REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Commissioner, to enter into a **Retroactive** amendment to an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting LLP (VC#174776), Concord, NH to complete additional enhanced data analytics for school dashboard, hospital bed tracking, and vaccine administration associated with the COVID-19 response, by increasing the price limitation by \$836,550 from \$7,233,398 to \$8,069,948 with no change to the contract completion date of November 29, 2021, effective retroactive to August 16, 2021 upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Other Funds.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #A); amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L); amended with Governor approval on October 28, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #A), and amended with Governor approval on April 1, 2021, and presented to the Executive Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item #C).

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2022, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

EXPLANATION

This amendment is **Retroactive** because the Department did not have the fully executed contract documents in time for Governor and Executive Council approval to meet the COVID-19 response needs relative to data analytics. This contract was originally competitively bid with a time and materials option to identify hourly rates for specific business intelligence skill sets and roles allowing the department to expand and contract resources as needed to meet multiple projects needs and funding sources to include grant, federal and state general funds.

This amendment is part of the State's strategic response to the COVID-19 pandemic and its effects on the opioid crisis. The Department identified the need to further enhance data integration, data analytics and predictive analytics for the opioid crisis as it relates to COVID-19.

The purpose of this amendment is to improve overall data quality and work to achieve improved transparency and integration of various data sources that were in place for vaccine

administration. The Contractor will provide the State with the necessary resources to bring solutions to the State to move the data clean up and enhancements forward by expanding the integration processes, automating data cleansing, and refining the existing dashboards and complimentary reporting dashboards.

This amendment will provide the necessary professional services to assist in the following nine (9) areas:

- 1) Utilize the State's Enterprise Business Intelligence (EBI) platform and integration tools to bring solutions to the State for moving the data clean up and enhancement of dashboards forward;
- 2) Configure systems to perform automated data cleansing activities through matching identifying information from the NH Immunization Information System (NHIIS) to other vaccine and vaccine administration data sources e.g. VAMS, VINI, Vital Records, DHHS Master Client Index to ensure the accuracy of vaccine administration information;
- 3) Perform automated data cleansing activities by identifying duplicate information based on the multiple data sources and vaccine administration systems.
- 4) Identify the components and data modeling changes necessary to depict the data properly and clearly for public dashboard use;
- 5) Maintain and enhance existing suite of COVID-19 related dashboards and data transformation processes;
- 6) Establish corrective actions to address data quality problems;
- 7) Acquire and integrate new data sources:
- 8) Define or enhance prediction model dashboards and bring to production; and
- 9) Optimize existing data integration and dashboard performance.

This data matching and visualization work and continued expansion of the COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence components and tools will allow for data driven decision-making assistance. As the utilization of the system has grown exponentially over the last two years, and the ability to scale the architecture of the system has been implemented, the Department is positioned to further capitalize on the reporting accuracy and efficiency of the system.

This letter represents formal notification that the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) has approved your agency's request to enter into a Retroactive contract amendment with Deloitte Consulting, of Concord, NH as described below and referenced as DoIT No. 2019-043F.

This contract amendment is for Deloitte Consulting to complete additional enhanced data analytics for the school dashboard, hospital bed tracking and vaccine administration associated with the COVID-19 response.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement approved by Governor and Council, as a result of RFP #2019-043, on May 1, 2019, Item #18, and most recently amended and approved by the Governor on April 1, 2021, RSA 4:45, RSA 21-P:43, and Section 4of Executive Order 2020-04 as extended by Executive Orders 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2020-10, 2020-14, 2020-15, 2020-16, 2020-17, 2020-18, 2020-20, 2020-21, 2020-23, 2020-24, 2020-25, 2021-01, 2021-02, 2021-04, 2021-05, 2021-06, 2021-08, and 2021-10, as presented to the Executive Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item # C), (herein after referred to as the "Agreement"), Deloitte Consulting LLP (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor") agreed to supply certain services upon the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement and in consideration of payment by the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Heath (hereinafter referred to as the "Department"), certain sums as specified therein;

WHEREAS, the Department wishes to make changes to the payment schedule and increase the price limitation;

WHEREAS, The Vendor agrees to provide a software system and associated services for the Department to analyze vaccine administration data and update COVID-19 dashboards with the most up to date and accurate information that the department has This work consists of two (2) primary components: data matching and data visualization.

