### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to enter into a **Retroactive** amendment to an existing Cooperative Project Agreement with the University of New Hampshire (VC# 177867), Durham, NH, to continue to provide COVID-19 sample testing, by increasing the price limitation by \$361,147 from \$8,182,500 to \$8,543,647 and with no change to the contract completion date of December 31, 2022, effective retroactive to December 22, 2021, upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Federal Funds

The original Agreement was approved by the Governor on December 30, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item H); as amended with Governor approval on March 3, 2021 (Amendment #1), and presented to the Executive Council on April 7, 2021 (Informational Item #J), as amended with Governor approval on June 4, 2021 (Amendment #2), and presented to the Executive Council on June 30, 2021 (Informational Item #N), as amended and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on July 14, 2021 (Amendment #3) (Item 5B), as amended and approved by the Governor and Executive Council on September 15, 2021 (Amendment #4) (Item #8), as amended and approved on December 8, 2021 (Amendment #5) (Item #B), and as amended and approved on December 22, 2021 (Amendment #6) (Item #41A).

Funds are available in the following account for State Fiscal Year 2022, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

### **EXPLANATION**

The purpose of this request is to provide the Contractor with the funding to purchase Wastewater SARS-CoV-2 instrument and supplies to perform wastewater COVID-19 testing at various wastewater treatment facilities in New Hampshire. The Contractor will be responsible for implementing this device within three months of Governor and Executive Council approval.

The prior Amendment #6 added ARPA funds to support COVID-19 sample testing for long-term care facilities. This request is **Retroactive** because on December 22, 2021, the Governor and Executive Council approved Late Item #C, which changed the funding source of the Agreement from ARPA SFRF to CARES CRF. 2 CFR § 200.332 requires the Department to specify the federal funding in the Agreement. Consequently, the change in funding is the only

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part of this that is retroactive, in order to comply with federal requirements and reflect funding source change previously approved.

The Department will continue monitoring services by reviewing the number of COVID-19 samples tested.

Should the Governor and Council not authorize this request, the Department will not be in compliance with CFR 2 CFR § 200.332 and will not have the proper funding source reflected within the Agreement.

### **EXPLANATION**

The purpose of this request is to support testing of specimen samples for COVID-19 from staff at several long-term care facilities. When a long-term care facility is not experiencing an outbreak, testing for COVID-19 occurs one (1) time every other week. However, when a long-term care facility is experiencing an outbreak, staff must be tested for COVID-19 two (2) times per week. Long-term care facilities, statewide, are experiencing outbreaks of COVID-19. The increase in testing necessitates additional funds to support the long-term care facilities.

The University of New Hampshire provides the test collection supplies to the facilities, including swabs, tubes, and mail packaging materials. Once the samples are collected, the University of New Hampshire tests the samples in its laboratory and sends all COVID-19 test results to the Department. Positive results are faxed to the Department the same day. Results are communicated to the facility within seventy-two (72) hours from sample testing.

Should the Governor and Council not authorize this request, these critical laboratory services that support COVID-19 testing at long-term care and other facilities throughout New Hampshire may not continue, resulting in an increased risk of COVID-19 transmission.

### EXPLANATION

The purpose of this request is to support wastewater surveillance for COVID-19. The Contractor will complete COVID-19 biomarker analysis in wastewater samples at select sewer pipe or manhole locations at New Hampshire Hospital. The Contractor will complete wastewater COVID-19 testing to confirm whether there is a COVID-19 outbreak currently in progress in New Hampshire Hospital.

New Hampshire Hospital has used various restrictions to manage the COVID-19 pandemic including eliminating the ability for patients to have independent times out of the unit, limiting the size of groups, eliminating gym and cooking groups as high transmission risk settings, and eliminating visitation by family and friends. Having the ability to detect whether a COVID-19 outbreak is in progress provides assurances that will allow New Hampshire Hospital to remove restrictions more quickly.

The number of individuals served through this agreement, will depend on the trajectory of COVID-19. Through this agreement, the University of New Hampshire may perform up to 6,000 COVID-19 test per week.

The Contractor will complete the processing of the data and provide the supplies and courier to take the test samples from New Hampshire Hospital to the Contractor's laboratory. The Contractor will provide the data results and provide guidance throughout the project.

The Department will monitor contracted services by reviewing the daily data from the wastewater analysis.

