REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, Division of the Arts, to award a Partnership Initiative Grant to the New Hampshire Learning Initiative, Inc. (VC #299943), Hampton, NH in the amount of \$27,000 for the New Hampshire Poetry Out Loud High School Recitation Program effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2020. 100% Federal Funds

EXPLANATION

The New Hampshire Learning Institute, in partnership with the NH State Council on the Arts, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the Poetry Foundation, is sponsoring the 2020 State of New Hampshire Poetry Out Loud National Recitation Program (NH POL). Since its inception, the NH POL program has worked with a non-profit Fiscal Agent through a partnership model. Pursuant to State of New Hampshire requirements for an open bid process, a Request for Proposal for a Fiscal Agent was issued to non-profit arts organizations for the 2020 NH POL Program and it was posted to our website. The New Hampshire Learning Institute was the sole bidder.

New Hampshire has experienced growth in participation each year. Due to an increase in enrollment, four regional finals are held at Rochester Opera House, New England College, Currier Museum of Art, and Winnipesaukee Playhouse, and the State finals are held in the Representative's Hall at the State House. This program encourages New Hampshire youth to learn about great poetry through memorization and performance. The NH POL uses a pyramid structure that begins at the classroom level. Winners advance to the school-wide competition, then to the State competition, and ultimately to the National Finals. This exciting program helps students master public speaking skills, build self-confidence, and learn about their literary heritage.

The Attorney General's office has approved the agreement as to form, substance and execution.

- The Grantee agrees to abide by the limitations, conditions and procedure outlined herein and in the attached appendices. If appropriated funds for this grants program are reduced or terminated, all payments under this grant may cease. That determination rests within the sole discretion of the Council.
- 3. PAYMENT will be made following the receipt and execution of all required documents and approval of the Governor and Executive Council
- 4. FINAL REPORT: The Grantee agrees to submit a final financial and narrative report on a form provided by the Council no more than 30 days after the end of the grant period. Failure to submit the final report will render the Grantee ineligible for Council funding for two years.
- 5. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY: No provision of this contract is to be deemed a waiver of sovereign immunity by the State of New Hampshire.




