Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM), to accept and expend grant funds from the Department of Safety, Office of the Commissioner, in an amount not to exceed \$35,000.00 for providing a hosted Web-based cellular phone notification system and associated services for HSEM to alert and warn the public of any impending dangers. Effective upon Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2019. Funding source: 100% Agency Income.

This request is to accept and expend a sub-grant from the Department of Safety, Office of the Commissioner, to provide a system that allows the Department of Safety to release emergency messages warning the public of impending danger to cell phone users within geographical areas specified by the Department. 
As noted earlier, the homeland training support equipment must all be applied for and approved by GMU PRIOR to submitting the following for processing:

- Updated quote for purchase (quote cannot be older than 30 days when attaching to requisition)
- Sole Source justification letter (if applicable)