As referenced in Exhibit A, Project Period of the original cooperative project agreement, the parties have the option to extend the agreement for up to one (1) additional year, contingent upon satisfactory delivery of services, available funding, agreement of the parties and Governor and Council approval. The Department is not exercising its option to renew at this time.

Should the Governor and Council not authorize this request Wastewater COVID-19 testing will not occur and New Hampshire Hospital may have increased COVID-19 transmission risk and perhaps unnecessary restrictions to an already vulnerable patient population.

This Item is Rotroactive because the funding for this agreement was not received from the Centers for Disease Control for COVID-19 testing until January 14, 2020. Consequently, the funds could not be accepted into the operating budget until after the completion date expired. - 1.6. The Contractor agrees to provide the pre-testing, testing and post-testing functions set forth above for the following testing cycles and estimated test volumes to:
  - 1.6.1. Perform up to 6,000 tests per week, five (5) days per week (Monday through Finday) from the effective date until December 30, 2020; provided, however, that the Department understands that the Contractor will begin by performing 2,000 tests per week and increase capacity as soon as possible to reach 6,000 tests per week.
- 1.7. The Contractor shall provide a single point of contact and designated back up contact for all communications and directives to and from the Department, and shall notify the Department within twenty-four (24) hours if such point of contact must be changed.
- 1.8. - 1.9. Subject matter experts and quality assurance representatives from the Contractor shall participate in weekly calls with subject matter experts from the Division of Public Health Services to provide updates and discuss operational and technical issues.
- 1.10. The Department shall provide courier services to pick up specimens at each of the assisted living or other designated facilities or entities or provide boxes and packaging for the return mailing of specimens that is effective in prevening incidents of specimen vial breakage.

- 2. "Computer Security Incident" shall have the same meaning "Computer Security Incident' in section two (2) of NIST-Publication 800-61, Computer Security Incident Handling Guide, National Institute of Standards and Technology, U.S. Department of Commerce.
- 3. "Confidential Information" or "Confidential Data" means all confidential information disclosed by one party to the other such as all medical, health, financial, public assistance benefits and personal information including without fimiliation. Substance Abuso Treatment Records, Case Rocords, Protected Health Information and Personally Identifiable Information.

Confidential Information also includes any and all information owned or managed by. the State of NH - created; received from or on behalf of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) or accessed in the course of performing contracted services - of which collection, disclosure, protection, and disposition is governed by state or federal law or regulation. This information includes, but its not limited to Protected Health Information (PHI), Personal Information (PI), Personal Financial Information (PFI), Federal Tax Information (FTI), Social Security Numbers (SSN), Payment Card Industry (PCI), and or other sensitive and confidential information.

- 4. "End User means any person or entity (e.g., contractor, contractor's employee, business associate, subcontractor, other downstream user, etc.) that receives DHHS. date or derivative data in accordance with the terms of this Contract.
- 5. "HIPAA" means the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and the regulations promutgated thereunder.
- "Incident" means an act that potentially violates an explicit or implied security policy, which includes extempts (either failed or successful) to gain unauthorized access to a system or its data, unwanted disruption or denial of service, the unauthorized use of a system for the processing or storage of data; and changes to system hardware, formware, or software characteristics without the owner's knowledge, instruction, or consent. Incidents include the toss of data through theft or device misplacement, loss or misplacement of hardcopy documents, and misrouting of physical or electronic

mail, all of which may have the potential to put the data at risk of unauthorized access, use, disclosure, modification or destruction.

- 7. "Open Wireless Network" means any network or segment of a network that is not designated by the State of New Hampshire's Department of Information Technology or delegate as a protected network (designed, tested, and approved, by means of the State; to transmit) will be considered an open network and not adequately secure for the transmitsion of unencrypted PI, PFI, PHI or confidential DHMS data.
- 6. "Personal Information" (or "PI") means information which can be used to distinguish or trace an individual's identity, such as their name, social security number, personal information as defined in New Hampshire RSA 359-C: 19, biometric records, etc., alone, or when combined with other personal or identifying information which is linked or linkable to a specific individual, such as date and place of birth, mother's maiden name, etc.
- "Privacy Rute" shall mean the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information of 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164, promulgated under HIPAA by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- Protected Health Information\* (or PHI\*) has the same meaning as provided in the definition of "Protected Health Information" in the HIPAA Privacy Rule at 45 C.F.R. § 150.103.
- "Security Rule" shall mean the Security Standards for the Protection of Electronic Protected Health Information at 45 C.F.R. Part 164, Subpart C, and amendments thereto.
- 12. "Unsecured Protected Health Information" means Protected Health Information that is not secured by a technology standard that renders Protected Health Information unusable, unreadable, or indeciphemble to unauthorized individuals and is developed or endorsed by a standards developing organization that is accredited by the American National Standards Institute.

