REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Education to enter into a contract with Adrienne Shoemaker, Concord, New Hampshire (vendor code 260840) in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.00 to provide technical assistance, resources and training to school personnel responsible for providing services to New Hampshire students with visual impairments, effective July 1, 2019 or upon Governor & Council approval, whichever is later through June 30, 2021. 100% Federal Funds.

Funds to support this request are anticipated to be available in the account titled Special Ed-Elem/Sec for FY2020 and FY2021, upon the availability and continued appropriation of funds in future operating budget, with the ability to adjust encumbrances between Fiscal Years through the Budget Office without further Governor and Council approval, if needed and justified:

EXPLANATION

The New Hampshire Department of Education is responsible for meeting legislative mandates to provide technical assistance under RSA 186-C III; Ms. Shoemaker will provide the New Hampshire Department of Education, Bureau of Student Support with support regarding the Federal Act to Promote the Education of the Blind; the American Printing House for the Blind Federal Quota Count, the American Printing House for the Blind educational materials, resources and trainings and New Hampshire Accessible Educational Materials; National Instructional Materials Access Standard and the National Center for Universal Design for Learning to promote understanding when dealing with the development of source files for textbooks or when developing the best system for the production and delivery of textbooks and instructional materials to students who are blind or print disabled.

Ms. Shoemaker will provide technical assistance to school districts, providing ongoing face-to-face on-site and statewide coaching to teachers, families and teams regarding the official braille codes transition to Unified English Braille based on the Braille Authority of North America (BANA); as well as coordinate the New Hampshire Vision Teacher Community of Practice, personnel preparation programs and other national organizations such as the National Federation for the Blind; National Accessible Educational Materials; National Instructional Materials Access Standard and the National Instructional Center to promote understanding when dealing with the development of source files for textbooks or when developing the best system for the production and delivery of textbooks and instructional materials to students who are blind or print disabled.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised in the Manchester Union Leader for the period January 30th, January 31st, and February 1st, 2019 and posted on the Department of Education's website. The Department received one (1) proposal from the issuance of the Request for Proposals "New Hampshire Vision Teacher, American Printing House for the Blind APH Scholar."

A review committee consisting of Heidi Clyborne, Education Consultant, Bureau of Student Support, Joanne DeBello, Education Consultant, Bureau of Student Support and Barbara Dauphinais, Program Specialist III, Bureau of Student Support reviewed the proposal received by the deadline. Ms. Shoemaker's proposal met the criteria of the Request for Proposals (Attachment A).

The Department of Education would like to contract with Adrienne Shoemaker as she is a Teacher of Students with Visual Impairments, has many years of experience working with academic Braille students, students with cortical visual impairments and working with students ages 3-21 with and without disabilities. Ms. Shoemaker coordinated with the Braille Authority of North America (BANA), the New Hampshire Association for the Blind (NHAB), and New Hampshire Teachers of Students with Visual Impairments (TVIs) to develop New Hampshire's State Implementation Plan for Unified English Braille (UEB).

In the event Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.

Barbara Dauphinais

Barbara has been with the Department of Education for over 23 years. Barbara is a Program Specialist III within the Bureau of Student Support serves as New Hampshire's Ex Officio Assistant for the American Printing House for the Blind (APH); she oversees the New Hampshire Accessible Educational Materials (NHAEM) program and researches, develops and drafts program policy to comply with state and federal laws pertaining to Special Education programs and New Hampshire Accessible Educational Materials (NHAEM).

Heidi Clyborne

Heidi has been with the Department of Education for 8 months, coming to the Department from Maryland where she was a certified teacher for 18 years, a Special Education IEP Facilitator and Special Education Department Chair. Heidi is the Indicator 13 Coordinator, and is part of the Compliance Improvement Monitoring Team.

