REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Community Based Care Services, Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services to amend an existing Agreement (Purchase Order #1023667) with Androscoggin Valley Home Care Services, Berlin, New Hampshire (Vendor #57347) to provide Adult In home Care services by increasing the number of units of service for Adult Protective Services Adult In-home Care and decreasing the number of Adult In-home Care units of service, to transfer service units within the scope of services that are funded within the same account number and amend the related terms of the contract without further approval from Governor and Executive Council, with no change to the total contract dollars. This amendment shall be effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval. The original Agreement ending June 30, 2013 was approved by Governor and Executive Council on June 22, 2011 (Item #224). Funding is available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2013.

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EXPLANATION

The purpose of this Requested Action is to transfer Adult In Home Care services, within the dollar amount contracted for these services, by increasing the number of Adult Protective Services Adult In-home Care units of service and decreasing the number of Adult In-home Care units due to an increase in Adult Protective Service clients as well as an increase in the level of support needed for these clients. At the same time, the Contractor has experienced a decrease in referrals for non-protective clients. This transfer allows the Contractor to meet the client needs for Adult In-home Care without having to curtail services to protective clients.

Should the Governor and Executive Council determine to not authorize to amend the existing Agreement to transfer Adult In-home Care service units to Adult Protective Services Adult In-home Care, the in home support provided to these Adult Protective Service clients will be reduced to a level that could jeopardize their ability to remain in their home. Adult In Home Care services allow elderly and disabled adults to secure and maintain maximum independence, health, and quality of life that support a goal of the Division of Community Based Care Services to keep individuals in their homes within the community.

The original contract was awarded based on a competitive bid process. A Request for Proposals for social services funded by Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services was posted on the Department of Health and Human Services' web site beginning February 25, 2011 in order to procure direct care services from community vendors. The bid summary is attached.

The Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services established performance measures to determine that services purchased by the State and delivered by the contractor were beneficial to the State and the clients by enabling the clients to remain in their home and community and to remain independent based on the federal sourcing requirements. Data from various sources including, but not limited to, contractor reporting, site reviews, and data available through information technology are utilized to determine if the contractor is meeting the performance measures. The Bureau has determined that this Contractor has performed satisfactorily.

Source of Funds for this amendment: 48.17% Federal and 51.83% General Funds.

In the event that the Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.

This first Amendment to the Adult In-home Care, Elder Abuse Counseling, Health Screening, Home Health Aide, Homemaker and Nursing services contract (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment #1") dated this 29th day of March 2013, is by and between the State of New Hampshire, Department of Health and Human Services (hereinafter referred to as the "State" or "Department") and Androscoggin Valley Home Care Services (hereinafter referred to as "the Contractor"), a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of New Hampshire, with a place of business at 795 Main Street, Berlin, NH 03570.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an agreement (the "Contract") approved by the Governor and Executive Council on June 22, 2011, the Contractor agreed to perform certain services based upon the terms and conditions specified in the Contract as amended and in consideration of certain sums specified; and

WHEREAS, the State and the Contractor have agreed to make changes to the scope of work, payment schedules and terms and conditions of the contract; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the General Provisions, Paragraph 18 of the Agreement; and Exhibit A, Section VII Paragraph 15; the State may modify the payment schedule of the contract by written agreement of the parties; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has requested to transfer units of non-protective Adult Inhome Care to units of Adult Protective Services Adult Inhome Care based on client needs within the service catchment area.

- 13. Notwithstanding paragraph 18 of the P-37 and Exhibit A, Section VII, Paragraph 15, an amendment limited to the terms of Exhibit B, Paragraph #1 Table, to transfer the amount of units from one service to another that are funded within the same account number identified in the original Exhibit B Paragraph 3 and within the price limitation, can be made by written agreement of both parties and may be made without first obtaining approval of Governor and Executive Council.

REQUESTED ACTION

EXPLANATION

The purpose of this Requested Action is to purchase direct care social services that allow the elderly and disabled adults to secure and maintain maximum independence and dignity. Participants receiving Adult In-Home Care, Elder Abuse Counseling, Health Screening, Home Health Aide, Homemaker and Nursing services will be able to remain in their homes and communities and maintain their independence.

A Request for Proposals for social services funded by Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services was posted on Department of Health and Human Services' web site beginning February 25, 2011 in order to procure direct care services from community vendors. In addition, a notice of the release of the Request for Proposals was sent to all existing Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services' contractors, all potential contract providers known by the Bureau, the Home Care Association of New Hampshire, New Hampshire Adult Day Services Association and the liaisons for the Regional Coordination Councils as part of the statewide Community Transportation Regional Coordination System.

Funding for this contract is based on Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services' review of statewide, provider documented client needs as evidenced by State Fiscal Year 2010 and year-to-date State Fiscal Year 2011 contract utilization, quarterly program service reports and information provided in the proposal. This agency submitted a bid to provide Adult In-Home Care, Elder Abuse Counseling, Health Screening, Home Health Aide, Homemaker and Nursing services to eligible individuals in the catchment area identified in this contract and was selected to receive funding for SFY 2012 and 2013 under this contract.

The Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services established a team of reviewers with program and/or financial experience from throughout the Department to review the proposal. See attached Scoring Detail for Criteria, Scores and Reviewers Information.

Should the Governor and Executive Council determine to not authorize this contract, the social services provided to these elderly and/or disabled clients will be reduced, or eliminated, to a level that could jeopardize their ability to remain in their home. Low-income elderly and/or disabled clients are likely to become eligible for more costly long-term care services in traditional nursing homes or community based care programs.

Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services established performance measures to determine that services purchased by the State and delivered by the contractor were beneficial to the State and the client by enabling the client to remain in their home and community and to remain independent based on the federal sourcing requirements. Data from various sources including, but not limited to, contractor reporting, site reviews, and data available through information technology will be utilized to determine if the contractor is meeting the performance measures. Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services expects one hundred percent compliance.

Sources of Funds: 49.39% Federal (Administration on Aging and Social Services Block Grant) and 50.61% General Funds.

In the event that the Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.
