## REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Administrative Services, Division of Plant and Property Management, Plant-Property Administration, to accept and expend a grant from the New Hampshire Department of Energy, in an amount not to exceed \$57,000, for the purpose of supporting the State Energy Manager's office for programs which reduce energy consumption and reduce costs in New Hampshire State buildings. Contingent upon approval of the Department of Energy's memorandum of agreement item, listed on this same meeting agenda, effective upon Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2023. 98% Agency income, 2% Transfer from Other Agency – Federal.

## **EXPLANATION**

A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Department of Energy and the Department of Administrative Services for funding in the amount of \$57,000 to support energy consumption reduction and costs in state buildings is contingent upon Governor and Council approval on July 12, 2022. The funds for fiscal year 2023 will be spent on energy reduction strategies throughout State government as summarized below:

- Class 020 Current Expense funds will be used to cover miscellaneous office supplies and the
  cost of printed educational materials for outreach to state employees including materials for the
  Annual State Energy Conference.
- Class 026 Membership fees will be used for membership in national associations or other associations in support of programs which reduce energy consumption and reduce costs in New Hampshire State buildings.
- Class 048 Contractual Maintenance funds will be used to perform energy saving repairs and projects for state agencies to reduce overall energy expenditures.
- Class 066 Continuing professional education will be used for expenses related to continuing professional education for State employees.
- Class 069 Promotional (Marketing Expenses) funds will be used for expenses related to publicizing energy success stories through printed and other media.
- Class 070 In-State Travel Reimbursement funds will be used to pay mileage and In-State travel costs associated with local conferences.
- Class 080 Out-of-State Travel funds will be used to pay costs associated with energy conferences or seminars that are held Out-of-State.
- Class 103 Contracts for Op Services funds will be used to enter into contracts with vendors that
  provide building automation, energy management, energy consulting, and utility benchmarking

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services. Additionally funds may be used for conference related expenses such as the venue and refreshments.
