


REQUESTED ACTION

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to reappoint Lynda W. Ruel (Position #9U314, Appropriation #02-20-20-200510-2616-500134) as the Director of the Office of Victim/Witness Assistance at a salary level of \$94,039.40 (LG FF, Step 6). Ms. Ruel will be occupying a position for a five-year term effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2023.

EXPLANATION

Ms. Ruel is a resident of Center Tuftonboro and graduated from Springfield College with a Bachelor's Degree in Human Services and a Minor in Criminal Justice. She has more than 25 years of experience serving victims and witnesses of crime in New Hampshire. Prior to joining the Attorney General's Office in 2004, Ms. Ruel was a victim/witness advocate at the University of New Hampshire and a victim/witness specialist for State Police's Major Crime Unit's Family Services Section. She was appointed to her current position as the Director of the Office of Victim/Witness Assistance in 2014. Her salary as the Director is currently \$94,039.40 and will remain the same.  - o Keeping victims informed of all developments, hearings, and changes in the status of their cases.
 - Ensuring that the victims are involved and heard throughout the criminal justice system.
 - o Locating, coordinating, and scheduling witnesses to ensure their availability for appearance and testimony.
 - O Arranging for travel for out-of-state witnesses and prepare witnesses for court testimony. Assist witnesses in obtaining witness fees.
 - O Attending depositions, court hearings, trial, sentence review, and parole hearings to provide support and information to victims, witnesses and their families and to coordinate witnesses.
 - Advising and informing victims of their statutory rights under the New Hampshire Crime Victim Bill of Rights.
 - o Assisting in the preparation of victim impact statements to be used in sentencing.
 - o Assisting in facilitating the return of property being used as evidence.
- Serve as a Certified Instructor at the New Hampshire Police Standards and Recruit Training Academy. Responsible for teaching victim services, death notification, homicide, and sexual assault modules.
- Conduct presentations on the response to homicides in New Hampshire and other topics as requested.
