Requested Action

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Community Based Care Services, Bureau of Developmental Services, Special Medical Services to pay medical and health related care claims to the following direct health care service agencies on behalf of children with special health care needs in an amount not to exceed \$397,920 in total, effective July 1, 2013, or date of Governor and Executive Council approval, whichever is later, through June 30, 2015. Funds are anticipated to be available in the following accounts in state fiscal years 2014 and 2015 upon availability and continued appropriation of funds in the future operating budgets.

Explanation

The total annual price for state fiscal years 2014 and 2015 is \$198,960, which is unchanged from the state fiscal years 2012 and 2013 level of compensation. These direct health care service agencies provide medically related products, services, or medications not covered by Medicaid or private health insurance.

Special Medical Services provides financial assistance to income eligible parents with children who have special health care needs. Financial assistance may consist of payment for health care and related services. All services are prior authorized based on an individualized plan of care. In order to deliver these essential services, Special

Medical Services works with providers who are willing to provide care and accept payment in accordance with current rules and regulations. The list of direct health care service agency providers represents a five-year retrospective review of those agencies that are expected to, or may, provide services. This is not an expansion of services.

The mission of Special Medical Services is to provide leadership in building and promoting a community based system of services that is family centered, comprehensive, coordinated, and culturally competent. This mission is reflected in the agenda for Healthy People 2020, which also addresses the goal of having service systems for children with special health care needs. Special Medical Services is part of New Hampshire's Title V Program as mandated by the federal Maternal and Child Health Block Grant to the states. Highest priority is placed on developing strategies that integrate public and private health services with education, social services, mental health, and family support services. A major function of Special Medical Services is to allocate resources to support the availability and accessibility of specialized medical and health related services for children with special health care needs.

It is anticipated that 500 children have the potential to be directly served by this request.

Should the Governor and Executive Council determine not to approve this request the Department of Health and Human Services, Bureau of Developmental Services, Special Medical Services would not be able to assist children with special health care needs in obtaining clinically recommended medications, treatments, or equipment that are not otherwise covered by insurance or when they do not have access to insurance.

Area served: statewide.

Source of funds: 30% federal Maternal Child Health Block Grant and 70% general funds.


In the event that federal funds become no longer available, general funds will not be requested to support this program.
