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LEGISBRIEF - CIVILITY: DOES IT MATTER?



The current presidential election has shined a light on the lack of civility in the public square. Incivility in the United States has risen to "crisis" levels, according to 70 percent of respondents in the 2016 survey, Civility in America. The last time the survey was conducted, in 2014, 65 percent of respondents felt that incivility was at "crisis" levels in the United States.

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OVERVIEW | CITIZEN ENGAGEMENT

Legislators need to connect with their constituents. Strong connections help legislators keep a pulse on the district, make better policy decisions, solve constituents' problems and gain political allies. NCSL and the Kettering Foundation are working together on the Project on the Legislator/Citizen Connection to learn how legislators are engaging citizens in meaningful and deliberative ways, including holding thoughtful and civil discussions of divisive topics, examining the difficulties and trade-offs of all approaches, and identifying common ground at good solutions. Legislators tell us there are barriers to creating more deliberative interactions with citizens, including a legislator's lack of time, funding, priority, facilitation skills and helpful partners. This project will give them a chance to share ideas on meeting those challenges and creating successful citizen engagement practices.
