REQUESTED ACTION

Approve The Pier People, LLC's request to perform the following work on Little Harbor in New Castle. File # 2017-03118. This project will not have significant impact on or adversely affect the values of Little Harbor.

Maintenance dredge 2,821 square feet (135.6 cubic yards) of accumulated sediments and rock from under the northerly ends of floating dock walkways A & B in the vicinity of the gangways.

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) imposed the following conditions as part of this approval:

- 1. All work shall be in accordance with plans by Watermark Marine Systems dated September 25, 2017 and revised through January 30, 2019 as received by the NHDES on February 5, 2019.
- 2. No dredging activities shall occur outside the standard dredging window for tidal waters of November 15 to March 15 without prior written approval from the NH Fish & Game, Marine Division.
- 3. No person undertaking any activity shall cause or contribute to, or allow the activity to cause or contribute to, any violations of the surface water quality standards in RSA 485-A and Env-Wq 1700.
- 4. Not less than 5 state business days prior to starting work authorized by this permit, the permittee shall notify the NHDES in writing of the date on which work under this permit is expected to start.
- 5. Appropriate turbidity controls shall be installed prior to construction, shall be maintained during construction such that no turbidity escapes the immediate dredge area, and shall remain until suspended particles have settled and water at the work site has returned to normal clarity.
- 6. All dredged material shall be placed outside of the areas subject to RSA 482-A.
- 7. Dredged material to be stockpiled in uplands shall be dewatered in sedimentation basins lined with siltation and erosion controls, and located outside jurisdiction to prevent water quality degradation.
- 8. Construction equipment shall be inspected daily for leaking fuel, oil, and hydraulic fluid prior to entering surface waters or wetlands or operating in an area where such fluids could reach groundwater, surface waters, or wetlands.
- 9. The permittee's contractor shall maintain appropriate oil/diesel fuel spill kits on site that are readily accessible at all times during construction, and shall train each operator in the use of the kits.
- 10. All refueling of equipment shall occur outside of surface waters or wetlands during construction. Machinery shall be staged and refueled in upland areas only.

EXPLANATION

The NHDES approved this project on March 18, 2019. The NHDES supported its decision with the following findings:

- 1. This is a major impact project per Administrative Rule Env-Wt 303.02(a) Projects in sand dunes, tidal wetlands, or bogs, except for repair of existing structures pursuant to Env-Wt 303.04(v).
- 2. Accumulated sediment in the inter tidal area is causing the floating docks to ground out thereby damaging these and other associated structures and facilities as well as creating a hazard to public safety.
- 3. The applicant has provided evidence which demonstrates that this proposal is the alternative with the least adverse impact to areas and environments under the NHDES' jurisdiction per Env-Wt 302.03.
- 4. The applicant has demonstrated by plan and example that each factor listed in Env-Wt 302.04(a) & (c), Requirements for Application Evaluation, has been considered in the design of the project.
- 5. The application included NH Natural Heritage Bureau (NHB) Datacheck Results Letter NHB17-2930 stating, "It was determined, although there was a NHB record [...] present in the vicinity, we do not expect that it will be impacted by the proposed project."
- 6. In a letter dated August 14, 2019, NH Pease Development Authority, Division of Ports and Harbors, stated, "We examined the proposed site and found that the project will have no negative effect on navigation."
- 7. No comments were received from the New Castle Conservation Commission on the application.
- 8. The NH Division of Historical Resources has reviewed the project and found "No Historic Properties Affected."
- 9. The National Ocean and Atmospheric Administration, National Marine Fisheries Service has reviewed the proposed project and found "this will have minimal impacts to sensitive habitats."
- 10. In accordance with RSA 482-A:8, the NHDES finds that the requirements for a public hearing do not apply as the permitted project is not of substantial public interest, and will not have a significant impact on or adversely affect the values of the estuarine resource, as identified under RSA 482-A:1.

Application file documents are being forwarded to the Governor and the Executive Council in connection with their consideration of this matter pursuant to RSA 482-A:3,II.(a) as it is a major project in public waters of the state.


