REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Environmental Services (DES) to accept and expend federal funds of \$51,060 from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) for implementation of the 2014 Project of Special Merit: Soak Up the Rain Great Bay and 2015 Project of Special Merit: Resilient Coastal Communities, effective upon Governor and Council approval through March 31, 2017. 100% Federal Funds. Funding to be budgeted as follows:

EXPLANATION

DES was awarded Projects of Special Merit grants from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to implement and expand the Soak Up the Rain Great Bay program (2014) and Resilient Coastal Communities program (2015). Through partnerships with the University of New Hampshire Cooperative Extension (UNHCE) and the Great Bay Stewards (GBS), Soak up the Rain Great Bay will encourage residential and lot-scale stormwater management, coordinate messaging about stormwater, and provide a way for communities, residents, and environmental professionals to communicate about stormwater, nonpoint source (NPS) pollution, and other coastal water quality issues. Implementation of Soak Up the Rain Great Bay will help to raise the awareness and the acceptance of the shared responsibility for ensuring clean water, and the ease and abundance of opportunities to reduce NPS pollution at the lot scale. This project will also help to build community resilience to climate change related impacts, such as storm frequency and intensity and by promoting infiltration of stormwater on residential properties to reduce flooding risks.

The Resilient Coastal Communities program will advance resiliency and adaptation planning for coastal hazards by integrating tools, research, outreach, and technical assistance. DES will subcontract UNH to perform hydraulic analyses and vulnerability assessments for culverts in ten coastal communities (Newfields, Exeter, Stratham, Greenland, Newington, Rollinsford, Madbury, Dover, Newmarket, and Durham). The overall goal of the culvert modeling is to assess the hydraulic capacity of existing road stream crossings within the watershed as well as their aquatic organism passage attributes for various flows. The results of the culvert assessments and the flood vulnerability mapping will be incorporated by UNH into the web-based NH Coastal viewer. Other project partners, Rockingham Planning Commission (RPC) and Strafford Regional Planning Commission (SRPC), will use the culvert vulnerability assessments as part of their efforts to update the communities' Hazard Mitigation Plans.

DES is requesting authorization to accept and expend \$51,060 in additional funds and to budget these funds as follows:

Class 020 Current Expense – Includes supplies for printing of the New Hampshire Homeowner's Guide to Stormwater Management, Soak Up the Rain field sheets, outreach materials, and training supplies.

Class 041 Audit Set Aside—Increases is necessary since this class is based on a percentage of funds received.

Class 72 Grants – Federal – To fund a cooperative agreement with UNH to perform culvert vulnerability analyses in ten coastal communities and create a new hazard dataset for the web-based Coastal Viewer.

In the event that Federal funds become no longer available, General funds will not be requested to support this program.