Joanne DeBello

Joanne has been a Special Education Teacher for 11 years and Special Education Buildings Coordinator for 5 years. She holds certification in the Wilson Reading Program and was certified in the Orton-Gillingham Multisensory Reading Program, and formally trained in the Reading First Framework for Response to Intervention. Joanne has provided specially designed reading instruction for students with dyslexia and dysgraphia using varied programs such as the Wilson Reading program, the Orton-Gillingham Program, the SRA Reading Program, Lindamood-Bell Reading Program, Read Naturally, and Reading Recovery, in addition to evidenced-based practices. She worked as a private tutor for students with disabilities in the area of basic reading skills inclusive of decoding and encoding deficiencies commensurate with dyslexia and dysgraphia: has been trained through coursework from Mahesh Sharma in his Remedial Math Program for students with dyscalculia from the Center for Teaching and Learning Mathematics. Joanne has provided specially designed math instruction for students with dyscalculia using the Mahesh Sharma Math Program, Base Ten Math, and ETA Cuisenaire, in addition to evidenced-based practices. Joanne worked as a private tutor for students with disabilities in the area of math commensurate with dyscalculia.

2. EMPLOYMENT OF CONTRACTOR/SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED. The State of New Hampshire, acting through the agency identified in block 1.1 ("State"), engages contractor identified in block 1.3 ("Contractor") to perform, and the Contractor shall perform, the work or sale of goods, or both, identified and more particularly described in the attached EXHIBIT A which is incorporated herein by reference ("Services").

3. EFFECTIVE DATE/COMPLETION OF SERVICES.

3.1 Notwithstanding any provision of this Agreement to the contrary, and subject to the approval of the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire, if applicable, this Agreement, and all obligations of the parties hereunder, shall become effective on the date the Governor and Executive Council approve this Agreement as indicated in block 1.18, unless no such approval is required, in which case the Agreement shall become effective on the date the Agreement is signed by the State Agency as shown in block 1.14 ("Effective Date").

3.2 If the Contractor commences the Services prior to the Effective Date, all Services performed by the Contractor prior to the Effective Date shall be performed at the sole risk of the Contractor, and in the event that this Agreement does not become effective, the State shall have no liability to the Contractor, including without limitation, any obligation to pay the Contractor for any costs incurred or Services performed. Contractor must complete all Services by the Completion Date specified in block 1.7.

4. CONDITIONAL NATURE OF AGREEMENT.

Notwithstanding any provision of this Agreement to the contrary, all obligations of the State hereunder, including, without limitation, the continuance of payments hereunder, are contingent upon the availability and continued appropriation of funds, and in no event shall the State be liable for any payments hereunder in excess of such available appropriated funds. In the event of a reduction or termination of appropriated funds, the State shall have the right to withhold payment until such funds become available, if ever, and shall have the right to terminate this Agreement immediately upon giving the Contractor notice of such termination. The State shall not be required to transfer funds from any other account to the Account identified in block 1.6 in the event funds in that Account are reduced or unavailable.

5. CONTRACT PRICE/PRICE LIMITATION/PAYMENT.

5.1 The contract price, method of payment, and terms of payment are identified and more particularly described in EXHIBIT B which is incorporated herein by reference.
5.2 The payment by the State of the contract price shall be the only and the complete reimbursement to the Contractor for all expenses, of whatever nature incurred by the Contractor in the performance hereof, and shall be the only and the complete compensation to the Contractor for the Services. The State shall have no liability to the Contractor other than the contract price.

5.3 The State reserves the right to offset from any amounts otherwise payable to the Contractor under this Agreement those liquidated amounts required or permitted by N.H. RSA 80:7 through RSA 80:7-c or any other provision of law. 5.4 Notwithstanding any provision in this Agreement to the contrary, and notwithstanding unexpected circumstances, in no event shall the total of all payments authorized, or actually made hereunder, exceed the Price Limitation set forth in block 1.8.

6. COMPLIANCE BY CONTRACTOR WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS/ EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY.

