REQUESTED ACTION

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to appoint Joshua L. Speicher, Position #9U647 (Appropriation #02-20-200510-2610-013-500132) as an Attorney at a salary level of \$75,000, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or May 8, 2020, whichever is later.

EXPLANATION

Mr. Speicher earned his Bachelor of Arts from Dartmouth College in 2009, and Juris Doctor from Northeastern University School of Law in 2013. He was admitted to the Massachusetts Bar later that year. Following law school graduation, he interned for the Honorable Ralph Gants at the Supreme Judicial Court of Massachusetts. Mr. Speicher tried over 30 jury trials to verdict while serving as an Assistant District Attorney in Essex County, Massachusetts, from 2014 to 2017. Between 2017 and 2019, he was Assistant Corporation Counsel at the City of Boston Law Department litigating cases in state and federal courts; his municipal clients included the Boston Police and Fire Departments, Boston Centers for Youth and Families, and Boston School Department. He spent the past year as a litigation associate at Lawson and Weitzen, LLP, in Boston, where his practice concentrated on environmental law. The New Hampshire Board of Bar Examiners are expected to act on his motion for admission without examination, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 42, XI, on or about May 5, 2020. In light of Mr. Speicher's experience, I am requesting he be appointed as an Attorney at a salary of \$75,000. He will be assigned to the Criminal Bureau as a trial attorney.
