment is considered **SOLE SOURCE** because Amendment #1 represented a greater than ten percent increase in the original grant amount. The New Hampshire Rivers Council is the only organization that could complete this project because the proposed tasks continue the on-going activities under the existing approved scope of work and subcontract agreements. Selecting another grantee to complete the work at this stage of the project would be logistically and financially infeasible.

This amendment provides additional time for the grantee to conduct outreach efforts related to the project. Over the past year, the grantee has been working to develop local interest and capacity to implement the outreach program. As a result of these local capacity building efforts, sufficient interest exists to implement the program. Therefore, now that local partners have been identified, additional time is needed for program implementation.

The Winnicut River and several of its tributaries are listed on the NHDES 2012 303(d) report because the water quality is insufficient to support the designated uses of Aquatic Life Use, and Primary Contact Recreation. The goal of this project is to develop a Winnicut River Watershed Management and Restoration Plan. The intent is to create a plan that will provide the scientific basis for understanding the sources, transport mechanisms, and severity of the existing nutrient and sediment loads within the watershed. The completed plan will identify sources of pollutants, recommend and prioritize specific restoration actions, identify pollutant load reductions which will be achieved through implementation of those actions, assign costs for implementation, and determine the responsible parties for carrying out

installation of Best Management Practices and their long-term operation and maintenance. It is anticipated that once the plan is fully implemented, dissolved oxygen levels in the river will increase and  $E.\ coli$  bacteria levels will decrease, enabling the river to meet its designated uses for Aquatic Life Use and Primary Contact Recreation. To date, \$92,915 of the original grant amount of \$102,810 has been spent.

The amendment has been approved by the Office of the Attorney General as to form, execution, and content.





The original agreement was approved by the G&C on March 9, 2016, Item #82; Amendment 1 was approved by G&C on September 7, 2016, Item #37; Amendment 2 was approved by G&C on December 7, 2016, Item #64. 100% Federal Funds.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This Amendment is considered SOLE SOURCE because it builds upon on-going activities under an existing approved scope of services. The New Hampshire Rivers Council is the only organization that could complete this project because the new work continues the on-going activities under the existing approved scope of work and subcontract agreements. Selecting another grantee to complete the work at this stage of the project would be logistically and financially infeasible.

This Amendment requests additional time to finish tasks associated with the project. The New Hampshire Rivers Council recently lost a staff member who was facilitating the completion of the project for the grant recipient and the project team. The project has made significant advancement toward the development of a watershed management plan for the Winnicut River, but additional time will be needed to complete tasks that were previously the responsibility of the staff person at the New Hampshire Rivers Council.

The Winnicut River and several of its tributaries are listed on the NHDES 2012 303(d) report because the water quality is insufficient to support the designated uses of Aquatic Life Use, and Primary Contact Recreation. The goal of this project is to develop a Winnicut River Watershed Management and Restoration Plan. The intent is to create a plan that will provide the scientific basis for understanding the sources, transport mechanisms, and severity of the existing nutrient and sediment loads within the watershed. The completed plan will identify sources of pollutants, recommend and prioritize specific restoration actions, identify pollutant load reductions which will be achieved through implementation of those actions, assign costs for implementation, and determine the responsible parties for carrying out installation of Best Management Practices and their long-term operation and maintenance. 

#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Authorize the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) to amend a SOLE SOURCE agreement (PO #1049114) with the New Hampshire Rivers Council, Concord, NH, (VC #166749-B001) for the *Development of a Watershed Management Plan for the Winnicut River* project by a) increasing the Grant Limitation by \$5,810 to \$102,810 from \$97,000 and b) increasing non-federal matching funds required to \$18,549 from \$14,674, an increase of \$3,875, effective upon Governor and Council (G&C) approval through December 31, 2017. The original agreement was approved by the G&C on March 9, 2016, Item #82; Amendment No. 1 was approved by G&C on September 7, 2016, Item #37, 100% Federal Funds.

