EXPLANATION

The Department requests authorization to exceed the 3/12 limitation of said resolution to pay for services incurred in meeting the State's transportation demands. Specific explanations relating to the Department's spending requests are as follows:

Betterment (3039) - 100% Agency Income

Class 400 Increase Construct

Increase Construction by \$2,000,000.00. This increase is necessary to complete the current statewide construction, reconstruction and resurfacing contracts, emergency slope failure and pavement marking.

Seasonal construction would need to halt if emergency funds are not appropriated and could result in additional costs from a contractor claim or the inability to complete this season's work. Further, there could be contractor claims against the Department for failure to make contractual monthly payments on time.