WHEREAS, The Contractor agrees to implement a scalable COVID-19 Business Intelligence dashboard for the State;

WHEREAS, The Contractor agrees to provide and implement a scalable Opioid Crisis Response Management Business Intelligence dashboard;

WHEREAS, the Department and the Vendor wish to increase the Contract price by \$836,550 to bring the total contract price to \$8,069,948.



7.14 Vaccine Administration Data Matching and Visualization

Scope of Work

The Contractor agrees to provide additional services for SFY 2022 Vaccine Administration Data Matching and Visualization. For these services, the Vendor shall provide the identified staffing to support State-directed work. With Contractor PMO concurrence, the State shall authorize Contractor activities for Services on a weekly basis. Activities shall be prioritized via Jira and Vendor shall produce bi-weekly status reports, including hours incurred with resource burn down. The Contractor shall invoice for actual hours incurred on a monthly basis, not to exceed \$836,550 without an approved change order for the services as set forth in table 1.9. SFY 2022 Vaccine Administration Data Matching and Visualization.

Specific Work Activities Provided by the Vendor shall Include:

- Utilizing a project manager to organize the team and manage the agile project management work as well as operate as a team member in a business analyst capacity to identify business needs, research other states processes and information, bring solutions and recommendation to the team to move the data clean up and enhance dashboards forward.
- Utilizing (ETL Data Leads and Senior Database ETL technicians) Informatica, Oracle and
 Tableau trained individual to configure the system to perform automated data cleansing activities
 by matching names, addresses, date of birth or other identifying information from the NHIIS
 system to other data sources to include VAMS, VINI, Vital Records, DHHS Master Client Index
 or other data sources to create clean information to update the NHIIS with accurate address and
 person level data
- Utilizing (ETL Data Leads and Senior Database ETL technicians) Informatica, Oracle and Tableau trained individual to configure the system to perform automated data cleansing activities by identifying duplicate records that may have disparate data e.g. two records for same name with minor spelling differences or two records with similar addresses but the same everything else but one of the records have 1st dose but no 2nd dose data and the other record having 2nd dose but no 1st dose data. Other combinations of matching records to be identified and combined as appropriate to further clean the data
- Utilizing a data visualization and a user interface designer to work with the department to identify
 what components of the dashboard need to change and the necessary data modeling necessary to
 depict the data properly as well as clearly for public use. This will include identifying and
 resolving data errors, discrepancies and documentation.



- 3) Utilization of the Enterprise Business Intelligence environment to consolidate and integrate vaccine information from multiple systems and create data driven reporting through visualization for internal use for scheduling and vaccine allocations.

Continued expansion of the COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence components and tools will allow for data driven decision-making assistance. As the utilization of the system has grown exponentially over the last year and the ability to scale the architecture of the system has been implemented, the Department is positioned to further capitalize on the reporting accuracy and efficiency of the system.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement approved by Governor and Council, as a result of RFP #2019-043, on May 1, 2019. New Hampshire's COVID-19 vaccination efforts are currently run through a complex network of teams, systems, and processes. This network requires support in multiple areas including general coordination, ad hoc support, data and process standardization, and analytics. This support will increase overall efficiency, improve the accuracy of management and operational reporting, and ultimately assure that NH is delivering vaccines to New Hampshire citizens as quickly as possible and in alignment with its official policies and priorities.

To provide immediate assistance in support of the State's efforts to efficiently administer COVID-19 vaccinations to New Hampshire's citizens, the vendor will establish a cross-departmental working group through which ongoing vaccine analytics will be coordinated. The vendor will also support operations by supplying additional data analysts and process specialists to respond to ad hoc data requests and prepare daily reports. The work of these data analysts will be directed via the working group in accordance with the State's real-time priorities. Pursuant to RSA 4:45, RSA 21-P:43, and Section 4 of Executive Order 2020-04 as extended by Executive Orders 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2020-10, 2020-14, 2020-15, 2020-16, 2020-17, 2020-18, 2020-20, 2020-21, 2020-23, and 2020-24, Governor Sununu has authorized the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Office of the Commissioner, to enter into a Retroactive, Sole Source amendment to an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting LLP (VC#174776), Concord, NH, to complete additional enhanced data analytics for school dashboard, hospital bed tracking, and vaccine administration associated with the COVID-19 response, by increasing the price limitation by \$1,812,350 from \$4,007,463 to \$5,819,813 with no change to the completion date of November 29, 2021, effective retroactive to November 2, 2020. 100% Federal Funds.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #A); and amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L).

