Requested Action

Pursuant to RSA 106-B:18, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of State Police, to restore 300.7 hours of sick leave to Sergeant David McCormack, who suffered a line of duty injury and was unable to perform his normal or routine duties from January 1, 2015 through April 20, 2015.

Explanation

On December 31, 2014 Sergeant McCormack was seated in his cruiser following a motor vehicle stop on Interstate 93 in New Hampton. A passing motorist lost control and struck Sergeant McCormack's cruiser causing considerable damage. Sergeant McCormack was transported by ambulance to Speare Memorial Hospital, treated, released, and placed on sick leave. He was eventually cleared for full duty on April 20, 2015. I have determined that Sergeant McCormack suffered a line of duty injury and was unable to perform his duties for the period of January 1, 2015 through April 20, 2015. This resulted in the use of his sick leave.

Sergeant McCormack's convalescent time required the use of 300.7 hours of sick leave that we are seeking authorization to have restored to him.

TITLE VII SHERIFFS, CONSTABLES, AND POLICE OFFICERS

CHAPTER 106-B THE STATE POLICE

Section 106-B:18

106-B:18 Line of Duty Injury. – Any injury, which is due to a hostile or overt act or an act caused by another during the performance of duties which are considered dangerous in nature, received by any state police employee while on assignment, patrol, or duty that requires that the employee be hospitalized or to the extent that the employee is unable to perform normal or routine duties shall not be charged against earned sick leave or annual leave, and during such time the employee shall remain on the payroll. The commissioner of safety shall make the final determination as to whether the injury received is in line of duty and due to a hostile or overt act or an act caused by another during the performance of duties which are considered dangerous in nature, and the commissioner's decision is final, subject to approval of governor and council.