#### I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF OHHS AND THE CONTRACTOR.

- · A. Busines's Use and Disclosure of Confidential Information.
  - The Contractor must not use, disclose, maintain or transmit Confidential Information
    except as reasonably necessary as outlined under this Contract. Further, Contractor,
    including but not limited to all its directors, officers, employees and agents, must not
    use, disclose maintain or transmit PHI in any manner that would constitute a violation
    of the Privacy and Security Rule.
  - 2. The Contractor must not disclose any Confidential Information in response to a

request for disclosure on the basis that it is required by law, in response to a subpoene, etc., without first natifying OHHS so that DHHS has an opportunity to consent or object to the disclosure.

- 3. If DHHS notifies the Contractor that DHHS has agreed to be bound by additional restrictions over and above those uses or disclosures or security saleguards of PHI pursuant to the Privacy and Security Rule, the Contractor must be bound by such additional restrictions and must not disclose PHI in violation of such additional restrictions and must abide by any additional security saleguards.
- 4. The Contractor agrees that DHHS Data or derivative data disclosed to an End User must only be used pursuant to the terms of this Contract.
- The Contractor agrees OHHS Data obtained under this Contract shall not be used for any other purposes that are not indicated in this Contract.
- The Contractor agrees to grant access to the date to the authorized representatives of OHHS for the purpose of inspecting to confirm compliance with the terms of this Contract.

#### II. METHODS OF SECURE TRANSMISSION OF DATA

- Application Encryption. If End User is transmitting DHHS data containing Confidential
  Data between applications, the Contractor attests the applications have been
  evaluated by an expert knowledgeable in cyber security and that said application's
  encryption copabilities ensure secure transmission via the internet.
- Computer Disks and Penable Storage Devices. End User may not use computer disks of portable storage devices, such as a thumb drive, as a method of transmitting DHHS data.
- Encrypted Email. End User may only employ email to transmit Confidential Data if email is encrypted and being sent to and being received by email addresses of persons authorized to receive such information.
- Encrypted Web Site. If End User is employing the Web to transmit Confidential Data, the secure socket tayers (SSL) must be used and the web site must be secure. SSL encrypts data transmitted via a Web site.
- File Hosting Services, also known as File Sharing Sites. End User may not use file hosting services, such as Oropbox or Google Cloud Storage, to transmit Confidential Oato.
- Ground Mail Service. End User may only transmit Confidential Data via certified ground mail within the continental U.S. and when sent to a named individual.
- Laptops and PDA, If End User is employing portable devices to transmit Confidential.
   Date and devices must be encrypted and password-protected.
- 8. Open Wireless Networks. End User may not transmit Confidential Data via an open

wheless network. End User must employ a virtual private network (VPN) when remotely transmitting via an open wireless network.

- Remote User Communication, If End User is employing remote communication to access or transmit Confidential Date, a virtual private network (VPN) must be instalted on the End User's mobile device(s) or leptop from which information will be transmitted or accessed.
- 10. SSH File Transfer Protocol (SFTP), also known as Secure File Transfer Protocol, if End User is employing an SFTP to transmit Confidential Data, End User will structure the Folder and access privileges to prevent inappropriate disclosure of information. SFTP folders and sub-folders used for transmitting Confidential Data will be coded for 1 24-hour auto-delation cycle (i.e. Confidential Data will be deleted every 24 hours).
- Wireless Devices. If End User is transmitting Confidential Data via wireless devices, all data must be encrypted to prevent inappropriate disclosure of information.