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2021, with the authority to adjust budget fine items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

This amendment is Retroactive because DHHS did not have the fully executed contract documents in time for Governor approval to meet the COVID-19 response needs surrounding school re-opening efforts and associated results and trends. This amendment is **Sole Source** because DHHS is adding additional scope beyond that which was contemplated in the original Request for Proposal.

This amendment is part of the State's strategic response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Department identified the need for additional enhanced data analytics for school dashboards, hospital bed tracking, and vaccine administration associated with the COVID-19 response, as well as support for the continued expansion of the infrastructure supporting the dashboards to increase the speed and accuracy of the data being collected and published regarding COVID-19 cases,

dusters, and outbreaks within New Hampshire schools. The current system does not include school level information. The Contractor will provide the State the necessary resources to design and implement a school dashboard as well as trend-based analytics based on other states' learning models, infection rates, and overall transmission of COVID-19.

The purpose of this amendment is to continue the development of a software system and associated services required for DHHS to implement a scalable COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence dashboard that is integrated with and expands upon DHHS' existing enterprise-wide data warehousing and business intelligence infrastructure. As the utilization of the system has grown exponentially over the last several months, the need to scale the architecture of the system has become apparent. This amendment will provide the necessary professional services to assist in the following five (5) areas: 1) continued COVID-19 Data Integration and Visualization to include additional school COVID related dashboards, hospital bed tracking and vaccine dashboards, 2) public migration to cloud systems for scalable architecture, 3) implementation of an internal-facing portal to provide easy access to internal reports and dashboards, 4) implementation of metadata management tool to further ensure compliance with data management, accuracy and security of the data, and 5) Oracle performance tuning to ensure optimal performance of current and future dashboards. In an effort to provide as much transparency to the public as possible. DHHS has been creating and distributing COVID-19 related statistics in chart and table format. The current reporting does not provide hospital bed tracking or vaccine administration dashboards to address the anticipated surge of the COVID-19 virus and the need to track vaccinations throughout New Hampshire. To address this, DHHS and the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) are working to automate reporting by pulling source data into our Enterprise Business Intelligence (EBI) platform.

This ongoing effort will be accelerated and erihanced through the professional services provided through this amendment. The continued expansion of the platform from Opioid data analytics is a realization of the original plan and architectural strategy for using the platform for any data analytics needs in the State. While the expanded development of the data integration and dashboard system will be focused on COVID-19, the infrastructure developed and the data integrated will be fully leveraged to support all the analytical challenges DHHS faces. For example, key elements of the New Hampshire Immunization Information System, Vaccine Management System, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevsion's Vaccine Administration Management System (VAMS), New Hampshire Electronic Disease Surveillance System (NHEDSS), Juvare Emergency Preparedness System, Laboratory Management System (LIMS), Granite Trace (Contact Tracing SalesForce application), national data sets for predictive modeling, and Vital Records information are needed for analysis of the impacts and overall State response to the COVID-19 pandemic. By integrating this data into the DHHS business intelligence infrastructure, the data will then be positioned to meet other analytic needs of the program. Beyond data integration, the Contractor will continue to assist DHHS with implementing high-level analytic tools and continue to leverage the toolsets needed to reinforce agile project management. DHHS maintains, or has access to, multiple systems that compile data on the contact tracing. testing, registration, asset inventory, and a variety of health and social issues that correlate with risk, impact, and trends surrounding COVID-19. These systems organize and support various functional areas in delivering services to the citizens, as well as systems that capture information about the health and well-being of the general public. Additionally, other New Hampshire state agencies and federal partners capture important data related to the COVID-19 pandemic. In aggregate, these systems maintain a large wealth of data.

EXPLANATION

The request is retroactive because the Department did not have the fully executed contract documents in time for Governor and Executive Council approval to prevent the current contract from expiring. On November 4, 2019 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), notified the Department of an extension opportunity from the original deadline of November 29, 2020 to expend the funds to March 29, 2020. Due to the compressed timeframe we were unable to meet the deadline for the November meeting.

The purpose of this request is to expand the professional services to continue the development of a software system and associated services that are required for the Department to implement a scalable Opioid Crisis Response Management Business Intelligence dashboard that is integrated with and expands upon the Department's existing enterprise-wide data warehousing and business intelligence infrastructure. Additional federal funding provided by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (COC) for Opioid Crisis Response the Contractor will be able to complete the transition of maintenance and support to the Department of Information Technology, Additionally this amendment will allow for the completion of technical architecture and final implementation of a public facing Opioid Information Dashboard.

