

EXPLANATION

American Public Human Services Association membership dues for the period January 1 through December 31, 2015 are \$14,242.00. Membership is renewed on an annual basis. This item is **retroactive** as a result of positions within the Department being transferred and the submission of this item being inadvertently overlooked.

Participation in the American Public Human Services Association benefits the State of New Hampshire. Approval of this request will enable the State to continue its participation in the Association. The Association is a national bipartisan information and advocacy group representing the needs of human social services. The work of the Association supports the entire range of programs administered by the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services. The Association is a reliable and invaluable source of timely and accurate information on federal programs, federal funding, future directions, and interpretation of proposed laws and rules.

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The Association represents the State before Congress and federal agencies on matters of concern to New Hampshire. With the many changes to federal programs being passed by Congress each year, it is increasingly important to have current information about those changes, their consequences and the potential impact on each state, including our own. The most accurate and readily available information of this type is necessary for the efficient administration of our programs.

1. How long has this organization been in existence and how long has this agency been a member of this organization?

APHSA is a bipartisan, nonprofit organization representing appointed state and local health and human service agency commissioners. APHSA was founded in 1930 as the American Public Welfare Association and changed its name to APHSA in 1997. The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services has been a member since 1990 and the NH Department of Health and Welfare was a member in the years prior to that.

2. Is there any other organization which provides the same or similar benefits which your agency belongs to?

3. How many other state's belonging to this organization and is your agency the sole New Hampshire state agency that is a member?

Agencies from all 50 states are members as well as the District of Columbia and US territories. The Department is the sole New Hampshire agency belonging to the Association. All Divisions and Offices benefit from this membership.

4. How is the dues structure established? (Standard fee for all states, based on population, based on other criteria, etc)

APHSA's dues based on population were reset for 2012 to reflect 2010 census data. The invoice for 2014 included a 2.5% increase approved by the APHSA board. The invoice for 2015 has not increased.

5. What benefit does the state receive from participating in this membership?

APHSA is the only association of the nation's top government human service executives from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the territories—and their key state program managers, plus hundreds of county-level directors of human services throughout the nation—for the exchange of knowledge, data, best practices, policy review and development, networking and advocacy.

6. Are training or educational/ research materials included in the membership? If so, is the cost included? Explain in detail.

Yes. Included in the cost are educational/research materials the Department receives including, but are not limited to, *This Week in Washington*, Legislative Summaries, Policy Papers, Testimonies, E-mail Alerts and Technical Assistance.
