REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department (NHFGD) to accept and expend Seventy Three Thousand Two Hundred Eight One dollars, \$23,281 from the Department of Environmental Services (DES) and \$50,000 from the Town of Greenland, for the purpose of completing work on the Winnicut River Dam Removal and Fish Passage project, from date of Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2015.

EXPLANATION

The Winnicut River Dam in Greenland, NH, was removed in 2009 to restore fish habitat and improve riverine processes. Due to a hydraulic constriction beneath Route 33, the Project required the installation of a fishway below the Route 33 Bridge to pass diadromous and resident fish species. Although deemed "Substantially Complete," there are a number of outstanding issues with the Project that need to be remedied. NHFGD, owner of the former dam, new fishway, and adjoining property, will continue to work collaboratively with the DES (under a pending Memorandum of Agreement), National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) to evaluate these issues to determine remedies for outstanding and corrective work.

Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) of funding became available as part of the 25% non-federal match monies associated with the original federal funds used towards the project. As the project became "substantially complete" the release of the match monies from Conservation License Plate Grants, through the Town of Greenland (grantee), became available.

Twenty-three thousand two hundred eighty-one dollars (\$23,281) from DES is the result of an action by the Department of Justice to return retainage funds which were released by a bank without authorization and erroneously to the original contractor in the Winnicut Dam project. This unused retainage should have been left in escrow in order to complete the aforementioned work on the project.

General Funds will not be requested to support this project.



REQUESTED ACTIONS

1. Authorize the Department of Environmental Services (DES) to enter into an memorandum of agreement (MOA) with the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department (NHFG) (VC # 177911) in the amount of \$23,281 for the purpose of the completion of work on the Winnicut River Dam Removal and Fish Passage Project (Project) in Greenland, New Hampshire, effective upon Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2018. 100% Rivers/Lakes Mgmt/Protect Funds.
2. Further authorize DES to provide payment of \$23,281 to NHFG for the purpose of the completion of work on the Project upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Rivers/Lakes Mgmt/Protect Funds.



EXPLANATION

Per RSA 487:42, DES created the Rivers Management and Protection Fund. One of the uses for the fund is to "restore, preserve, and maintain the state's rivers." The Winnicut River Dam in Greenland, NH was removed in 2009 to restore habitat and improve river processes. Due to a hydraulic constriction beneath Route 33, the Project required the installation of a fishway below the Route 33 Bridge to pass diadromous and resident fish species. While the project, which was originally funded by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and Natural Resources Conservation Services among other sources, has been deemed substantially complete, there are a number of outstanding issues with the Project that need to be remedied. NHF&G, owner of the former dam, new fishway, and adjoining property, will continue to work collaboratively with the DES and other agencies to evaluate these issues to determine remedies for additional actions.

The purpose of this MOA is to provide a mechanism and funding to complete tasks associated with the Winnicut River Dam Removal Project. These tasks include: study the performance of the fishway and construct modifications to improve fish passage; produce signage to comply with Section 106 requirements; conduct land management activities on NHF&G property near the dam; and facilitate other corrective work.

In the event that other funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this project. The agreement has been approved by the Office of the Attorney General as to form, execution, and content. We respectfully request your approval.