#### **EXPLANATION**

This Amendment is considered SOLE SOURCE because it builds upon on-going activities under an existing approved scope of services. NHDES is requesting this Amendment for additional funds to cover costs associated with outreach tasks associated with the project and this Amendment also increases the amount of non-Federal matching funds required (as described above). Additional funding is needed because initial budget estimates underestimated the costs associated with outreach efforts needed to promote the project and raise public awareness about the need to protect and restore the Winnicut River. A well-funded outreach program is a critical and necessary project component that will ensure success of the project and build local capacity for future work to address water quality problems. A copy of the original agreement is included as Attachment B.

The Winnicut River and several of its tributaries are listed on the NHDES 2012 303(d) report because the water quality is insufficient to support the designated uses of Aquatic Life Use, and Primary Contact Recreation. Parameters contributing to these impairments include insufficient dissolved oxygen, poor benthic macroinvertebrate community diversity and abundance, and elevated concentrations of E:coli bacteria. Additionally, the Winnicut River is one of seven major tributaries to Great Bay. Great Bay is also listed on the state's 2012 303(d) list as impaired for Aquatic Life Use. The 2010 NHDES Great Bay Nitrogen Loading Analysis indicates that existing nitrogen loads from the watershed need to be

reduced by 6.6 tons annually to prevent low dissolved oxygen in the Winnicut River estuary and by 7.4 tons annually to protect eelgrass in Great Bay.

The goal of this project is to develop a Winnicut River Watershed Management and Restoration Plan. The intent is to create a plan that will provide the scientific basis for understanding the sources, transport mechanisms, and severity of the existing nutrient and sediment loads within the watershed. The completed plan will identify sources of pollutants, recommend and prioritize specific restoration actions, identify pollutant load reductions which will be achieved through implementation of those actions, assign costs for implementation, and determine the responsible parties for carrying out installation of Best Management Practices and their long-term operation and maintenance. It is anticipated that once the plan is fully implemented, dissolved oxygen levels in the river will increase and E. coli levels will decrease, enabling the river to meet its designated uses for Aquatic Life Use and Primary Contact Recreation.

The total amended project costs are budgeted at \$121,359. NHDES will provide \$102,810 (85%) of the project costs through a federal grant and the New Hampshire Rivers Council will provide the remaining. costs through cash and in-kind services. An amended budget breakdown is provided in Attachment A. In the event that Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program. 

#### EXPLANATION

This Amendment is considered SOLE SOURCE because it represents a greater than ten percent increase in the original grant amount. The Grantee is the only organization that could complete the additional work because the new work builds upon on-going activities under an existing approved grant agreement. Selecting another contractor to complete the work would be logistically and financially untenable. This Amendment seeks to add funds to the project for additional costs associated with technical analyses of water quality issues in the Winnicut River. The funding is needed because additional technical characterization is required to fully describe conditions in the river and provide the best possible science to further develop sound approaches for addressing water quality problems. A copy, of the original agreement is included as Attachment B. It also increases the matching funds from \$6,\$20 to \$14,674.

The Winnicut River and several of its tributaries are listed on the DES 2012 303(d) report because the water quality is insufficient to support the designated uses of Aquatic Life Use, and Primary Contact Recreation. Parameters contributing to these impairments include insufficient dissolved oxygen, poor benthic macroinvertebrate community diversity and abundance, and elevated concentrations of *E.coli* baeteria. Additionally, the Winnicut River is one of seven major tributaries to Great Bay. Great Bay is also listed on the state's 2012 303(d) list as impaired for Aquatic Life Use.

The goal of this project is to develop a Winnicut River Watershed Management and Restoration Plan. The intent is to create a plan that will provide the scientific basis for understanding the sources, transport mechanisms, and severity of the existing nutrient and sediment loads within the watershed. The completed plan will identify sources of pollutants, recommend and prioritize specific restoration actions, identify pollutant load reductions which will be achieved through implementation of those actions, assign costs for implementation, and determine the responsible parties for carrying out installation of Best Management Practices and their long-term-operation and maintenance. It is anticipated that once the plan is fully implemented, dissolved oxygen levels in the river will increase and *E. coli* levels will decrease, enabling the river to meet its designated uses for Aquatic Life Use and Primary Contact Recreation.



