

REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize New Hampshire Employment Security (NHES) to enter into a retroactive Contract Amendment with SymbioSys Solutions, Inc., Concord, NH, increasing the contract amount by \$257,000.00 from \$14,228,390.00 to \$14,485,390.00, to develop and implement necessary system modifications to enable enhancements to allow for virtual participation in Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment (RESEA) orientations, additional follow up meetings and to enable selfservice scheduling, effective upon Governor and Council approval. The original contract end date of June 30, 2022 has not been changed by this amendment. This contract amendment is paid with 100% Federal funds.

The original contract was approved by the Governor and Council on February 7, 2018 (Item #24) following a competitive bid process. There have been six amendments to the contract to provide modifications, improvements and continued maintenance of the Unemployment Insurance benefit system. Amendments #1 through #6 were approved by Governor and Council on February 6, 2019 (Item #30), March 27, 2019 (Item #29), April 8, 2020 (Item #29), September 11, 2020 (Informational Item #K), January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #EE), and July 14, 2021 (Item #30), respectively.

EXPLANATION

NHES is requesting approval of retroactive Contract Amendment #7 for development and implementation of necessary modifications to the New Hampshire Unemployment Insurance System (NHUIS) to enable virtual meeting capacity for RESEA programs, including orientation and follow up meetings, and to provide self-service scheduling capacity. NHES requested to use a portion of its annual RESEA grant funding in the amount of \$257,000.00 to make these changes. The changes were necessary to allow the RESEA program work to go forward and provide appropriate services to job seekers while NHES Local Offices were still in the initial stages of reopening. Although the contract expiration date is June 30, 2022, the grant funding for this work will lapse on September 30, 2021.

In the event Federal funds become no longer available, General funds will not be requested to support this contract.

This letter represents formal notification that the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) has approved your agency's request to enter into a contract amendment with SymbioSys Solutions, Inc. of Concord, NH as described below and referenced as DoIT No. 2018-049G.

This amendment addresses the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic necessitating enhancements to the system for the Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment (RESEA) program to allow for virtual participation in RESEA orientations and expanded follow up meetings, as well as self-service scheduling.

This amendment increases the price limitation by \$257,000.00, from \$14,228,390.00 to \$14,485,390.00, with no change to the contract completion date, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2022.

A copy of this letter should accompany your Agency's submission to Governor and Executive Council for approval.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY NHUIS MAINTENANCE, SUPPORT AND MODIFICATIONS CONTRACT 2018-01 CONTRACT AMENDMENT #7

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement approved by the Governor and Executive Council on February 7, 2018, Item #24, based upon RFP #2018-01 (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"), SymbioSys Solutions, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Vendor" or "SymbioSys") agreed to supply certain services relating to the maintenance, support and modification of the New Hampshire Unemployment Insurance System (NHUIS) based upon the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement and in consideration of the payment by the Department of Employment Security (hereinafter referred to as "the Department" or "NHES") of certain sums as specified therein;

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #1 dated January 2, 2019 and approved by Governor and Council on February 6, 2019 (Item #30), to provide modifications and improvements to certain reporting functions in NHUIS and to increase the amount of the contract by \$50,800.00, from \$3,320,000.00 to \$3,370,800.00;

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #2 dated March 6, 2019 and approved by Governor and Council on March 27, 2019 (Item #29), to provide enhancements and/or modifications necessary to support common registration and case management across the ES, UI and DW programs consistent with Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) requirements for creation of a "common front door" for workforce agencies and systems in NHUIS, and to increase the amount of the contract by \$200,000.00, from \$3,370,800.00 to \$3,570,800.00;

WHEREAS, said Agreement was further modified by Contract Amendment #3 dated March 26, 2020, and approved by Governor and Council on April 8, 2020 (Item #29), to exercise the option to extend the contract term for a period of two years, from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2022, to allow for continued maintenance and support of NHUIS by the Vendor and to increase the amount of the contract by \$3,479,000.00 from \$3,570,800.00 to \$7,049,800.00;