The Department was notified on August 29, 2018 that it had received \$4.0 million in grant-funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to respond to the opioid crisis; all of which must be expended by November 29, 2019. Part of the funding was for data integration and opioid dashboards. This provides the Department with a unique opportunity to organize data into meaningful information, identify actionable uses of information and develop realistic, fact-based, evidence-supported policies and programs, which will allow the Department to accurately focus on how to best address the opioid crisis.

Data related to the opioid crisis, in many respects, presents the largest data management and analysis challenge of any issue faced not just by the Department, but by the State as a whole. While the contracted development of the data integration and dashboard system will be focused on opioids, the infrastructure developed and the data integrated will be fully laveraged to support all the analytical challenges the Department faces. For example, key elements of child welfare data are needed for analysis of opioids, by integrating this data into the Department's business intelligence infrastructure, the data will then be positioned to meet other analytic needs of the program. Disorder data, Child Welfare and Automated Hospital Emergency Department Data (AHEDD) to allow for real-time awareness of overdoses as they relate to the treatment services.

The original agreement, included language in Part 2, Information Technology Provisions, Section 2, Contract Terms, Paragraph 2, that allows the Department to renew the contract for up to one (1) year, subject to the continued availability of funding, satisfactory performance of service, parties written authorization and approval from the Governor and Executive Council. The Department and Contractor are in agreement with renewing services for the remaining one (1) year at this time.

Should the Governor and Executive Council not authorize this request, the Department will miss the unique opportunity to enhance the data and analytic systems that support current needs relative to the opioid crisis, as well as impact future capabilities of the Department's data systems in order to provide holistic analysis of emerging issues, programs, populations and business functions.

EXPLANATION

The purpose of this request is for the development of a software system and associated services that are required for the Department to implement a scalable Opioid Crisis Response Management Business Intelligence dashboard that is integrated with and expands upon the Department's existing enterprise wide data warehousing and business intelligence infrastructure.

The Department was notified on August 29, 2018 that it had received \$4.0 million dollars in grant funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to respond to the opioid crisis, all of which must be expensed by August 30, 2019. Part of the funding was for data integration and opioid dashboards. This provides the Department with a unique opportunity to organize data into meaningful information, identify actionable uses of information and develop realistic fact based, evidence-supported policies and programs, which will allow the Department to accurately focus on how to best address the opioid crisis.

Data related to the opioid-crisis, in many respects, presents the largest data management and analysis challenge of any issue faced not just by the Department, but by the State as a whole. While the contracted development of the data integration and dashboard system will be focused on opioids, the infrastructure developed and the data integrated will be fully leveraged to support all the analytical challenges the Department faces. For example, key elements of child welfare data are needed for analysis of opioids, by integrating this data into the Department's business intelligence infrastructure, the data will then be positioned to meet other analytic needs of the program. Beyond data integration the contractor will assist the Department with implementation of high-level analytic tools in its environment, provide technical training for Department and other agency staff, provide the toolsets needed to implement agile project management, and provide assistance in developing data governance policies and procedures: All these efforts will be applicable to all systems.

The Department maintains, or has access to, multiple systems that compile data on a variety of health and social issues that correlate with risk, progression, misuse and addiction to opioids and resulting health consequences, including overdose deaths. These systems organize and support various functional areas in delivering services to the citizens, as well as systems that capture information about the health and well-being of the general public. Additionally, the integration efforts will be made to maximize the future value of the data for other health issues New Hampshire faces now and in the future.

Detoitte Consulting, LLP was selected for this project through a compatitive bid process. A Request for Proposals/Applications was posted on The Department of Health and Human Services' web site from October 16, 2018 through December 10, 2018. A bidder's conference was held on October 30, 2018. The Department received six (6) proposals/applications. The proposals/applications were reviewed and scored by a team of individuals with program specific knowledge. The review included a thorough discussion of the strengths and weaknesses of the proposals/applications. The Score Summary is attached.

As referenced in the Request for Proposals and in Part 2 – Information Technologies Provisions, Section 2. Contract Term of this contract, the Department has the option to extend contract services for up to one (1) additional year, contingent upon satisfactory delivery of services, available funding, agreement of the parties and approval of the Governor and Executive Council.
