REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department (NHFG) to enter into a Sole Source Cooperative Project Agreement with the University of New Hampshire (UNH), vendor code 177867, for the purpose of creating the NH Rabbits Reports website in the amount of \$7,640.00, effective upon Governor and Council approval through August 31, 2017. Funding is 100% Other (Wildlife Heritage Foundation Funds).

EXPLANATION

The Wildlife Heritage Foundation of New Hampshire was established to enhance through private financial support the critical conservation programs of Fish and Game. As a New Hampshire nonprofit corporation, recognized as a 501(c)(3) public charity by the Internal Revenue Service, the Foundation was designated as an official nonprofit partner of the Department by the Fish and Game Commission under authority granted through RSA 206:33-c at their August 20, 2008 meeting.

The New Hampshire Fish & Game Department (NHFG) requests to enter into a sole-source cooperative project agreement with the University of New Hampshire (UNH) to complete the NH Rabbit Reports website. NHFG's nongame and endangered wildlife program and UNH were awarded a Wildlife Heritage Foundation Grant for this project. This agreement is offered sole source to UNH because they are a long-standing partner with NHFG in the recovery of the state endangered New England cottontail. UNH also has the expertise with public outreach and volunteer coordination needed to complete the project.

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The website is being created to facilitate communication with the public regarding rabbit species in New Hampshire and to collect data on the location of the species. There are two species of rabbit in New Hampshire, the Eastern cottontail and the New England cottontail; there is also the larger snowshoe hare that inhabits the state. Eastern cottontail is not native to New Hampshire; the New England cottontail has been dwindling in numbers over the last several decades and is currently listed as a state-endangered species. Currently, NH Fish and Game coordinates a comprehensive effort to survey for the presence of New England cottontail rabbits within recovery focus areas; however, less is known about the distribution and relative abundance of eastern cottontails. In some areas in the state, eastern cottontails have replaced New England cottontails as the primary rabbit species. Understanding the relationship between the distributions of the two species is important in order to make informed decisions about where habitat management will be most effective for the recovery of the New England cottontail. This project will also serve as a useful community education tool on the ecology, habitat requirements and conservation of New England cottontail, as state endangered species.

The project fulfills the Department's mission to work in partnership with the public to conserve, manage, and protect wildlife resources; inform and educate the public, and provide the public opportunity to use and appreciate the resource. It works to meet various goals and objectives of the department including: a healthy population of New England cottontail, education and outreach to improve the public's capacity to avoid and/or manage wildlife conflicts, provide understanding to the public to support and take action, and increase opportunities for volunteers to participate in Department activities.

COOPERATIVE PROJECT AGREEMENT

between the

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, FISH AND GAME DEPARTMENT

and the

University of New Hampshire of the UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- A. This Cooperative Project Agreement (hereinafter "Project Agreement") is entered into by the State of New Hampshire, Fish and Game Department, (hereinafter "State"), and the University System of New Hampshire, acting through University of New Hampshire, (hereinafter "Campus"), for the purpose of undertaking a project of mutual interest. This Cooperative Project shall be carried out under the terms and conditions of the Master Agreement for Cooperative Projects between the State of New Hampshire and the University System of New Hampshire dated November 13, 2002, except as may be modified herein.
- B. This Project Agreement and all obligations of the parties hereunder shall become effective on the date the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire approve this Project Agreement ("Effective date") and shall end on 8/31/17. If the provision of services by Campus precedes the Effective date, all services performed by Campus shall be performed at the sole risk of Campus and in the event that this Project Agreement does not become effective, State shall be under no obligation to pay Campus for costs incurred or services performed; however, if this Project Agreement becomes effective, all costs incurred prior to the Effective date that would otherwise be allowable shall be paid under the terms of this Project Agreement.
- C. The work to be performed under the terms of this Project Agreement is described in the proposal identified below and attached to this document as Exhibit A, the content of which is incorporated herein as a part of this Project Agreement.

A. Project Title: H Rabbit Reports Website

B. Project Period: August 1, 2016 - July 31, 2017

- C. Objectives: NH Rabbit Reports, developed through a partnership between UNH Cooperative Extension and NH Fish and Game Department, is a citizen science project that asks participants to collect data and report sightings of rabbit species in New Hampshire. The reporting website will be used to facilitate communication with the public regarding rabbit species in New Hampshire and to collect data on the location of the species. NH Rabbit Reports has three main goals: (1) to contribute to and inform rabbit research in New Hampshire, specifically the distribution of eastern cottontail rabbits, (2) to inform the geographic areas important for future volunteer trainings and survey efforts, and (3) as a tool for community education on the ecology, habitat requirements, and conservation of the state-endangered New England cottontail.
- D. Scope of Work: Staff from UNH Cooperative Extension and NH Fish & Game sought out funding to work with UNH Web and Mobile Development to design and operate a web-based reporting system that allows participants to enter information related to their rabbit sighting. This information includes, but is not limited to, date, time, location, habitat description, behavioral observations, and their personal information. The reporting system will also allow participants to upload a photograph, and will be mobile-friendly. The site will be hosted by the University of New Hampshire. The website will reduce the response effort for biologists responding to calls, especially during the breeding season, and provide a passive learning environment for the public.
- E. Deliverables Schedule: Project proposals and initial conservations regarding the website began in late 2016, with the custom design, website development, and publication targeted to be complete by June 2017.
- F. Budget and Invoicing Instructions: Campus will submit invoices to State on regular Campus invoice forms no more frequently than monthly and no less frequently than quarterly. Invoices will be based on actual project expenses incurred during the invoicing period, and shall show current and cumulative expenses by major cost categories. State will pay Campus within 30 days of receipt of each invoice. Campus will submit its final invoice not later than 60 days after the Project Period end date.