#### III. RETENTION AND DISPOSITION OF IDENTIFIABLE RECORDS

The Contractor will only retain the data and any derivative of the data for the duration of this Contract. After such time, the Contractor will have 30 days to destroy the data and any derivative in whatever form it may exist unless, otherwise required by law or permitted under this Contract. To this end, the parties must:

#### A. Retention

- The Contractor agrees it will not atore, transfer or process data collected in connection with the services rendered under this Contract outside of the United States. This physical location requirement shall also apply in the implementation of cloud computing, cloud service or cloud storage capabilities, and includes backup data and Disaster Recovery locations.
- The Contractor agrees to ensure proper security manitoring capabilities are in place to detect potential security events that con impact State of NH systems and/or Department confidential information for contractor provided systems.
- The Contractor agrees to provide accurity awareness and education for its End Users in support of protecting Department confidential Information.
- The Contractor agrees to retain all electronic and hard copies of Confidential Data in a secure location and identified in section IV. A.2
- 5. The Contractor agrees Confidential Data stored in a Cloud must be in a FedRAMP/httECH compliant solution and comply with all applicable statutes and regulations regarding the privacy and security. All servers and devices must have currently-supported and hardened operating systems, the latest anti-viral, anti-hacker, anti-spam, anti-spyware, and anti-malware utilities. The environment, as a

whole, must have aggressive intrusion-detection and firewall protection.

The Convector agrees to and ensures its complete cooperation with the State's Chief Information Officer in the detection of any security vutnerability of the hosting infrastructure.

#### B. . Oisposition .

- If the Contractor will maintain any Confidential Information on its systems (or its subcontractor systems), the Contractor will maintain a documented process for securely disposing of such data upon request or contract termination; and will obtain written certification for any State of New Hampshire data destroyed by the Contractor or any subcontractors as a part of ongoing, emergency, and or disaster recovery oporations. When no tonger in use, electronic media containing State of New Hampshire data shall be rendered unrecoverable via a secure wipe program in: accordance with industry-accepted standards for secure detation and media sanitization, or otherwise physically destroying the media (for example, degaussing) as described in NIST Special Publication 800-88. Rev 1, Guidelines for Media Sanitization, National Institute of Standards and Technology, U. S. Department of Commerce. The Contractor will document and certify in writing at time of the data. dostruction, and will provide written certification to the Department upon request. The written certification will include all details necessary to demonstrate data has been properly destroyed and validated. Where applicable, regulatory, and professional standards for retention requirements will be jointly evaluated by the State and Contractor prior to destruction.
- Unless otherwise specified, within thirty (30) days of the termination of this Contract, Contractor agrees to destroy all hard copies of Confidential Data using a secure method such as shredding.
- Unless otherwise specified, within thirty (30) days of the termination of this Contract, Contractor agrees to completely destroy all electronic Confidential Data by means of data erosure, also known as secure data wiping.

#### IV. PROCEDURES FOR SECURITY

- A. Contractor agrees to saleguard the DHHS Data received under this Contract, and any derivative data or files, as follows:
  - The Contractor will maintain proper security controls to protect Department confidential information collected, processed, managed, and/or stored in the delivery of contracted services.
  - 2. The Contractor will maintain policies and procedures to protect Department confidential information throughout the information lifecycle, where applicable (from creation, transformation, use, storage and secure destruction) regardless of the media used to store the data (i.e., tape, disk, paper, etc.).

- The Contractor will maintain appropriate authentication and access controls to contractor systems that collect, transmit, or store Department confidential Information where applicable.
- The Contractor will ensure proper security monitoring capabilities are in place to detect
  potential security events that can impact State of NM systems and/or Department
  confidential information for contractor provided systems.
- The Contractor will provide regular security awareness and education for its End Users in support of protecting Department confidential information.
- 6. If the Contractor will be sub-contracting any core functions of the engagement supporting the services for State of New Hampshire, the Contractor will maintain a program of an internal process or processes that defines specific security expectations, and monitoring compliance to security requirements that at a minimum match those for the Contractor, including breach notification requirements.
- 7. The Contractor will work with the Department to sign and comply with all applicable. State of New Hampshire and Department system access and authorization policies and procedures; systems access forms, and computer use agreements as part of obtaining and maintaining access to any Department system(s): Agreements will be completed and signed by the Contractor and any applicable sub-contractors prior to system access being authorized.
- If the Department dotermines the Controctor is a Business Associate pursuant to 45 CFR 160.103, the Contractor will execute a HIPAA Business Associate Agreement (BAA) with the Department and is responsible for maintaining compliance with the agreement.
- 9. The Contractor will work with the Department at its request to complete a System Management Survey. The purpose of the survey is to enable the Department and Contractor to monitor for any changes in risks, threats, and vulnerabilities that may occur over the life of the Contractor engagement. The survey will be completed annually, or an alternate time frame at the Departments discretion with agreement by the Contractor, or the Department may request the survey be completed when the scope of the engagement between the Department and the Contractor changes.
- 10. The Contractor will not store, knowingly or unknowingly, any State of New Hampshire or Department data offshore or outside the boundaries of the United States unless prior express written consent is obtained from the Information Security Office leadership member within the Department.
- 11. Data Security Breach Liability. In the event of any security breach Contractor chalf make efforts to investigate the causes of the breach, promptly take measures to prevent future breach and minimize any damage or loss resulting from the breach. The State shall recover from the Contractor all costs of response and recovery from