6.1 In connection with the performance of the Services, the Contractor shall comply with all statutes, laws, regulations, and orders of federal, state, county or municipal authorities which impose any obligation or duty upon the Contractor, including, but not limited to, civil rights and equal opportunity laws. This may include the requirement to utilize auxiliary aids and services to ensure that persons with communication disabilities, including vision, hearing and speech, can communicate with, receive information from, and convey information to the Contractor. In addition, the Contractor shall comply with all applicable copyright laws. 6.2 During the term of this Agreement, the Contractor shall not discriminate against employees or applicants for employment because of race, color, religion, creed, age, sex, handicap, sexual orientation, or national origin and will take affirmative action to prevent such discrimination. 6.3 If this Agreement is funded in any part by monies of the United States, the Contractor shall comply with all the provisions of Executive Order No. 11246 ("Equal Employment Opportunity"), as supplemented by the regulations of the United States Department of Labor (41 C.F.R. Part 60), and with any rules, regulations and guidelines as the State of New Hampshire or the United States issue to implement these regulations. The Contractor further agrees to permit the State or United States access to any of the Contractor's books, records and accounts for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with all rules, regulations and orders, and the covenants, terms and conditions of this Agreement.

7. PERSONNEL.

7.1 The Contractor shall at its own expense provide all personnel necessary to perform the Services. The Contractor warrants that all personnel engaged in the Services shall be qualified to perform the Services, and shall be properly licensed and otherwise authorized to do so under all applicable laws.

7.2 Unless otherwise authorized in writing, during the term of this Agreement, and for a period of six (6) months after the Completion Date in block 1.7, the Contractor shall not hire, and shall not permit any subcontractor or other person, firm or corporation with whom it is engaged in a combined effort to perform the Services to hire, any person who is a State employee or official, who is materially involved in the procurement, administration or performance of this

Agreement. This provision shall survive termination of this

7.3 The Contracting Officer specified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, shall be the State's representative. In the event of any dispute concerning the interpretation of this Agreement, the Contracting Officer's decision shall be final for the State.

8. EVENT OF DEFAULT/REMEDIES.

- 8.1 Any one or more of the following acts or omissions of the Contractor shall constitute an event of default hereunder ("Event of Default"):
- 8.1.1 failure to perform the Services satisfactorily or on schedule:
- 8.1.2 failure to submit any report required hereunder; and/or 8.1.3 failure to perform any other covenant, term or condition of this Agreement.
- 8.2 Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default, the State may take any one, or more, or all, of the following actions: 8.2.1 give the Contractor a written notice specifying the Event of Default and requiring it to be remedied within, in the absence of a greater or lesser specification of time, thirty (30) days from the date of the notice; and if the Event of Default is not timely remedied, terminate this Agreement, effective two
- (2) days after giving the Contractor notice of termination;
- 8.2.2 give the Contractor a written notice specifying the Event of Default and suspending all payments to be made under this Agreement and ordering that the portion of the contract price which would otherwise accrue to the Contractor during the period from the date of such notice until such time as the State determines that the Contractor has cured the Event of Default shall never be paid to the Contractor;
- 8.2.3 set off against any other obligations the State may owe to the Contractor any damages the State suffers by reason of any Event of Default; and/or
- 8.2.4 treat the Agreement as breached and pursue any of its remedies at law or in equity, or both.

9. DATA/ACCESS/CONFIDENTIALITY/ PRESERVATION.

- 9.1 As used in this Agreement, the word "data" shall mean all information and things developed or obtained during the performance of, or acquired or developed by reason of, this Agreement, including, but not limited to, all studies, reports, files, formulae, surveys, maps, charts, sound recordings, video recordings, pictorial reproductions, drawings, analyses, graphic representations, computer programs, computer printouts, notes, letters, memoranda, papers, and documents, all whether finished or unfinished.
- 9.2 All data and any property which has been received from the State or purchased with funds provided for that purpose under this Agreement, shall be the property of the State, and shall be returned to the State upon demand or upon termination of this Agreement for any reason.
- 9.3 Confidentiality of data shall be governed by N.H. RSA chapter 91-A or other existing law. Disclosure of data requires prior written approval of the State.

