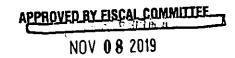

#### Requested Action

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-A VI, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Fire Standards and Training and Emergency Medical Services, accept and expend funds from the second year and first year carry over funds of a Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) grant, entitled First Responder Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery grant, in the amount of \$136,637.00 for continuation of a Mobile Integrated Healthcare program supporting first responder follow-up visits and associated training programs for first responders, at-risk individuals, and communities with the goal of reducing opioid overdoses and fatalities and connecting individuals to available treatment and recovery programs. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approvals through September 30, 2020. Funding source: 100% Federal Funds.

#### Explanation

This request accepts remaining grant funds for the SFY20/21 budgeted FIRST Program, which is designed to reduce opioid overdoses and fatalities across the State by utilizing specially trained first responders to connect at-risk individuals with treatment and recovery programs; for training at-risk individuals and their support systems on overdose emergency care including the use of naloxone; and for increasing the number of first responders who can administer naloxone. The FIRST program links at-risk individuals to recovery programs including Doorway operated by the NH Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). Local first responders may participate in this voluntary program through an application process designed to encourage locally designed programs to meet specific community resources and needs.

Outreach efforts and feedback from local responders revealed that Fire/EMS agencies in key areas of the state are interested in NH Project FIRST, but are unable to partake in the program because they do not have the first responder resources to conduct follow-up visits. This finding presents gaps in program reach to key areas in the state, specifically Coos, Sullivan, Grafton, and Cheshire counties. In response to local community needs, program staff developed a Naloxone Leave Behind initiative, which is a component of NH Project FIRST for communities that cannot implement the full follow-up visit program. The Naloxone Leave Behind initiative, identified by the CDC as an evidenced based strategy to prevent opioid overdoses, enables first responders, at the time of the emergency, to provide naloxone and treatment and support resources, and make connections to these resources through the Doorway-NH, versus an after the fact follow-up visit. The initiative is expected to increase the number of naloxone kits and treatment and support resources delivered directly to NH residents that need these resources, increase the number of individuals referred to the Doorway-NH and local treatment and support services, and increase the number of first responders trained and licensed to carry and administer naloxone.

This grant continues two existing temporary full-time positions responsible for developing and delivering training; collecting and analyzing data; purchasing and distributing naloxone overdose kits; and monitoring and reporting. During year one, these positions established the framework for the program including grant guidance, application, and grant agreement documentation; met with several pilot programs and stakeholders; and hosted the first advisory committee made up of stakeholders such as the Governor's office, NH Association of Fire Chiefs, the Professional Firefighters of New Hampshire, NH Chiefs of Police, NH DHHS, a major private ambulance provider, the treatment community, and the recovery community.

The Department of Safety has signed agreements with six (6) communities, including one regional program covering 22 communities in the southeast part of the state and another three (3) in process, who have begun operating under the scope of the grant and are providing critical services to 22% of the residents of the state. To date, not only 226 first responders have been trained, but also 97 at-risk individuals, their families, and their support systems have been trained to recognize the signs of an opioid overdose and to provide lifesaving treatment, provided naloxone kits, and given resources and referred to treatment and social services. Grant funding has provided 268 naloxone kits to first responders who can use them to reverse an opioid overdose or give them to at-risk individuals and their family and support systems to prevent an opioid overdose or opioid overdose fatality. Each program has developed protocols and procedures to train personnel, collect required data on efficiency, and conduct follow-up services as well as implemented key internal controls to effectively manage individual programs.

The funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Funds in class 020, Current Expenses, will be used to purchase naloxone overdose kit carry bags with protective equipment, and naloxone trainers.

Funds in class 037, Technology-Hardware, will used to purchase two laptops for program staff.

Funds in class 040, Indirect Costs, are needed to pay indirect costs to Administrative Services on all eligible expenses.

Funds in class 041, Audit Fund Set Aside, are needed to pay audit fund set aside on all eligible expenses.

Funds in class 059, Temp Full Time, are needed to pay for two existing (2) full-time temporary positions titled, Program Specialist IV (LG 25) and Program Specialist II (LG 21).

Funds in class 060, Benefits, are needed to pay benefits costs associated with the part-time and full-time temporary staffing.

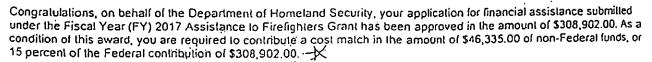