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, Congress enacted the CARES Act, creating new and expanded benefit programs in connection with the COVID-19 pandemic, including Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC), Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) and Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC), and said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #4 dated August 13, 2020 and approved by the Governor on August 20, 2020 (G & C Informational Item # K, September 11, 2020), to allow the expedited development work for the implementation and payment of FPUC, PUA and PEUC benefits as described above, and to increase the amount of the contract by \$3,560,300.00 from \$7,049,800.00 to \$10,610,100.00;

WHEREAS, on August 8, 2020, the President authorized the Lost Wages Assistance (LWA) Program and directed FEMA to use Stafford Act Disaster Relief Funds to provide supplemental payments in the amount of \$300.00 per week for wages lost due to the pandemic. Said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #5 dated December 9, 2020 and approved by the Governor on December 14, 2020 (G & C Informational Item # EE, January 22, 2021), to allow the expedited development work for the implementation and payment of LWA benefits as described above, and to increase the amount of the contract by \$712,850.00 from \$10,610,100.00 to \$11,322,950.00;

Initial all pages Vendor Initials <u>AR</u> WHEREAS, on August 31, 2020, the US Department of Labor (USDOL) notified states of new requirements to combat fraud in the benefit payment process and made funds available through the filing of Supplemental Budget Requests (SBRs) for such purpose. Said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #5 dated December 9, 2020 and approved by the Governor on December 14, 2020 (G & C Informational Item # EE, January 22, 2021), to allow the expedited development work to strengthen fraud prevention and detection, and to increase the amount of the contract by \$1,215,000.00 from \$11,322,950.00 to \$12,537,950.00;

WHEREAS, on December 30, 2020, the USDOL notified states of the extension and modification of unemployment insurance and federal pandemic-related provisions pursuant to the Continued Assistance for Unemployed Workers Act (CAA), and the availability of additional funding to assist states with the implementation of these new requirements. NHES applied for and has received additional SBR funds in the amount of \$650,000.00;

WHEREAS, on January 15, 2021, the USDOL notified states of additional funding available to further assist with the implementation of new requirements to combat fraud in the benefit payment process in order to safeguard program integrity. NHES applied for and received additional SBR funds in the amount of \$1,215,000.00, of which \$790,440.00 was allocated to this contract amendment;

WHEREAS, on May, 18, 2021, Governor Sununu announced the Summer Stipend Program to provide bonus payments to formerly unemployed workers returning to work and retaining employment for at least eight (8) weeks and directed funds from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act to be used for this purpose. NHES received authorization for \$250,000.00 in CARES Act funds to support the necessary system modifications.

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #6 dated June 28, 2021 and approved by the Governor & Council on July 14, 2021 (Item # 30), to allow for necessary development and implementation work in connection with the CAA program extensions, fraud prevention SBR and Summer Stipend program work, and increasing the amount of the contract by \$1,690,440.00 from \$12,537,950.00 to \$14,228,390.00;

WHEREAS, impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic necessitated certain enhancements to the programming for the Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment (RESEA) program to allow for virtual participation in RESEA orientations and expanded follow up meetings, as well as self-service scheduling. NHES requested and received approval to use a portion of its annual RESEA grant funding in the amount of \$257,000.00 to make these changes. The RESEA program enhancements require continued development work by SymbioSys to implement the necessary changes to NHUIS on or before the funds lapse on 9/30/2021; and

WHEREAS, the Vendor desires to develop said program requirements and the Parties seek to amend the Agreement in keeping with the agreed upon terms;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the covenants and conditions contained in the Agreement and set forth herein, the Parties agree as follows:

The original contract was approved by the Governor and Council on February 7, 2018 (Item #24)following a competitive bid process. There have been five amendments to the contract to provide
modifications, improvements and continued maintenance of the unemployment benefit system
functionality. Amendments #1 through #5 were approved by Governor and Council on February 6,
2019 (Item #30); March 27, 2019 (Item #29), April 8, 2020 (Item #29), September 11, 2020
(Informational Item #K), and on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #EE), respectively.