the breach, including but not limited to: credit monitoring services, mailing costs and costs associated with website and telephone call center services necessary due to the breach.

- 12. Contractor must, comply with all applicable statutes and regulations regarding the privacy and security of Confidential Information, and must in all other respects maintain the privacy and security of PI and PHI at a level and acope that is not less than the tevel and acope of requirements applicable to federal agencies, including, but not limited to provisions of the Privacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. § 552a), DHMS Privacy Act Regulations (45 C.F.R. §5b), HIPAA Privacy and Security Rules (45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164) that govern protections for individually identifiable health information and as applicable under State law.
- 13. Contractor agrees to establish and maintain appropriate administrative, technical, and physical saleguards to protect the confidentiality of the Confidential Data and to prevent unauthorized use or access to it. The saleguards must provide a level and acope of security that is not less than the level and acope of security requirements established by the State of New Hampshire, Department of Information Technology, Refer to Vendor Resources/Procurement at https://www.nh.gov/doit/vendor/index.htm for the Department of Information Technology policies, guidelines, standards, and procurement information relating to vendors.
- Contractor agrees to maintain a documented breach notification and incident response process.
- 15. Contractor must restrict access to the Confidential Data obtained under this Contract to only those authorized End Users who need such DHHS Data to perform their official duties in connection with purposes identified in this Contract.
- 16. The Contractor must ensure that all End Users:
  - a Comply with such safeguards as referenced in Section IV A. above, implemented to protect Confidential Information that is furnished by OHHS under this Contract from loss, theft or Inadvertent disclosure.
  - b. Safeguard this information at all times.
  - Ensure that laptops and other electronic devices/media containing PHI, PI, or PFI
    ore encrypted and possword-protected.
  - d. Send emails containing Confidential Information only if encrypted and being sent to and being received by email addresses of persons authorized to receive such Information.

- a. Limit disclosure of the Confidential Information to the extent permitted by law.
- Confidential Information received under this Contract and individually identifiable data derived from DHHS Oata, must be stored in an area that is physically and technologically secure from access by unauthorized persons during duty hours as well as non-duty hours (e.g., door locks, card keys, bromotric identifiers, etc.).
- g. Only authorized End Users may transmit the Confidential Data, including any derivative files containing personally identifiable information, and in all cases, such data must be encrypted at all times when in transit, at rest, or when stored on portable media as required in section IV above.
- h. In all other instances Confidential Data must be maintained, used and disclosed using appropriate safeguards, as determined by a risk-based assessment of the circumstances involved.
- i. Understand that their user credentials (user name and password) must not be shared with anyone. End Users will keep their credential information secure. This applies to credentials used to access the site directly or indirectly through a third party application.

Contractor is responsible for oversight and compliance of their End Users, DHHS reserves the right to conduct ansite inspections to monitor compliance with this Contract, including the privacy and security requirements provided in herein, HIPAA, and other applicable laws and Federal regulations until such time the Confidential Data is disposed of in accordance with this Contract.

#### V. LOSS REPORTING

The Contractor must notify the NH DHHS Information Security via the email address provided in this Exhibit, of any Security Incidents and Breaches immediately, after the Contractor has determined that the aforementioned has occurred and that Confidential Data may have been exposed or compromised.

The Contractor must further handle and report Incidents and Breaches involving PHI in accordance with the agency's documented Incident Handling and Breach Notification procedures and in accordance with 42 C.F.R. §§ 431,300 - 305. In addition to, and notwithstanding, Contractor's compliance with all applicable obligations and procedures, Contractor's procedures must also address how the Contractor with
