"Hezekiah Blaisdell came from Amesbury,
Mass., about 1795, and located in the extreme
south part of Sutton near Bradford. He built a
small house of two rooms, such as most people
built at that date, got his farm in good condition,
and then erected a sawmill on his own prem-
ises, after which it was easy for him to build his
large, two-story house, which has been occupied
by his descendants ever since till within a
few years. He was an industrious, useful man,
and accumulated a good property. The
Blaisdells, in all their generations, in Ames-
bury as well as in Sutton, have been known
as very capable, honorable, reliable men
and women."



EXTRACT

The petition of Benjamin Lovercin and others praying that a public highway may be laid out in the town of Sutton described as follows, "from the bridge near Pearly Andrews in Sutton in a northeasterly direction to strike the road leading from Bradford to Sutton south meeting house near the school house in No 1 in said Sutton"

It was ordered by the Court that the Hon. Joshua Darling, Jacob Tuttle, and Joseph Philbrick Esquire be a committee to view the premises, etc

Beginning at a stake and stones the east side of Sucker Brook near Pearly Andrews, thence N 67° E 61 rods on said Pearly Andrews land, thence N 52° E 20 rods, thence N 48° E 60 rods, thence N 32° E 40 rods, thence N 23° E 42 rods, thence N 40° E 12 rods, thence N 44° E 47 rods to the old road about 20 rods westerly of the School House in School District No 1 mentioned in the petition. The above described line is the centre of said road. The width of said road is laid out three rods wide, and the said road is to be opened and made passable by the first day of Nov. A.D. 1823. We further report that we have estimated the damages to the several owners of land on which said road is laid out as follows, to wit, to Pearly Andrews \$25⁰⁰, to Jonathan Johnston \$9⁰⁰, to Seth Russell \$9⁰⁰ and to Aaron Russell \$35⁰⁰, and we do further report that the said town of Sutton pay \$38⁹⁴, the costs due the committee for their services, surveyor and other expenses of laying out said road. taxed as aforesaid at \$38⁹⁴. and cost of Court to be taxed by the court, which report being duly considered and the parties fully heard is accepted, and it is considered and adjudged by the court that the highway therein described (Description repeated) be and it hereby is laid out and established petitioners recover cost of court \$79³⁴ - (damages repeated) etc



In the summer of 1812 the undersigned Selectmen
laid out a road beginning at a large pine tree &
near Enoch Page's field above Ezra Marsalis house
where the road is now laid thence across said Page's
field on a straight line to the easterly line of the
point of land land on the west side of the swamp
and from thence on a straight line to the easterly
end of a ridge of land on which the timber is
now cut out for a road thence on said ridge to
the west end thereof thence on the road as now cut
out to the old road

Likewise from the north east corner of
Jesse Fellows land on the northwesterly side of the line
of lots to land of Jonathan Fellows
