
EXPLANATION



ANTIQUES APPRAISAL

Appraised Item:

New Hampshire, Chippendale, Tall-case Clock – Circa 1795

This Chippendale tall-case clock features a brass, weight-driven, eight-day movement and a painted, unsigned dial. The case, which has been refinished, is of maple with pine secondary wood and features an ogee bracket base. The bonnet is a broken-arch pediment type with the pediments terminating in carved pinwheels. The clock face has been restored and the brass finials are reproductions. The clock case door has also been replaced.

The style of the case and the design of the movement suggest a Concord, New Hampshire origin with possibly Timothy Chandler or Levi and Abel Hutchins as clockmakers.

Dimensions: Height – 7 ft. 5 in. Width – 18 ½ in. Depth - 10 ¼ in.
