

JAMES MACKAY DHD, MSW

KNEE-WITTMAN LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



Over the course of a career spanning more than six decades, Representative James MacKay has been a tireless advocate for improved access to mental health services. He has dedicated his life to advocacy and service and shows how social workers who are involved in public policy can

help transform our nation into a better place to live.

Rep. MacKay has served in the New Hampshire House of Representatives for 18 years. As a lawmaker, he has been a key supporter of legislation to improve the state's mental health care delivery system. In 2008 Rep. MacKay was selected to chair the New Hampshire Mental Health Commission, which brought together legislators and public and private mental health experts to transform the state's mental system.

The commission issued a report, Fulfilling the Promise: Transforming New Hampshire's Mental Health System. Other reports followed and a decade later, these reports and their recommendations are still being referenced. Prior to being elected as a state legislator, Rep. MacKay served twelve years on the Concord City Council, with four of those as Mayor. In January of 1986, during his tenure as mayor, every student in the U.S. was watching the scheduled launch of the Challenger Space Shuttle with the first Teacher in Space, Christa McAuhffe from Concord. When the Challenger disaster unfolded live on television, Concord was at the epicenter and Mayor MacKay was thrust into the national spotlight. Using his social work skills he spoke to issues of profound grief and loss and in time he was able to move the conversation to healing.

For more than four decades, Rep. MacKay provided direct clinical social work services. He served as the first Director of Community Mental Health, and the first Chairman of the New Hampshire Mental Health Commission. He was the first Chairman of the state office on Aging and he was one of the first social workers in the state to open a private practice. He has served as the NASW New Hampshire Chapter President and has also been NASW New Hampshire Chapter Social Worker of the Year.

Rep. MacKay has a Doctorate degree in Social Work from Union Institute and a master's degree in social work from Boston University.