10. TERMINATION. In the event of an early termination of this Agreement for any reason other than the completion of the Services, the Contractor shall deliver to the Contracting Officer, not later than fifteen (15) days after the date of termination, a report ("Termination Report") describing in detail all Services performed, and the contract price earned, to and including the date of termination. The form, subject matter, content, and number of copies of the Termination Report shall be identical to those of any Final Report described in the attached EXHIBIT A.

11. CONTRACTOR'S RELATION TO THE STATE. In the performance of this Agreement the Contractor is in all respects an independent contractor, and is neither an agent nor an employee of the State. Neither the Contractor nor any of its officers, employees, agents or members shall have authority to bind the State or receive any benefits, workers' compensation or other emoluments provided by the State to its employees.

12. ASSIGNMENT/DELEGATION/SUBCONTRACTS.

The Contractor shall not assign, or otherwise transfer any interest in this Agreement without the prior written notice and consent of the State. None of the Services shall be subcontracted by the Contractor without the prior written notice and consent of the State.

13. INDEMNIFICATION. The Contractor shall defend. indemnify and hold harmless the State, its officers and employees, from and against any and all losses suffered by the State, its officers and employees, and any and all claims, liabilities or penalties asserted against the State, its officers and employees, by or on behalf of any person, on account of, based or resulting from, arising out of (or which may be claimed to arise out of) the acts or omissions of the Contractor. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein contained shall be deemed to constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the State, which immunity is hereby reserved to the State. This covenant in paragraph 13 shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

14. INSURANCE.

- 14.1 The Contractor shall, at its sole expense, obtain and maintain in force, and shall require any subcontractor or assignee to obtain and maintain in force, the following insurance:
- 14.1.1 comprehensive general liability insurance against all claims of bodily injury, death or property damage, in amounts of not less than \$1,000,000per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate; and
- 14.1.2 special cause of loss coverage form covering all property subject to subparagraph 9.2 herein, in an amount not less than 80% of the whole replacement value of the property. 14.2 The policies described in subparagraph 14.1 herein shall be on policy forms and endorsements approved for use in the State of New Hampshire by the N.H. Department of Insurance, and issued by insurers licensed in the State of New Hampshire.

14.3 The Contractor shall furnish to the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, a certificate(s) of insurance for all insurance required under this Agreement. Contractor shall also furnish to the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, certificate(s) of insurance for all renewal(s) of insurance required under this Agreement no later than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of each of the insurance policies. The certificate(s) of insurance and any renewals thereof shall be attached and are incorporated herein by reference. Each certificate(s) of insurance shall contain a clause requiring the insurer to provide the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, no less than thirty (30) days prior written notice of cancellation or modification of the policy.

15. WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

- 15.1 By signing this agreement, the Contractor agrees, certifies and warrants that the Contractor is in compliance with or exempt from, the requirements of N.H. RSA chapter 281-A ("Workers' Compensation").
- 15.2 To the extent the Contractor is subject to the requirements of N.H. RSA chapter 281-A, Contractor shall maintain, and require any subcontractor or assignee to secure and maintain, payment of Workers' Compensation in connection with activities which the person proposes to undertake pursuant to this Agreement. Contractor shall furnish the Contracting Officer identified in block 1.9, or his or her successor, proof of Workers' Compensation in the manner described in N.H. RSA chapter 281-A and any applicable renewal(s) thereof, which shall be attached and are incorporated herein by reference. The State shall not be responsible for payment of any Workers' Compensation premiums or for any other claim or benefit for Contractor, or any subcontractor or employee of Contractor, which might arise under applicable State of New Hampshire Workers' Compensation laws in connection with the performance of the Services under this Agreement.
- 16. WAIVER OF BREACH. No failure by the State to enforce any provisions hereof after any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of its rights with regard to that Event of Default, or any subsequent Event of Default. No express failure to enforce any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of the right of the State to enforce each and all of the provisions hereof upon any further or other Event of Default on the part of the Contractor.
- **17. NOTICE.** Any notice by a party hereto to the other party shall be deemed to have been duly delivered or given at the time of mailing by certified mail, postage prepaid, in a United States Post Office addressed to the parties at the addresses given in blocks 1.2 and 1.4, herein.
- 18. AMENDMENT. This Agreement may be amended, waived or discharged only by an instrument in writing signed by the parties hereto and only after approval of such amendment, waiver or discharge by the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire unless no

such approval is required under the circumstances pursuant to State law, rule or policy.

19. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT AND TERMS.

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire, and is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns. The wording used in this Agreement is the wording chosen by the parties to express their mutual intent, and no rule of construction shall be applied against or in favor of any party.

- **20. THIRD PARTIES.** The parties hereto do not intend to benefit any third parties and this Agreement shall not be construed to confer any such benefit.
- 21. HEADINGS. The headings throughout the Agreement are for reference purposes only, and the words contained therein shall in no way be held to explain, modify, amplify or aid in the interpretation, construction or meaning of the provisions of this Agreement.
- **22. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.** Additional provisions set forth in the attached EXHIBIT C are incorporated herein by reference.
- 23. SEVERABILITY. In the event any of the provisions of this Agreement are held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be contrary to any state or federal law, the remaining provisions of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect.
- **24. ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This Agreement, which may be executed in a number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, constitutes the entire Agreement and understanding between the parties, and supersedes all prior Agreements and understandings relating hereto.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Adrienne Shoemaker, Teacher of the Visually Impaired, will provide the following services to the New Hampshire Department of Education:

New Hampshire Vision Teacher American Printing House for the Blind APH Scholar

Technical assistance, resources and training to school personnel responsible for providing services to New Hampshire students with visual impairments with regards to the American Printing House for the Federal Act to Promote the Education of the Blind, the National Accessible Instructional Materials Standard and the official braille codes transition to Unified English Braille based on the Braille Authority of North America (BANA).

Provide information and resources to the New Hampshire Vision Teacher Community of Practice and professional development for all educators regarding the Federal Act to Promote the Education of the Blind; the American Printing House for the Blind Federal Quota Count, the American Printing House for the Blind educational materials, the National Accessible Instructional Materials Standard and the official codes transition to Unified English Braille based on the transition Braille Authority of North America (BANA).

Support the Bureau regarding the Federal Act to Promote the Education of the Blind; the American Printing House for the Blind Federal Quota Count, the American Printing House for the Blind educational materials, resources and trainings and New Hampshire Accessible Educational Materials: National Instructional Materials Access Standard and the National Center for Universal Design for Learning to promote understanding when dealing with the variability and barriers for students who are blind and visually impaired and in the development of source files for textbooks or when developing the best system for the production and delivery of textbooks and instructional materials to students who are blind or print disabled.

Technical assistance to districts, providing ongoing face-to-face; on-site, and statewide coaching to teachers, families and teams regarding the official braille codes transition to Unified English Braille based on the Braille Authority of North America (BANA)

Design and provide technical assistance to districts providing ongoing face to face virtual coaching to teachers and families regarding specially designed instruction to meet the unique needs of a child with a disability to ensure access of the child to the general curriculum, so that the child can meet the educational standards within the jurisdiction of the public agency that apply to all children based upon the relevant functional developmental and academic information that is gathered using a variety of assessment tools and strategies.

- Assist the Bureau of Student Support with activities designed to coordinate all phases the American Printing House for the Blind Annual Federal Quota and the National Instructional Materials Standard and the New Hampshire Unified English Braille Project;
- Provide technical assistance to districts regarding revision of policies, procedures and practices that meet federal and/or State guidelines regarding the education for students who are blind and visually impaired;

- c. This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making and entering into this transaction imposed by Section 1352, Title 31 and U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.
- d. 