EXPLANATION

NHES is requesting approval of the attached retroactive Contract Amendment #6 for development and implementation of necessary modifications to the New Hampshire Unemployment Insurance System (NHUIS) in order to enable payments under the Continued Assistance for Unemployed

Workers Act (CAA), to further strengthen fraud prevention/detection in the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance and Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation programs under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020, and to enable payments for the Summer Stipend Program.

Due to the last minute nature of federal program extensions throughout the pandemic and the need to make system modifications and enhancements immediately in order to avoid delays in being able to pay unemployment benefits, the work involved with a portion of this request was required to be started and completed immediately. These necessary system modifications were completed in January 2021 with additional federal funds not being released to states until late March 2021.

Regarding the portion of this request dealing with additional federal funding made available to every state workforce agency to further assist with future proofing state payment systems in order to prevent and detect fraud and identity theft, USDOL-ETA offered this additional funding in the form of a supplemental budget request. NHES submitted the necessary applications and was approved for the supplemental funding. The approved system modifications were initiated in April 1, 2021 and are anticipated to be completed by October 1, 2021.

Lastly, additional CARES funds were made available to support the necessary system modifications to make payments under the state's Summer Stipend Program. The Summer Stipend Program provides payments to formerly unemployed workers returning to work and retaining employment for at least eight weeks. The necessary system modifications were initiated upon the announcement of the program on May 19, 2021 and are anticipated to be completed by July 22, 2021.

In the event Federal funds become no longer available, General funds will not be requested to support this contract.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement approved by the Governor and Executive Council on February 7, 2018, Item #24, based upon RFP #2018-01 (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"), SymbioSys Solutions, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Vendor" or "SymbioSys") agreed to supply certain services relating to the maintenance, support and modification of the New Hampshire Unemployment Insurance System (NHUIS) based upon the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement and in consideration of the payment by the Department of Employment Security (hereinafter referred to as "the Department" or "NHES") of certain sums as specified therein;

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #1 dated January 2, 2019, and approved by Governor and Council on February 6, 2019 (Item #30), to provide modifications and improvements to certain reporting functions in NHUIS and to increase the amount of the contract by \$50,800.00, from \$3,320,000.00 to \$3,370,800.00;

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #2 dated March 6, 2019, and approved by Governor and Council on March 27, 2019 (Item #29), to provide enhancements and/or modifications necessary to support common registration and case management across the ES, UI and DW programs consistent with Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) requirements for creation of a "common front door" for workforce agencies and systems in NHUIS, and to increase the amount of the contract by \$200,000.00, from \$3,370,800.00 to \$3,570,800.00;

Said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #5 dated December 9, 2020, and approved by the Governor on December 14, 2020 (G & C Informational Item # EE, January 22, 2021), to allow the expedited development work to strengthen fraud prevention and detection, and to increase the amount of the contract by \$1,215,000.00 from \$11,322,950.00 to \$12,537,950.00;

Strengthening fraud prevention is essential to program integrity. NHES applied for and has received additional SBR funds in the amount of \$1,215,000.00, of which \$790,440.00 is to support this contract amendment;

WHEREAS, on May, 18, 2021 Governor Summu announced the Summer Stipend Program to provide bonus payments to formerly unemployed workers returning to work and retaining employment for at least eight (8) weeks and directed funds from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act to be used for this purpose. Said program requires expedited development work to implement said requirements and to make payments in a timely manner to eligible individuals. NHES received authorization for \$250,000.00 in CARES Act funds to support the necessary system modifications;

EXPLANATION

The attached retroactive Contract Amendment #5 is for the development and implementation of necessary modifications to the New Hampshire Unemployment Insurance System (NHUIS) in order to enable payments under the President's Lost Wages Assistance Program and to strengthen fraud prevention/detection of benefit payment processes for the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) and Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) programs authorized under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020:

NHUIS is the automated system through which an individual files for unemployment benefits; employers respond to requests for information necessary to determine eligibility for benefits; and NHES staff process and manage the accounts for benefit claims, payments and overpayments. The system is critical to the delivery of much needed benefits to claimants.

