Funds in Class 020, Current Expenses, will be decreased to reallocate appropriations, originally budgeted to purchase supplies, to classes 050 and 060.

Funds in Class 050, Personal Service-Temp/Appoin, will be used to pay additional work hours for the existing Program Specialist III. Hours are being increased from 10 hours a week to 29 ½ hours a week to complete the program's goals by September.

Funds in Class 060, Benefits, will be used to pay benefits associated with the increase in work hours for the existing Program Specialist III.

In the event that Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds and/or Highway funds will not be requested to support this program.

Requested Action

1. Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a VI, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Fire Safety, to retroactively accept and expend federal funds from the US Department of Homeland Security entitled Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program – Fire Prevention and Safety Grant in the amount of \$320,398.00 to protect the health and safety of the public and firefighting personnel against fire and fire-related hazards. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approvals for the period of July 1, 2017 through September 5, 2018. Funding source: 100% Federal Funds.

2. Pursuant to RSA 124:15, contingent on approval of Requested Action # 1, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Fire Safety, to retroactively continue one (1) temporary part-time, class 050 position to support and educate members of the fire service community with their public outreach of fire prevention education and to provide them with the tools to effectively teach their local residents. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approvals for the period of July 1, 2017 through September 5, 2018. Funding source: 100% Federal Funds.

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Explanation

This item is retroactive as the first scheduled Fiscal Committee meeting to authorize the acceptance of funds into the 2018-2019 budget occurs after the beginning of the new biennium. The US Department of Homeland Security has opened a new aspect of the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program entitled Fire Prevention and Safety Grant. This funding requires a 5% match which will be met with in-kind services. The program will extend to the neediest citizens of New Hampshire living in owner-occupied homes. After firefighters and volunteers attend a mandatory training session, they will equip each qualifying home with necessary alarms, will install those alarms onsite, and will educate the residents. The funding is for the purchase of smoke alarms, strobe specialty alarms, battery operated combination smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms, installation tool kits, and for printing educational brochures which will be utilized throughout the State to educate the residents. A fire and life safety education program will include the importance of functioning smoke and CO alarms along with escape and life safety practices.

This temporary part-time Program Specialist III, Labor Grade 23, position is needed to administer and direct the Division's 2015 "Get Alarmed in New Hampshire" Fire Prevention and Safety grant. This position supports, plans, develops, coordinates, and provides materials, training, and maintains documentation of the grant. This position also promotes and publicizes the safety education program, collects and analyzes data, administers the distribution of follow up surveys to homeowners, and provides a detailed report to the Director of Fire Safety regarding the effectiveness of the alarm distribution program.

The funds will be budgeted as follows:

Class 020, Current Expenses – These funds will be used for office supplies and costs associate with creating training materials, creating reports, etc.

Class 037, Technology-Hardware – These funds will be used to ensure the iPad Air 2s with Wi-Fi + Cell Sim32 GB that were already purchased have all the needed components.

Class 039, Telecommunications – These funds will be used for wireless data.

Class 040, Indirect Costs – These funds will be used to pay associated indirect costs.

Class 041, Audit Fund Set Aside – These funds will be used for audit cost.

Class 050, Personal Service-Temp – These funds will be used to pay the salary of the temporary part-time Program Specialist III, Labor Grade 23.

Class 060, Benefits – These funds will be used to pay the benefits associated with the temporary part-time position.

Class 070, In-State Travel Reimbursement – These funds will be used to pay for car fuel for required in-state travel.

The following information is provided in accordance with the comptroller's instructional memorandum dated September 12, 1981.

- 1) *List of personnel involved:* One (1) existing temporary part-time Program Specialist III, Labor Grade 23.
- 2) *Nature, Need, and Duration:* The Program Specialist III is responsible for the technical monitoring of the stages of work and technical performance of the activities. The Program Specialist develops training materials for promotion, education, and installation of the smoke alarms.
- 3) *Relationship to existing agency programs:* None.
- 4) *Has a similar program been requested of the legislature and denied?* No.
- 5) *Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request?* These funds were unanticipated at the time the budget was created.
- 6) *Can portions of the grant funds be utilized?* Grant funds are being utilized for this position.
- 7) *Estimate the funds required to continue this position:* Funds for this position are estimated at \$22,137.00 for the duration of the project.

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Highway Funds or General Funds will not be used should Federal Funds become unavailable.
