




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Welcome to the North

The Northern Powerhouse is the UK government's vision for a super-connected, globally-competitive northern economy with a flourishing private sector and highly-skilled population ready to take its place on the world stage.


The Northern Powerhouse is well known for its world leading creativity and design industries and its heritage of manufacturing know-how is delivering global innovative products.

Supported by high speed rail links, excellent road transport connections, seven international gateway airports and 12 major foreign trading ports the region has great freight, logistics and transport links to all global markets.

The UK has set an ambition of 50GW of offshore wind by 2030, including up to 5GW of floating offshore wind.

It is also home to the N8 research partnership, which includes the Universities of Durham, Newcastle, York, Leeds, Sheffield, Manchester, Liverpool and Lancaster coming together to promote deeper collaboration between universities, business and society, establish innovative research capabilities, programmes of national and international prominence and to drive economic growth by generating income, supporting jobs and new businesses.



From key addresses to advice for your visit, this handy guide has everything you need to know.

What to bring?

- Bring clothes suitable for all weathers, including rain. Across the UK, June temperatures average a daily high of 19 °C (65 °F) and a low of 10 °C (49 °F).
- If touring Ore Catapult, you must bring hard shoes and high-vis jackets. You must sign a non disclosure agreement on arrival.
- Bring suitable luggage that can travel on our coaches. This should be small enough to fit on a coach seat and weigh no more than 20kg. Please note, any hold luggage/large suitcases can be transported via courier but you will not be able to access your items during the day while being on the coach. Please ensure you add a name tag to your suitcase.
- The currency of the UK is Pound Sterling. Please ensure you have exchanged currency for your trip. Credit cards are also widely accepted.
- For electronics, the UK uses a 220v three pin system. Please bring an adaptor suitable for your devices.
- For entry requirement and visas, it is your responsibility to check you are fully prepared to enter the UK. Please check the most recent [travel guidelines](#) and [visa information](#).
- Important: Please bring a print out of the confirmation of your ticket for Global Offshore Wind or have the confirmation email to hand when entering the exhibition.