The Lost Wages Assistance (LWA) Program was authorized by Presidential Memorandum issued on August 8, 2020 under the Other Needs Assistance Program for Major Disaster Declarations Related to Coronavirus Disease 2019. The LWA Program provided for a temporary supplemental federally funded weekly benefit payment of \$300 to eligible individuals.

Additional federal funds were made available from the United States Department of Homeland Security – Federal Emergency Management Agency (USDHS - FEMA) to cover the cost of system enhancements necessary to make these weekly benefit payments.

The United States Department of Labor – Employment and Training Administration (USDOL-ETA) made additional federal funding available to every state workforce agency to assist with efforts to prevent and detect fraud and identity theft and to recover fraud overpayments associated with the new PUA and PEUC programs. USDOL-ETA offered the additional funding in the form of a supplemental budget request. NHES submitted the necessary applications and was approved for the supplemental funding to support the system modifications necessary to further enhance NHUIS.

The supplemental funds authorized provide for the expansion and improvement of existing integrity functions currently utilized by NHES. New Hampshire has been quite successful with the prevention of pandemic related fraud, particularly identity theft related fraud. These funds will allow NHES to build many of the lessons learned thus far during the pandemic into the benefit system thus making the detection process less manually intensive. InvestiCase, the fraud prevention and detection module within NHUIS, will be further enhanced to provide staff with additional tools to better track, detect, and prevent fraud in both the PUA and PEUC programs. PUA claim-specific screens will also be added to NHUIS to assist with necessary and new data collection for self-employed individuals. Additionally, NHES will be able to coordinate with and participate in the Integrity Data Hub (IDH) operated at no cost to states by the National Association of State Workforce Agencies on behalf of

the USDOL-ETA. IDH is a secure, robust, coordinated platform that allows states to work together to detect and prevent unemployment fraud.

In the event Federal funds become no longer available, General funds will not be requested to support , this contract.

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #1 dated January 2, 2019, and approved by Governor and Council on February 6, 2019 (Item #30), to provide modifications and improvements to certain reporting functions in NHUIS and to increase the amount of the contract by \$50,800.00, from \$3,320,000.00 to \$3,370,800.00;

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by Contract Amendment #2 dated March 6, 2019, and approved by Governor and Council on March 27, 2019 (Item #29), to provide enhancements and/or modifications necessary to support common registration and case management across the ES, UI and DW programs consistent with Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) requirements for creation of a "common front door" for workforce agencies and systems in NHUIS, and to increase the amount of the contract by \$200,000.00, from \$3,370,800.00 to \$3,570,800.00;

WHEREAS, said Agreement was further modified by Contract Amendment #3 dated March 26, 2020, and approved by Governor and Council on April 8, 2020 (Item #29), to exercise the option to extend the contract term for a period of two years, from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2022, to allow for continued maintenance and support of NHUIS by the Vendor and to increase the amount of the contract by \$3,479,000.00 from \$3,570,800.00 to \$7,049,800.00;

Pursuant to RSA 4:45, RSA 21-P:43, and Executive Order 2020-04 as extended by Executive Orders 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2020-10, 2020-14, 2020-15, and 2020-16, and suspension of Manual of Procedures 150, V, A, 3 requirement, Governor Sununu has authorized New Hampshire Employment Security (NHES) to enter into a retroactive Contract Amendment with SymbioSys Solutions, Inc., Concord, NH, increasing the contract amount by \$3,560,300 from \$7,049,800 to \$10,610,100 to develop and implement necessary system modifications to enable the payment of three new federal benefit programs authorized under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020. This contract is paid with 100% Federal funds.

