**REQUESTED ACTION**

## EXPLANATION



This federal grant program from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance is designed to fund residential substance abuse therapy programs for adult and juvenile state offenders. This grant program has supported on-going projects including intensive multi-phase substance abuse treatment programs such as Sullivan County's successful treatment and reentry program now being replicated in Merrimack County, as well as a therapeutic community program at the Strafford County Jail. The date extension request for these subgrants will allow these corrections facilities to continue substance abuse treatment programs.

**EXPLANATION**

The Residential Substance Abuse Treatment for State Prisoners (RSAT) Formula Grant Program assists states and units of local government in developing and implementing residential substance abuse treatment programs in state and local correctional and detention facilities in which prisoners are incarcerated for a sufficient period of time to permit substance abuse treatment. This federal grant program from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance is designed to fund residential substance abuse therapy programs for adult and juvenile state offenders. This grant program has supported on-going

projects including intensive, multi-phase substance abuse treatment programs such as Sullivan County's successful treatment and reentry program now being replicated in Merrimack County, as well as a therapeutic community program at the Strafford County Jail.

The Department of Justice issued an RFP for facility-based substance abuse treatment programs to the jail superintendents and the NH Department of Corrections on November 24, 2015. Three applications were received and scored for compliance with the program requirements, sustainability, and competencies in managing grants. All three applicants were awarded funding; approval for grants to the Merrimack County and Sullivan County Corrections facilities are requested in this letter and the Grafton County Department of Corrections was awarded funding at a level below the threshold of \$25,000 for Governor and Executive Council submittal.

In the event that federal funds become no longer available, general funds will not be requested to support this program.
