REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the Department of Education (DOE), to amend an accept and expend item of Federal Funds approved by the Governor pursuant to RSA 21-P;43, RSA 4:45, RSA 4:47, and Executive Order 2020-04 as extended to allow the DOE to modify and reallocate the budget by transferring \$189,389 between classes effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2023. The acceptance of these funds was presented to Fiscal Committee on May 21, 2021 (FIS 21-131) and Governor and Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item #Z). 100 % Federal Funds. (GEER II – CRRSA ACT 2021)

EXPLANATION

Pursuant to RSA 21 -P:43, RSA 4:45, RSA 4:47, and Executive Order 2020-04 as extended, the Governor authorized the DOE to accept and expend these funds for the program. This request seeks to reallocate funding within the program effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2023.

The Department has analyzed expense accounts and based on the current rates of expenditures anticipates the need for a transfer of appropriation in some expense accounts. Since the acceptance of funds, Time and Effort for personnel in certain federal grants has increased resulting in the need for additional salary and benefit appropriations. In addition, the Department needs to improve air handling in its offices at Londergan Hall. Londergan Hall is an old building and has an antiquated heating system and windows that because of their age, cannot be easily operated. The installation of "Mini-split" pumps will bring the building's HVAC up to current standards and allow for air conditioning as well as heating. The Contract for Program Services budget line increase will allow the purchase and installation of the necessary air handling equipment. Those increases will be offset by a decrease in Technology-Software. The Department planned on equipping Zoom Rooms, which when implemented proved to be significantly less in price than anticipated. Additionally, the move to Granite State College allows the Department to use College resources. The net dollar effect is zero.