The original contract was approved by the Governor and Council on February 7, 2018 (Item #24) following a competitive bid process. There have been three previous amendments to the contract to provide modifications; improvements and continued maintenance of NHUIS functionality. Amendments #1, #2 and #3 were approved by Governor and Council on February 6, 2019 (Item #30), on March 27, 2019 (Item #29), and on April 8, 2020 (Item #29), respectively.

EXPLANATION

The attached retroactive Contract Amendment #4 is for the development and implementation of necessary modifications to the New Hampshire Unemployment Insurance System (NHUIS) in order to enable payment of the three new federal benefit programs authorized under the CARES Act of 2020. Due to the speed and significance with which the COVID-19 pandemic impacted the NH workforce, NHES was not able to request approval in advance.

NHUIS is the automated system through which an individual files for unemployment benefits; employers respond to requests for information necessary to determine eligibility for benefits; and NHES staff

process and manage the accounts for benefit claims, payments and overpayments. The system is critical to the delivery of much needed benefits to claimants.

Section 2104 of the CARES Act of 2020 provides for a temporary emergency increase in unemployment compensation (UC) benefits, referred to as the Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC) program. This program provides an eligible individual with \$600 per week in addition to the weekly benefit amount he or she receives from certain other UC programs. The additional \$600 payments to eligible individuals each week is 100% federally funded.

Section 2102 of the CARES Act of 2020 provides for additional unemployment assistance to those individuals not eligible under the state UC program. This program is referred to as the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) program and provides an individual not eligible for UC with a minimum of \$168 and a maximum of \$427 weekly benefit amount. The PUA program is 100% federally funded.

Section 2107 of the CARES Act of 2020 provides an additional 13 weeks of unemployment benefits to those eligible individuals who may exhaust their state UC or PUA program benefits. This program is referred to as the Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) program and provides an individual who has exhausted all other benefits with an additional 13 weeks of benefits. The PEUC program is 100% federally funded.

USDOL-ETA made additional federal funding available to state workforce agencies for the implementation of these new programs. USDOL-ETA offered the additional funding in the form of supplemental budget requests. NHES submitted the necessary applications and was approved for the supplemental funding to support the system modifications necessary to administer the new programs. USDOL-ETA recognized that due to unprecedented claim volumes resulting from COVID-19 states would submit requests for funding after-the-fact.

These system modifications have already been undertaken with respect to FPUC, PUA and PEUC.

In the event Federal funds become no longer available, General funds will not be requested to support this contract.

SymbioSys shall ensure that appropriate levels of accurity are implemented and maintained in order to protest the integrity and reliability of NOCUS, its information technology resources, data, and terrices provided based on the accurity requirements defined in Appendix G-2 of the Request for Proposal, which are hereby incorporated. SymbioSys shall provide the State resources, information, and terrices on an origing basis, with the appropriate infrastructure and security controls to around business cantiouity and to safeguard the confidentiality and integrity of State networks, Systems and data.

SymbioSys will use the State Hurvest resource as a version control method for software development.

1.1 Application Security

IT Security involves all functions permining to the securing of State Data and systems through the creation and definition of security policies, procedures and controls covering such areas as identification, authentication and non-repudiation.

1.3 Internal and External System Access

Users and staff members logging into the New Hampshire Unonplayment Insurance System (NHUIS) must go through an authentication process via a secured Lightweight Directory Access Protocol (LDAP) server. No excess is permitted to any systems without the user account and logic receiving proper confirmation from LDAP. Any remote occess by staff would require the uter to not only have to go through the LDAP authentication listed above hat we would also require they are our secure Virtual Private Network (VPM).

Additionally, NMES and State of New Nampakire Department of Information Technology (DolT) policies require a complex user came and password. This policy is outlined in the User Account and Password Policy 8 NMS-08.27.2009-V6 which requires a minimum of a 10 Character password that must contain upper case, lower case, numbers and special characters. This password will have a forced change every 90 days. The system remembers the last 5 passwords, which cannot be used again as a new password. Users have 3 attempts to logic. After 3 failures the account is locked. The most recent version of the Policy shall be provided to SymbioSys upon contract execution.