#### EXPLANATION

The Department of Environmental Services (DES) issued a Request For Proposals (RFP) for the 2016 Watershed Assistance Grants program. This year, the Watershed Assistance Grant funding has been augmented with Coastal Zone Management funding where appropriate to the proposed project. Eleven proposals were received. The proposals were ranked based on the criteria included in the RFP: water quality improvement or protection; cost/benefit ratio; local capacity to complete the project; relative value or significance of the water body; and, general quality and thoroughness of the proposal. Based on results of the selection process and available federal grant funding levels, the seven highest ranked watershed plan implementation projects, and the single highest ranked watershed plan development project, were selected to receive funding. The New Hampshire Rivers Council shall perform the following tasks as described in the detailed proposal tilled, Development of a Watershed Management Plan for the Winnicut River, submitted by the New Hampshire Rivers Council, dated November 23, 2014:

Objective 1: Preluninary project planning

Measures of Success: Executed contract between New Hampshire Rivers Council (NHRC) and selected consultant for the development of a watershed management plan for the Winnicut River.

Deliverable 1: List of watershed stakeholders, draft and final versions of the Request for Qualifications (RFQ), rank and review summary, and subcontract.

Task 1: Establish Project Steering Committee (PSC) to guide project management activities. Task 2: Identify consulting firms. Develop and issue RFQ for consultant services to develop the watershed management plan.

Task 3: Establish Selection Committee (SC) to participate in contractor selection activities, evaluate consultant qualifications and select firm. Review RFQs, conduct scoring, interview consultant firms, and select firm.

Task 4: Invite top firm to submit scope and fee to complete the restoration plan and conduct contract negotiation. If an agreement cannot be reached with the top firm, SC will negotiate with the second, highest, ranked firm.

Task 5: Obtain DES approval of subcontract documents. Following DES approval, execute the contract between NHRC and the selected firm.

Task 6: Facilitate project kickoff meeting. Generate watershed stakeholder list, secure venue, and host kickoff meeting.

Objective 2: Evaluate water quality data and modeling data for the watershed and determine assimilative capacity for pollutants of concern

Measures of Success: Pollutants of concern are identified, assimilative capacity is calculated.

Deliverable 2:Documentation for calculations of assimilative capacity for pollutants of concern. Task 7: Gather existing watershed data including water quality, modeling results from previous efforts, and other information as identified. Obtain water quality and modeling data for the watershed from the DES Environmental Monitoring Database and other sources.

Objective 6: Develop costs and authority for watershed plan implementation Measures of Success: Costs, responsible parties, and potential matching contributions for watershed plan implementation are created

#### Deliverable 6: Documentation of costs and authority

Task 22: Develop conceptual cost estimates for implementation actions described in the watershed plan including structural and non-structural pollutant load reduction actions, monitoring, outreach, etc. Estimate the amount of technical and financial assistance needed to implement restoration measures outlined in the plan.

## Method of Payment and Contract Price

Preagreement costs may be reimbursed or counted as matching funds as long as those costs were incurred within the effective period of the federal grant and after State approval of the project. The Grantee must request prior written approval from the State to incur pre-agreement costs. Payments shall be made to the Grantee no more frequently than monthly.

Additional Federal Funds paid under this agreement are from a Grant Agreement to the State from the US Environmental Protection Agency, NPS Implementation Grant under CFDA # 66:460. All applicable requirements, regulations, provisions, terms and conditions of this Federal Grant Agreement are hereby adopted in full force and effect to the relationship between this Department and the grantee. Additionally, the Grantee shall comply with the terms of the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA) by providing DES with their Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number.
