### REQUESTED ACTION

- 100% Federal funds 1) Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Community Based Care Services, Bureau of Developmental Services, Special Medical Services, Partners In Health Program to hold an organized meeting on May 22, 2014 at the Executive Court Inn and Conference Center for a total conference cost not to exceed \$12,563. The conference is entitled "Children & Families Collaboration 2014". This action will be effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2014. #### **EXPLANATION**

The Partners in Health Program has approved the use of \$12,563 in Federal Funds to support the costs of sponsoring a conference, "Children and Families Collaboration Conference 2014", for invited staff of state and contracted agencies serving children and families with various special health care needs and complex conditions. The purpose of the Special Medical Services/Partners in Health Program is to assist young adults and families of children with chronic health conditions to advocate, access/develop resources, connect with service systems, and build leadership skills and competence to manage the unique challenges involving their own or their children's

chronic health condition through family directed education and support as well as by establishing community infrastructure.

The purpose of this conference is to assure that New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services agencies and their contracted partners are offering families services that are based on current and comprehensive information about the entire network, crossing all agencies serving children and families and promoting greater efficiency within the system by preventing duplication of supports and services. This conference is consistent with building community infrastructure for families and is a response to requests by Partners in Health family caregivers, staff, and providers.

Participating agencies include the Division of Children, Youth, & Families, the Bureau of Behavioral Health, the Office of Medicaid Business and Policy, the Office of Minority Health and Refugee Affairs, the Bureau of Developmental Services, and community based contractors including, but not limited to, New Hampshire Family Voices, Granite State Federation for Families for Children's Mental Health, Parent Information Center, and the New Hampshire chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness. A list of presenters and invited agencies is attached.

In seeking a facility for the event, Special Medical Services/Partners in Health contacted the Courtyard Marriott & Grappone Conference Center, the Holiday Inn, the Southeastern Regional Education Service Center Conference Center, the Radisson, the Mills Falls-Church Landing, the New Hampshire Technical Institute, the Capitol Center for the Arts, and the Executive Court Inn & Conference Center. The Executive Court Inn & Conference Center was the only facility available on the required date. The date of the conference was determined by the availability schedule of presenters and conference support staff. It is anticipated that 200 providers will attend this conference as participants. An itemization of the services to be provided and associated costs is attached.

Should the Governor and Executive Council determine to not authorize this request Special Medical Services/Partners in Health will not be able to convene this conference.

Source of funds: 100% federal funds.

In the event that federal funds become no longer available, general funds will not be requested to support the Partners in Health Program.
