REQUESTED ACTION

EXPLANATION

This request will allow the Department to meet Maintenance of Effort (MOE) in order to remain eligible to receive funding under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (Perkins IV). Perkins IV requires states provide financial support to career and technical education (CTE) programs at a level that is at least equal to the amount of support the state provided the previous year (Title III.A. (b)(1)(B)). If state support drops below the level of the preceding year, the entire Perkins award for the second year may be withheld. The actual transfer amount will be finalized by April 30, 2019, and again by May 30, 2019 if needed; to be approved for transfer by the Department of Administrative Services, Bureau of Accounts.

New Hampshire's delivery model for CTE, through regional centers, relies on tuition and transportation (T&T) reimbursements to level the playing field for sending schools and their CTE students. FY19's appropriation for T&T is \$7,400,000, but total requests for T&T reimbursement are expected to be more than \$9,000,000. Increasing T&T funding would be very well received by the CTE community.

The Department's FY19 appropriation includes enough financial support for MOE, but actual spending has not kept pace with budgeted spending, specifically in the areas of Personal Services and Benefits.

The State has a keen interest in hitting MOE in order to continue receiving Perkins grant funds and the CTE community would make excellent use of increased tuition and transportation reimbursement funding. This

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requested action to transfer funds in and among accounting units within the Department would achieve both goals without any additional State spending.

The following appropriation authorities are being requested:

AU 6030, Class 010 - Personal Ser Perm - Appropriation available due to delays in filling positions.

AU 6030, Class 060 - Benefits - Appropriation available due to delays in filling positions.

AU 5137, Class 600 – Tuition and Transportation – Additional appropriation needed to support reimbursement requests.

The following is the information specifically required when transfers are requested, in accordance with the Budget Officer's instructional memorandum dated April 17, 1985, to support the above requested actions.

A. Justification:

This transfer of funds in and among accounting units will ensure New Hampshire meets its Perkins IV maintenance of effort state spending requirement and will increase the funds available for career and technical education tuition and transportation reimbursement.

- B. Does this transfer involve continuing programs or one-time projects? This transfer involves continuing programs.
- C. Is this transfer required to maintain existing program levels or will increase the program level? This transfer maintains existing program levels.

 The Department expects to lapse some funds, whether this transfer is approved or not.
- H. Are personnel services involved?

Yes. Some positions were vacant for a portion of the fiscal year resulting in lower than expected spending. Funds will be transferred from personal services and benefits lines to the tuition and transportation line.
