Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through September 30, 2019. Funding Source: 100% Federal Funds.

Explanation

This federal grant, awarded by the US Department of Justice under the 2017 Anti-Heroin Task Force Program (AHTF), will assist law enforcement with investigating illicit activities related to the distribution of opioids. New Hampshire continues to experience overdose deaths related to heroin and other illegal opioids comparable to other states with much larger populations. In 2017, New Hampshire had the third highest rate per capita of overdose deaths in the nation. This program utilizes increased enforcement activities, combined with data analysis to improve the effectiveness of law enforcement to investigate, interdict, and reduce the supply of opioids in New Hampshire.

This grant provides for overtime for New Hampshire State Police (NHSP) to participate in community policing initiatives regarding illegal drug trafficking activities by combining efforts with Manchester law enforcement. These funds are also providing overtime for the NHSP Information and Analysis Center (IAC) staff to analyze data and coordinate with applicable local partners regarding effective targeted activities in order to maximize the effectiveness of existing programs by further leveraging investments in these areas.

Since the start of the program in March of 2018 through December 2018, NH State Police has seized 80 grams of heroin, 1,273.2 grams of fentanyl, 376.2 grams of methamphetamine, as well as more than 1,500 grams of other illegal substances and has had 96 related arrests.

A new temporary full-time Senior Management Analyst in the IAC will focus on intelligence gathering and analysis to support and maximize efforts related to these activities. Funds in Class 030, Equipment, are needed to purchase a Universal Forensics Extraction Device (UFED), a mobile x-ray machine, and substance analyzer to be used by the sworn staff.

Funds in Class 40, Indirect Cost, are not budgeted as they are a disallowed cost in the grant.

Funds in Class 41, Audit Funds Set Aside, are not budgeted as they are a disallowed cost in the grant.

Funds in Class 059, Temp Full time, are needed to fund a temporary full-time position (Senior Management Analyst, LG 26) to work out of the IAC.

Funds in Class 060, Benefits, are needed to pay the benefits associated with classes 018 and 059.

The following information is provided in accordance with the Comptroller's instructional memorandum dated September 21, 1981.

- 1) List of personnel involved: One (1) new temporary full-time Senior Management Analyst (LG 26, A000).
- 2) Nature, Need, and Duration: The Senior Management Analyst will be assigned to the Division of State Police, Information and Analysis Center, in an effort to gather and analyze intelligence from enforcement operations. This position will remain as long as federal funds are available.
- 3) Relationship to existing agency programs: This position will be part of the Division of State Police, Information and Analysis Center, to assist with gathering and analyzing intelligence.
- 4) Has a similar program been requested of the legislature and denied? No.
- 5) Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request? Funds were unanticipated at the time the budget was created.
- 6) Can portions of the grant funds be utilized? These funds can only be utilized for the purpose of funding this temporary full-time position.
- 7) Estimate the funds required to continue this position(s): Based upon the 2016-2017 Collective Bargaining Agreement, within the pay scale for A000 37.5 hour wage schedule, the amount needed to fund the Senior Management Analyst (LG 26, Step 6) for one year would be \$63,999.00 for salaries and an additional \$30,908.00 for benefits for a total of \$94,907.00.

In the event that Agency Income funds become no longer available General and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.