Rights to Inventions Made Under a Contract, Copy Rights and Confidentiality

Rights to Inventions Made Under a Contract or Agreement

Contracts or agreements for the performance of experimental, developmental, or research work shall provide for the rights of the Federal Government and the recipient in any resulting invention in accordance with 37 CFR part 401, "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements," and any implementing regulations issued by the DOE.

Any discovery or invention that arises during the course of the contract shall be reported to the DOE. The Contractor is required to disclose inventions promptly to the contracting officer (within 2 months) after the inventor discloses it in writing to contractor personnel responsible for patent matters. The awarding agency shall determine how rights in the invention/discovery shall be allocated consistent with "Government Patent Policy" and Title 37 C.F.R. § 401.

Confidentiality

All Written and oral information and materials disclosed or provided by the DOE under this agreement constitutes Confidential Information, regardless of whether such information was provided before or after the date on this agreement or how it was provided.

The Contractor and representatives thereof, acknowledge that by making use of, acquiring or adding to information about matters and data related to this agreement, which are confidential to the DOE and its partners, must remain the exclusive property of the DOE.

Confidential information means all data and information related to the business and operation of the DOE, including but not limited to all school and student data contained in NH Title XV, Education, Chapters 186-200.

Confidential information includes but is not limited to, student and school district data, revenue and cost information, the source code for computer software and hardware products owned in part or in whole by the DOE, financial information, partner information(including the identity of DOE partners), Contractor and supplier information, (including the identity of DOE Contractors and suppliers), and any information that has been marked "confidential" or "proprietary", or with the like designation. During the term of this contract the Contractor agrees to abide by such rules as may be adopted from time to time by the DOE to maintain the security of all confidential information. The Contractor further agrees that it will always regard and preserve as confidential information/data received during the performance of this contract. The Contractor will not use, copy, make notes, or use excerpts of any confidential information, nor will it give, disclose, provide access to, or otherwise make available any confidential information to any person not employed or contracted by the DOE or subcontracted with the Contractor.

Ownership of Intellectual Property

The DOE shall retain ownership of all source data and other intellectual property of the DOE provided to the Contractor in order to complete the services of this agreement. As well the DOE will retain copyright ownership for any and all materials, patents and intellectual property produced, including, but not limited to, brochures, resource directories, protocols, guidelines, posters, or reports. The Contractor shall not reproduce any materials for purposes other than use for the terms under the contract without prior written approval from the DOE.



Exhibit H

Termination

a. Termination for Cause

The DOE may terminate the Contract for cause for reasons including but not limited to the following circumstances:

- Contractor's failure to perform the services as detailed herein and in any modifications to the Contract.
- 2. Contractor's failure to complete the Contract within the timeframe specified herein and in any modifications to the Contract.
- 3. Contractor's failure to comply with any of the material terms of the Contract. If the DOE contemplates termination under the provisions of Subsections a.1., a.2., or a.3 above, the DOE shall issue a written notice of default describing the deficiency. The Contractor shall have five (5) business days to cure such deficiency. In the event the Contractor does not cure such deficiency, the DOE may terminate the Contract without further consideration by issuing a Notice of Termination for Default and may recover compensation for damages. If, after the Notice of Termination for Default has been issued, it is determined that the Contractor was not in default or the termination for default was otherwise improper, the termination shall be deemed to have been a Termination for Convenience.

b. Termination for Convenience

The DOE may terminate the Contract for convenience, in whole or in part, when, for any reason, the DOE determines that such termination is in its best interest. The contract can be terminated due to reasons known to the non-Federal entity, i.e., including but not limited to program changes, changes in state-of-the-art equipment or technology, insufficient funding, etc. The Contract termination is effected by notifying the Contractor, in writing, specifying that all or a portion of the Contract is terminated for convenience and the termination effective date. The Contractor shall be compensated only for work satisfactorily completed prior to the termination of the Contract. The Contractor is not entitled to loss or profit. The amount due to the Contractor is determined by the DOE.

In the event of termination for convenience, the DOE shall be liable to the Contractor only for Contractor's work performed prior to termination.
