### **REQUESTED ACTION**

The Department of Natural and Cultural Resources (DNCR), New Hampshire State Library, requests **RETROACTIVE** renewal of a membership with the American Library Association (VC #175432), Chicago, IL in the amount of \$2,728 upon Governor and Executive Council approval for the period of September 1, 2017 through August 31, 2018. **100% Federal Funds**

#### **EXPLANATION**

New Hampshire State Library (State Library) is requesting permission to retroactively renew its membership with the American Library Association (ALA), the oldest and largest library association in the world. The membership provides access to a wide range of tools, toolkits, and other types of library information as well as offers professional support and connections to others in this specialized field. The DNCR's development of new internal procedures for the State Library delayed this action and therefore retroactive approval is needed.

Following is a completed questionnaire developed for organizational dues and membership requests. A copy of the invoice is also attached.

- 1. How long has this organization been in existence and how long has this agency been a member of this organization? The ALA was founded in 1876 during the Centennial Exposition in Philadelphia and the State Library has been a member for most of those years.
- 2. Is there any other organization which provides the same or similar benefits which your agency belongs to? No, the ALA is the only nationwide association for public libraries.
- 3. How many other states belonging to this organization and is your agency the sole New Hampshire state agency that is a member? All libraries are eligible to be members; no other NH State Agency is a member of the ALA.
- 4. How is the dues structure established? The dues are based on organizational structure and the population it serves; divisional memberships are priced separately.
- 5. What benefit does the state receive from participating in this membership? The ALA provides

90R 49 leadership for the development, promotion and improvement of library and information services and the profession of librarianship in order to enhance learning and ensure access to information for all.

- 6. Are training or educational/ research materials included in the membership? If so, is the cost included? Explain in detail. The ALA provides opportunities for the professional development and education of all library staff members and trustees; it promotes continuous, lifelong learning for all people through library and information services. The cost is not included but offered at a reduced rate.
- 7. Is the membership required to receive any federal grants or required in order to receive or participate in licensing or certification exams? Membership is not required to receive any federal grant or to participate in licensing or certification exams.
- 8. Is there any travel included with this membership fee? Explain in detail any travel to include the number of employees involved, the number of trips, destination if known and purposes of membership supported trips. No, travel is not included in the membership fee.
- 9. Which state agency employees are directly involved with this organization? Indicate if they are members, voting members, committee members, and/or officers of the organization. The ALA has over 60,000 members; officers are nominated and elected by members. There are no Library employees directly involved.
- 10. Explain in detail any negative impact to the State if the Agency did not belong to this organization. The State Library would not have a library advocate working on its behalf in Washington, DC.
