Requested Action

Pursuant to the provisions of Administrative Rule 316.13 (a) (5), the Department of Safety, Division of State Police, requests authorization to pay overtime in the amount of \$267,854.00, from class 10 appropriations, to permanent personnel for overtime hours worked for positions that are vacant due to illness, extended leaves of absence, or pending recruitment at Detective Bureau. The \$267,854.00 represents the estimate of additional funds needed for the pay periods covering January 4, 2019 through the end of SFY 2019. Effective upon Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2019. Funding Source: 71.24% Other Funds and 28.76% General Funds.

Explanation

The Department of Safety, Division of State Police, Detective Bureau, requests a transfer from Class 10, Personnel Services, to Class 018, Overtime, in the amount of \$267,854.00, due to higher than expected overtime hours worked on a number of complex and time-sensitive homicides, suspicious deaths, and narcotics investigations during critical vacancies due to sickness, extended leaves of absence, or pending recruitments.

In SFY 2017, the Major Crime Unit responded to 112 calls for service, including 16 full call-outs for 10 homicides and 7 officer-involved shootings. The remainder of the calls for service were other death investigations (29), assaults, violent felonies, sexual assaults, drug/firearms offenses, prison escapes, and miscellaneous outside agency requests for assistance (67). These numbers do not necessary reflect the fact that some cases are more man-power intensive than others and, due to suspect prosecution, must be sustained for a year or longer.

In SFY 2018, the Major Crime Unit responded to 124 calls for service, including 13 full call-outs for 9 homicides and 4 officer-involved shootings. The remainder of the calls for service were other death investigations (16), assaults, violent felonies, sexual assaults, drug/firearms offenses, prison escapes, and miscellaneous outside agency requests for assistance (95). These numbers do not necessary reflect the fact that some cases are more man-power intensive than others and, due to suspect prosecution, must be sustained for a year or longer.

In SFY 2019 to date, the Major Crime Unit responded to 101 calls for service, including 15 full call-outs for 12 homicides and 3 officer-involved shootings. The remainder of the calls for service were other death investigations (15), assaults, violent felonies, sexual assaults, drug/firearms offenses, prison escapes, and miscellaneous outside agency requests for assistance (71). These numbers do not necessary reflect the fact that some cases are more man-power intensive than others and, due to suspect prosecution, must be sustained for a year or longer.

The Department of Safety, Division of State Police, Detective Bureau, spent \$455,295.12 in overtime expenses in SFY 2017 and \$333,295.54 in SFY 2018. Overtime expenses to date for SFY 2019 are \$507,181.71. The above requested action will cover the expenses incurred for SFY 2019 and any additional expenditure for the remainder of SFY 2019, based on the complexity of the homicide cases currently being worked as well as an increase in narcotics investigations.

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This request is made in accordance with applicable law. The A-29 form is attached to support this request.