For the future, DOFF is binking into changing the LDAP Security process with a new method. NHES is currently investigating using Oracle Security and tables.

During baseline testing, each individual script is run to establish a paseline for transaction response time, throughput and other user-based metrics. Usually each business transaction is executed multiple times during a single test run to obtain an average for the user-based metrics required for the performance testing evaluations. It must be noted that changes made to the code after baseline testing is completted will also the results collected to date. Tuning will occur during both the development of the new code and load tening. Tuning is the process whereby the application performance is maximized. This can be the result of making code more efficient during development as well as making tuning potenties changes to the environment.

For infrastructure tuning, parameters will be identified for all components prior to undertaking the bood testing efforts. This should include a list of the variables, their definitions, the default senings, range of exceptable senings and the senings as testing begins. This will permit the team to identify the areas of most potential gain and a starting point. Tuning is a process which is repeated until the team feels that the systems are running at or near optimism performance.

Scheduling Performance and Savers Tenting

SymbioSys shall perform test planning. The steps for planning include identification of application functionality as well as what percentage of normal daily use is represented by each function. This information will become the foundation for scripting so that tests closely represent what foods in production will look like.

SymbioSys* Project Manager and the State Project Manager shall agree upon the Work Plan no-later than ten (10) business days after the Effective Dose. Continued development and management of the Work Plan is a joint effort on the part of SymbioSys and State Project and Business Managers.

1.1 Assumptions

- The State shall provide team members with decision-making turbority to support development and implementation efforts.
- The State shall provide reasonable access to the State personnel as needed to complete project sects.
- . Designated State IT systems personnel shall be available during normal working hours.
- . SymbioSys shall use MARVEST to manage and track work and maintain version control.
- SymbioSys shall conduct monthly status meetings and provide reports that may include but are not familed to action dente, progress reports, that mealts and documentation.

The primary aspects and components of the proposed overall approach to Maintenance & Support of MMUIS are definested below:

1. Project Initiation:

The project will be initiated with a Project loitiation Meeting between the Project Sporaov (PS), the State Project Manager (State PM), the SymbioSys Project Manager (Symb PM), and other State staff identified by the State. The Kick-off macting would conclude with a brief Questions and Arguers (Q&A) component to arguer any high-level questions as well as to obtain high-level feedback relating important tessors bearned by one or more of the meeting participates.

1. Firmbizz Work Plan:

Based on the feedback received from each of the above sessions (the Project Initiation Meeting, the Kickoff meeting, and the Brainstorming session), the SymbioSys Project/Hanager will refine the Overall Approach defined in this section of the proposal, to create a formal Work Plan for the engagement.

The revised Work Plan will be distributed to the NHES Project Manager, and to all stakeholder representatives identified by the NHES Project Manager, for their review and fordback. Two business days (or at an agreed-upon timeframe) after the document is distributed to the reviewers, the document will be jointly reviewed through a structured walkingup session. This approach is an adaptation of the approach that was adopted at the inception of the current engagement, to create a coronnus-based prioritization strategy and plan for addressing all outstanding. Maintenance & Support items.

2. SymbioSys Business Analyst(s) will first review all current open (unassigned) items with the objective of identifying the potential for regrouping; reprioritizing and/or eleating these items. SymbioSys shall warrant that the Software will not contain any viruses, destructive programming, or mechanisms designed to disrupt the performance of the Software in accordance with the Symilications.

SymbioSys shall werrant that all System components, including any replacement or opposited. System Software components provided by SymbioSys to correct Deficiencies or as an Enhancement, shall operate with the rest of the System without loss of any functionality.

SymbioSys shall warrant that all Services provided under the Contract will be provided in a professional number in accordance with industry standards and that Services will comply with performance standards.
